Centennial Question of the Week: No house of worship had yet been constructed by the Roman Catholic Community in Plover after Sebastian G. Messmer gave his approval for a new church to be named St. Bronislawa on October 12, 1896. So, when in Plover, where did the Pastor Pro-tem of St. Bronislawa, Rev. Stephen Kasperski, lodge and say Mass until the Church building was constructed? Answer: At the Frank Lila Home. The Lila family had a home & dairy farm about a mile west of St. Bronislawa on Hwy 54. He was the first treasurer of St. Bronislawa Church and he, along with John Glesczynski, built the first church. The Lila family donated an altar which was consecrated on August 7, 1899 by Pastor, Rev. John Pociecha. Some of Mr. Frank Lila's descendants are still active members of St. Bronislawa Catholic Church.




































































The Story





There were a number of children attending St. Bronsislava school during the 1920-21 school year. The students that stayed at school were Sophia Ostrowski (age 12), John Ostrowski (15), Evelyn Repinski (Dulek) (15), Joe Repinski (12), Helen Mondre, Jeneve Mondre, Lauara Garski (12) John Adams, Johanna Adams, Nick Zinda, John Sniadajewski, John Wisniewski, Joe Wisniewski, Helen Prutz (12), and Bowles Sawdoski. The students that would walk to school were John Wozniak, Kathern Lepinski (Walkush), Selma Ekendorf, John Galecki, and two Tomaszewski girls.

The school was held in the church basement during the week days. The basement was divided into two rooms by a cardboard like material. One room was the kitchen. It contained the kitchen appliances and the furnace. It had a wooden floor. The other room was the bedroom. The boys roomed on the right side and the girls lived on the left. It had a cement floor with a rug.

There were four members of the St. Bronislava faculty. There was Sister Grace, who taught polish. Sister Vanislava, who taught in english. There was a lady who cooked and cleaned. The last member was Fr. Brorowski who was very nice and who resembled Fr. Francis Przybylski? When the students didn't do their homework the sisters would become angry with them. They would break rulers on the students. Grandma, Sophia, would become scared and she would run to the bedroom and pray so that she would not get hit.

The daily routine was fairly simple. They all ate breakfast in the morning and then went to mass before attending school. Sister Grace taught in polish in the morning ans Sister Vanislava taught in english in the afternoon. On the weekends the students got to go home.

The tuition for room and board at St. Bronislava was seven dollars a week. After the school year Fr. Brolowski, who had two parished in Plover and Plainfield, had to leave the parish. That school year was the only year that some of the students could stay and live in the church because it was against the law for the students to stay in the church.

Later in the 1920-21 school year, a chapel was built in the basement of the church. It was built on the right side where the boys would have slept. They built the chapel so that they didn't have to heat the whole church upstairs.

There were many different customs in the church back then. The church seats were numbered and everyone had an assigned seat. However; sometimes people would sit in someone else's seat and had to be asked to move. The only time communion was served was at the first mass. If someone wanted to attend confession, they were given a 1" x 2" card. Before entering the confessional, people would hand the card under the curtain to the priest. There was also a red virgil hanging fom the ceiling above the communion rails. It could be adjusted to various heights. All the masses were in polish.

There were many Lila family activities that happened at the church. Fr. Polachek was the first priest for Sophia and Stephen's wedding call in 1933. Later on that year, Frank and Mary Anna celebrated their 50th wedding anniversary on Sept. 12. Frank would die about five years later at the agoe of 77 while Marcy Anna died in 1937. Frank's son John was a mason and he was the mason who laid the brick for the present old church. The field stone for the church was brought in from across the river? It was transported during the winter across the ice by horse and sleigh. It was also the same stone used to build the Lila farmhouse.

FRANK LILA BUILT AN ALTER FOR THE CHURCH.

My experience in life has taught me that you have to let God take control of your life. I found that the harder I tried to control my life the worse it got. In the evening I would be totally exhausted from fighting this and fighting that. I'm thinking there has got to be a better and easier way. That's when I decided, what have I got to lose? Okay Lord, I heard so much about you, here is the steering wheel of my life, do your thing and good luck.

