WEDDING...ENTERTAINMENT FURNISHED FOR 2,000 PEOPLE...

Last Wednesday, December 26, 1894, Mr. and Mrs. Andrew Lutz, Sr., celebrated their golden wedding anniversary. It was undoubtedly the largest social gathering ever held in central Wisconsin and the pleasurable event will long dwell in the memories of the hundreds of friends who participated. For several weeks in advance preparations were being made and accordingly all details were successfully carried out by the committee in charge. Nearly 1000 invitations were issued and it is estimated that upwards of 1,500 took part in the festivities during the afternoon and evening.

At 2:30 o'clock a procession, consisting of the mayor and common council, Stumpf and Shaurette lodges, I.O.O.F. and the Eintrachts Verein, headed by the Central City band, left Odd Fellows hall and proceeded to the residence of Mr. and Mrs. Lutz on Water street. Here, the aged couple, their family and other relatives, were provided with carriages and escorted to the Church of the Intercession. When the procession arrived at the church it was filled to overflowing. Every seat was occupied and the aisles were partially filled with people standing. As Mr. and Mrs. Lutz entered the edifice, Mrs. G. S. Rood played a wedding march. They and their relatives occupied the front pews on either side of the building and the secret orders were seated directly back of them. In the meantime the Sunday school room and the Chapel had been thrown open, both of which were quickly filled. The services opened with a hymn by the choir, after which Rev. Weller followed with a portion of the Episcopal marriage service, "Those whom God hath joined together let no man put asunder". After Thanksgiving to God for the blessings bestowed on the aged couple and the reading of passages prayer was offered and then, after appropriate remarks by Rev. Weller, a song by the Eintrachts Verein and the benediction concluded the service.

Most of those present then repaired to the Central City Opera House (the old skating rink) where tables had been spread for a banquet. As the guests entered the hall, they were received by Madams Roettger, Port, Kohorn, Bender, and Geisler and Miss Addie Anschutz who presented each with a badge bearing the words "Golden Wedding of Mr. and Mrs. Andrew Lutz, Sr., Dec. 26, 1894.

The walls were nicely decorated with evergreens trimmed with golden tinsel and the whole made a pretty picture. The tables were artistically arranged and presented a handsome sight. In the center of the hall one had been reserved for the aged host and hostess and the members of the family. From this, long tables converged diagonally in different directions, thus giving the center table the appearance of a hub to an immense wheel. Shortly after 4 o'clock the guests were seated and a bevy of waiters served all in prompt and most acceptable manner. The menu consisted of meats, potatoes, beans, bread and butter, hot coffee, several kinds of cake, oranges, bananas, grapes, apples, etc. Wine and beer were also served. Plates were laid for 500 people but it is estimated that at least double that number partook of the feast.

Between the hours of 6 and 8 o'clock, while congratulations were being extended and a general good time enjoyed, the tables were cleared away and the floor prepared for dancing. The ball was opened with the golden wedding march, which was led by Mr. and Mrs. Lutz. In the first number on the program 360 dancers participated and including the spectators over 1,000 people were in attendance. Mr. and Mrs. Lutz were schoolmates. Both are natives of Eckartswerer, Germany. Mr. Lutz came to the United States in 1851 and settled in Racine. In 1855 they came to Almond in this county but since 1867 have been residents of Stevens Point.

(I gave considerable space to the Lutz golden wedding, because there is no doubt but what that was the greatest social event with the largest number of people taking part, that has occurred in more than 100 years of the history of Stevens Point.)

### AFTER MANY MONTHS.

Andrew Lutz, Sr., Passes Away at His Home After a Long and Patient Illness—Funeral Today.

Andrew Lutz, Sr., a pioneer brewer of this city, but who retired to private life nearly two years ago, passed away at his home, 1035 Water street, at 8:45 o'clock last Sunday evening. Mr. Lutz was taken sick last June, but was able to be around until October, since which time he had been confined to the house constantly. His physicians and friends gave up all hope of his recovery long since, he being a sufferer with dropsy and other complications, and fully two months ago his death was expected at any hour. Mr. Lutz rallied thereafter, however, and was considerable better for a time, but for the past three weeks had been unable to leave his bed. During this long illness his faithful wife, had been at his bedside almost constantly, and was assisted much of the time by her daughters, Mrs. Messing and Mrs. Ernst, of Princeton, and the wives of her sons, John, August and George, in this city.