Now you know what, it's great. It's like I'm in the driver's seat, but the vehicle is in cruise. I'm just sitting back and enjoying the view. And its much more beautiful than ever before. I can actually enjoy the beauty of life. It's easier to understand things, why they are the way they are.

Sometimes I'm cruising right along in life and ahead of me I can see nothing but rough roads and disaster. I'm thinking no way am I going to make it through this without a serious accident or injury in the days ahead of me on this road of life of mine.

Okay Lord, I know you're good, but this is going to be interesting. I said a few extra prayers and wished him good luck. You know what? I never even felt a bump in the road. Somehow the good Lord smoothed everything over by the time I got there. Totally remarkable.

Surprisingly as much as I have faith in him and say things like that, I find I forget to ask him to handle the problems I face during the day or through the coarse of the week. So I feel a person has to constantly remind yourself that the Lord is here to help, so ask him. "Ask and ye shall receive."

I am writing this down because I feel this might help someone someday, maybe my children. I would have loved to read the thoughts and feelings of my parents and grandparents, or anybody for that matter. It might have saved me a lot of heartaches and pain.

Probably everyone should write down your feelings and thoughts so they can help someone cope with life a little easier, especially older people. Can you imagine the wealth of experience and knowledge that is trapped in the minds of

these people. Like Ben Franklin, the older he got the wiser he got and we were lucky to receive some of his knowledge with his writings.

I grew up on a farm that did not have inside plumbing, which was no big deal because most farms didn't at that time. But one day my family went to town to my aunt and uncle's house, which of course had indoor plumbing and a toilet. Low and behold I had to go number one, or go potty. I was maybe 6 years old? But because I was so accustomed to going potty in the outhouse I refused to go potty in the inside toilet. I was stubborn or bullheaded that I would not go potty in the inside toilet, so I went in back of the house. The point of this story is this: You have to be flexible in this world today. Things are changing so fast you have to be able to bend and go with the flow. Otherwise you're going to get ran over and left way behind. Yes, sometimes we have to change our ways. Can you imagine if I would still be going to the bathroom outside?

Try not to be narrow minded, open it up and get the bird's eye view. Let the Lord look at it from his point or view. Think of it at someone else's view point, get as many angles as you can. Everyone doesn't think and feel the same way as you.

What really got me thinking maybe I should write some of these thoughts down was when Linda volunteered us to be on a panel on Jeff's confirmation class. This was to answer questions about faith and religion in our adult lives. I felt this might be a good idea and hopefully we might have helped someone in that class. One of those questions was, what I thought faith was. I said that my parents were very religious and they tried to teach me to be religious. So I memorized a lot of different prayers and I tried to understand what they're trying to tell me. I still couldn't understand, but I believed in my parents so I continued to try. To me it was like these 3-D pictures or magic eye. You sit there with this picture of dots and spots all over it, but like there is no way there could possibly be a picture or any meaning there what so ever. But you have to believe, really believe. All of a sudden a picture or object in plain view will appear.

All you have to do is believe, concentrate, and focus and things will start to shape up in life for you, just as it does in the 3-D or magic eye picture. Concentration is very important. A laser is a concentration of light. A person generally knows what is right or wrong, or what is good for you or bad for you. If you want to stay slim and trim, you know you have to watch what you eat and do some sort of exercise. You know you shouldn't eat sweets or fatty foods. So you should take away all the temptations from your refrigerator or home because it's just harder to control your urges if they are so accessible. Same thing about any type of sin in your life- keep it at a far distance, because the devil knows and he will keep tempting you.

In "THE LORD'S PRAYER" He says "Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil." I feel this is very important.

Having a strong faith and saying prayers is the same thing as having a positive attitude. When you say a prayer and ask for something from the Lord, you are supposed to believe, really believe that whatever you asked for or prayed for, you as of that minute have already received that wish, if the good Lord feels that is the best for you. If it isn't, he will work out what's best for you. That's why it's important to pray.