Andrew Lutz was born at Eckartz Wier, in the province of Gasenherzogthum, Baden, Germany, Nov. 1st, 1822, nearly 77 years ago, and he and she who is now left a widow were playmates and schoolmates in that far distant fatherland. They were married in their native village Dec. 26th, 1844, the bride's name being Elizabeth Gaber, and she was but a few months his junior. The town of their birth remained their abiding place during the next few years, but in 1851 Mr. Lutz set sail for America, finding employment at railroading and farming in New York during the following year, when he was joined by Mrs. Lutz and their three children. They came west at once, and Mr. Lutz bought a small farm in Racine county, where they remained for about three years, coming to Almond, in this county, in 1855. That town was their home until 1867, when Mr. Lutz, having become tired of farming, came to Stevens Point, and in company with his brother, Jacob, bought the brewery plant on Water street, which they owned in company until 1880, when Andrew bought the interest of his brother, who removed to Grand Rapids. In July, 1897, Mr. Lutz sold the plant to Gustav Kuenzel, the present proprietor.

Twelve children were born to Mr. and Mrs. Lutz, seven of whom survive their father. These are: Andrew, of Meehan; Mrs. Elizabeth Messing and Mrs. Mary Ernst, of Princeton; John, August, George and Jacob, of this city. There are also four brothers, Michael, of Grand Rapids; John, of this city, and David and Jacob, of Grand Rapids, all of whom are in the city at present.

On the 26th of December, 1894, Mr. and Mrs. Lutz celebrated their golden wedding. In the afternoon they appeared before Rev. R. H. Weller, at the Episcopal church, and repeated the vows they had made fifty years before. They were accompanied by scores of relatives and friends, the church being packed to the doors, and thereafter a banquet was served at the rink, 1,000 invitations having been issued and nearly all responded. Many hearty and happy speeches of congratulation were made by guests present, to which Mr. Lutz responded in his own brief and interesting manner. Dozens of valuable presents were received, and nearly all have been preserved to this day.

Mr. Lutz was a careful business man, generous in his dealings, and his purse strings were ever open to assist in works of charity or those that were for the public good. Ever of a happy, kindly disposition, a firm friend, true citizen, good neighbor and kind husband and father, he was much respected in this city, where he had lived for over thirty years. He was one of the pioneer Odd Fellows of Stevens Point, becoming a member of Shaurette Lodge soon after locating here, and became a charter member of Stumpf Lodge at its organization. He was also a member of the Eintrachts Verein for a number of years, and took an active interest in its success.

The funeral took place at 2 o'clock this afternoon from the Friedens Evangelical church, Rev. F. G. Ludwig, the pastor, preaching in German, and Rev. A. S. Badger, of the Presbyterian church, in English. Relatives were present from Almond, Amherst, Grand Rapids and other places, Mrs. Frank Hibbing, of Duluth, and Mrs. Lawrence Kuenzel, of Neenah, cousins of the deceased, also being in attendance. Interment was in the Episcopal cemetery, and the services at the grave were in charge of Stumpf Lodge. The honorary pall bearers were Alexander Krembs, N. Jacobs, Aug. Jempke, J. O. Jonnsen, John Peickert and Geo. Zimmer. The active bearers were Louis Port, Chris. Geisler, M. E. Bruce, E. A. Williams, A. Koch and W. E. Berndt, brother Odd Fellows of the deceased.



## ANDREW LUTZ.

Pioneer and Well Known Business Man Gone.

The death of Andrew Lutz, sr., occurred at 8:45 o'clock Sunday evening at his home on Water street, which he erected two years ago after selling the brewery and his old home. His death came after a long illness with dropsy and other complications. He was first taken sick a year ago in June but was able to be about until October, since which time he has been confined to the house and his death has been expected almost daily. He was cared for by his aged wife, who will be seventy-seven years old on June 29. She was also assisted by her daughters, Mrs. Mesling and Mrs. Ernst of Princeton and by the deceased's brother Jacob of Grand Rapids. All have spent much of their time here for several months.

Mr. Lutz was born in Baden, Germany, in the village of Eckartsweiler, on November 1, 1822. He came to America in 1851, followed a year later by his wife and family. After landing in New York he came direct to Wisconsin, locating in Racine county, where he spent about a year. He then removed with his family to Almond this county, where he spent fourteen years on a farm. In 1867 he moved to this city and bought an interest in the brewery on Water street south, which he continued to own and operate until 1897, when he sold it to Gustav Kuenzel, the present proprietor. From 1867 to 1882 he was in partnership with his brother Jacob. In the latter year Jacob sold out and moved to Grand Rapids leaving Andrew sole proprietor until 1897.

Mr. Lutz married Miss Elizabeth Goepper in Baden on December 26, 1844. Twelve children were born to them of whom seven survive: Andrew, of Meehan Station, Mrs. Jacob Mesling of Princeton, John of this city, Mrs. John Ernst of Princeton and Gus, George and Jacob of this city. All are married but Jacob.

He also leaves four brothers. They are Michael of Grand Rapids, John of this city and David and Jacob of Grand Rapids. Two sisters are dead.

On December 26, 1894, Mr. and Mrs. Lutz celebrated their golden wedding. They went through the marriage ceremony with the same heartiness which had characterized the making of their first marriage vows fifty years before. Rev. R. H. Weller performed the memorial ceremony in the Episcopal church. After the ceremony the golden wedding feast was given at the Bink Opera house and nearly 500 guests sat down to a hearty evening dinner. Many congratulatory speeches were made and others not gifted with oratory expressed in private to the worthy couple their appreciation of their oft extended hospitality and many favors. The couple also received numbers of valuable presents that testified to the esteem in which they were held by a large circle of friends.

Mr. Lutz was a good hearted citizen of a strong German type. He was sympathetic and generous to a fault and hosts of friends were from time to time encouraged and assisted by his kindly words and open arms. He was a member of Sturpf lodge, I. O. O. F., and the funeral services will be in charge of that branch of the order.

The funeral will be held Wednesday afternoon at 2 p. m. from the Friedens Evangelical church Rev. F. G. Ludwig officiating.

Funeral of Andrew Lutz.

The funeral of Andrew Lutz was held from the Friedens church this afternoon at 2 o'clock. The services at the church were conducted by the pastor, Rev. F. G. Ludwig, assisted by Rev. A. S. Badger of the Presbyterian church. There was a very large attendance of the relatives and friends of the deceased. The Lutz families of Grand Rapids and other relatives from Princeton, Ripon and other towns were present in large numbers. The deceased was a member of the I. O. O. F. and both branches of the order turned out to the extent of over 50. They were in command of Paul Roettger. The services at the grave were conducted by the Old Fellows. The active pall bearers were also selected from their ranks. They were Chris. Galtier, H. L. Bruce, E. A. Williams, A. Cook, L. Port, and W. P. Barack. The honorary pall bearers were five in number. N. Jacoby, August Thoms, John Pollock, George Zimmerman and Aug. Dreyer.



## OVER FOUR SCORE YEARS

Mrs. Andrew Lutz, a Resident of Port-  
age County for Fifty-Five Years,  
Dies Sunday Morning.

While hoeing in her garden at 124 Frances street, Sixth ward, at about 10 o'clock last Thursday morning, Mrs. Andrew Lutz fell to the ground and was picked up in an unconscious condition by her son, Jacob, whom she had asked a few moments before to pull some radishes for dinner. He carried her into the house, where she was attended by the family physician, who at once recognized the fact that she had been stricken with apoplexy, and the patient passed away at 8:50 o'clock Sunday morning without having regained consciousness.

Born in Eckartsweiler, Baden, Germany, July 29, 1823, Elizabeth Geberin Lutz was nearly 87 years of age. She was married in her home city to Andrew Lutz, Dec. 26, 1844, and he came to America in 1851, she following the next year, and after residing in the east a few years they came to Wisconsin in 1855, locating on a farm in the town of Almond. In 1867 the family moved to this city, Mr. Lutz engaging in the brewery business, which he continued until about fourteen years ago, when the property was bought by Gustav Kuenzel, and later passed into the hands of the present owners, the Stevens Point Brewing Co. Mr. Lutz died eleven years ago.

On Dec. 26, 1894, Mr. and Mrs. Lutz celebrated the 50th anniversary of their marriage in an elaborate manner, nearly 1,000 invitations being issued, and after renewal of their marriage vows at the Episcopal church, a wedding dinner was served at Rink Opera House, and that spacious edifice was filled, guests being present from all parts of the county, as well as from outside, and including the city and county officials and members of different organizations to which the couple belonged. The banquet was followed by a grand ball, Mr. and Mrs. Lutz leading the grand march and taking a prominent part in the festivities throughout.

The deceased lady was the mother of thirteen children, including three pairs of twins. One child died on board ship coming to this country; five others passed away in infancy or childhood and one son, John, died in October, 1903. The six that survive are Andrew of Meehan, Mrs. Elizabeth Messing and Mrs. Mary Ernst of Princeton, August, George and Jacob of this city. Mrs. Lutz will be kindly remembered by the pioneers of this locality as a most hospitable lady, one who was ever disposed to do good. The long years that she was permitted to dwell here below were replete with many humane, charitable acts.

The funeral took place from the residence at 1 o'clock Tuesday afternoon, thence to the Friedens Gemeinde church, Rev. F. G. Ludwig of Merrill, a former pastor and intimate friend of the deceased, officiating. All the children were present, as were also their husbands or wives and other members of their respective families. The floral offerings were many and beautiful. The pallbearers were Jacob Mehne, John Hetzel, Fred Stieler, Geo. D. Oertel, Wm. Rosenkranz and Mike Lutz, and interment took place in Forest cemetery. Other relatives and friends present from outside were Mr. and Mrs. Jacob Messing, Mr. and Mrs. Franz Ernst, Mrs. Marlick, Mrs. C. R. Powers, Mrs. Mike Guesso and daughter Grace, of Princeton; Mr. and Mrs. Jacob Mehne, Mr. and Mrs. John Hetzel, Mrs. Geo. Lutz, Mrs. Miko Urban, David Rath, Andrew Hainig, Mrs. P. Kiltner, Almond; Mr. and Mrs. David Lutz, Mrs. Jacob Lutz, Mrs. Ed. ## CALLED TO THE GREAT BEYOND

She also leaves 15 grandchildren, 19 great-grandchildren, her brother George and Jacob Lutz of Stevens Point and her sister, Mrs. John Ernst of Oshkosh.

### DEATH WHILE HE SLEPT

John Lutz, Old Resident Of This City, Passes Away  
Suddenly & Unexpectedly Monday Morning

Death came to John Lutz, 130 Francis street, in a very sudden and unexpected manner at about four o'clock Monday morning, and was the result of heart trouble. Mr. Lutz had apparently always enjoyed good health and was never known to complain. He spent Sunday at home, was in the best of spirits throughout the day, and after supper sat down and smoked for some time before retiring. He arose at about four o'clock Monday morning and walked to a rear window and looked out to see if it was still raining. Mrs. Lutz, hearing him get up, asked what time it was, to which he made some reply and then returned to bed. A few minutes later his wife heard him breathing hard and tried to arouse him, but failing to do so, called her children and a doctor was summoned with all possible haste. He was a member of Loyal Tent, No. 70, Knights of the Maccabees, in which organization he carried insurance of \$1000.00.

After leaving school, Mr. Lutz was employed for many years in his fathers' brewery, retiring after the latter disposed of his interests and for several succeeding years held a position as section man with the Green Bay & Western R.R. being employed of late as flagman at the Clark street crossings of the G.B. & Wisconsin Central R.R. He was an honest, sincere man, one who had a large acquaintance, and the announcement of his sudden and unexpected death will be heard with regret by many friends.

The funeral will be held from the residence at two O'clock Thursday afternoon, followed by services, at the Friedens church at 2:30 o'clock, with interment in Forest Cemetary.

# BREWERY TRUCK IS DEMOLISHED BY SOO TRAIN

August Lutz Has Big Toe  
Crushed and Breast Bone  
Broken

The large toe on August Lutz's left foot was so badly crushed that amputation was necessary and his breast bone was fractured when the Ford truck he was driving was struck by Soo passenger No. 1 west of the Stockton station at 9 o'clock this morning.

Mr. Lutz left the city an hour before with the truck of the Stevens Point Brewing company loaded with cases of soda beverages for dealers at Custer, Rosholt and other towns. Just as he reached the railroad crossing near Stockton, Soo passenger No. 1, west bound, came along at high speed and crashed into the truck, knocking it into fragments and scattering boxes and bottles in all directions.

## Lutz Under Debris

Engineer Sam Bey brought his train to a stop in quick time and Conductor James McCann and several members of the crew ran back to the wreckage, expecting to find a dead driver. Mr. Lutz was found under a part of the debris, placed on board the train and brought to this city and to St. Michael's hospital.

Physicians were called and amputated the toe, also reducing the fracture in his chest. Besides these injuries he suffered abrasions on one side of his head and other portions of the body were cut and bruised. Mr. Lutz will be laid up for several weeks. He is a former alderman from the Sixth ward and a son of the late Andrew Lutz, a pioneer Stevens Point brewer.

## Failed to See Train

At the place where the accident happened is an open stretch of country for nearly a half mile in all directions. Mr. Lutz was unaware of a train's approach from the east until the whistle sounded. It was then too late to avoid the crash.