That's why a person should constantly pray. Like I said that is what prayer is- a positive thought. So the more positive thoughts you have in your mind the less room for the negative ones. Which the devil keeps trying to put in there. Concentrate on the positive. An athlete has to have a wining attitude to win. Also in anything you do, the more desire and determination you have the better you're going to do. An average person with a burning desire will out do anyone with all the talent in the world with no desire. That is how much a good attitude or determination is. If a person could find a way to develop this determination and desire and keep it , you could do wonders in a life time. Especially for a young person there is no limit what you can do. The world is wide open for you. There is a saying "IF THERE'S A WILL, THERE'S A WAY" and that is true. If a person

could write down all the things you would like to accomplish in your life time, no matter how big or small they are, with determination and work you could probably accomplish the majority or all of them, even if they seem way out of reach.

When a person sets a goal or knows what you want in life, sometimes that's the hardest. A lot of people don't know what they want out of life. When you determine where you want to end up on your journey through life, you already have a good start. You have a desire, that's great. Now there will be a lot of detours and maybe postponements on your way there, but stay focused on your destination and you will get there. People will tell you, you can't do that because of this or that , but stay on track. You can do anything, if you want to. Chances are when you reach your goal you're going to want to go farther.

When I was in the service(boot camp) we had to go to the rifle range, which was about 27 miles away. To get there, we had to "Force March" there. Which meant walk as fast as you possibly can. We had our full backpacks on, which meant a lot. our helmets and our rifle (m-14). Our drill sergeant was in the lead. I learned in a hurry, you stay as close as possible to the drill sergeant in the lead. If you waited behind the slower fellow soldiers, you would fall so far behind it was very difficult or even impossible to catch up to the sergeant during this 27 mile march. They would have ambulances pick up some of the stragglers. I found it was much easier staying right on the sergeant's heels, it made the trip much easier, in fact enjoyable, I had a challenge. I find life is much like this march. Once you fall behind it's very difficult to catch up. It could be your homework, housework, your weight(overweight), or going in debt. If you get way over weight it's very hard to get thin again. Or go debt heavily it's very hard to crawl back out of debt. So I'm saying stay on top of things and don't let things get way out of control, stay right on his heels and things will go much easier. Stay as close as possible to the Lord. That is also very hard, there are so many distractions, it is so easy to be led a stray. It is so easy for me to say, but it's hard

for me to do.

Praying is much like ESP (Extra Sensor Perception). The more you concentrate (or pray) for an individual or something the more it helps. Sometimes much more than others. It seems like the brain waves or thoughts go out reach this person, idea, or thing. Something like a life line goes out. (invisible), but actually its the Lord's hand. It is said "What so ever he thinks in his heart, so he is." So think nothing but the best for yourself and others and chances are that's how it'll turn out. Think BIG and you'll have BIG results.

Having faith is like going to work or school in the morning. You almost have to. If you don't you're not getting paid or you're not learning anything. You enjoy the free time for a short period of time, but soon you get bored and easily get into trouble. You go around kind of aimlessly without a certain goal in mind. You're kind of going in a maze bumping and stumbling all over the place. You need a light at the end of the tunnel to guide you, and that is faith. God's rules are there to guide you through. Just like there are rules on the highway, speed limits, stop signs and etc. Whether you like them or not they are there to protect you. The same is true with God's rules they are there to protect you. The more you obey and understand them the better off you are, but sometimes they are very complicated. That's why knowledge and experience is very important. No one seems to have all the answers, that's why you have to have faith to carry you through. Life can be very tough sometimes.

I find I'm continually checking my ways and thoughts, if I'm doing things the way a Christian should. Am I being selfish and greedy or am I being aggressive and determined? Am I being protective, or am I being a jerk.

I know a guy in Mercer. He's a super fellow and always willing to help a person out. But you know what his wife said? "People take advantage of him." I feel there are a lot of wonderful people out there, but they are very easy to take advantage of. And that's too bad.

That's why a lot of these wonderful people turn and get very bitter. They are very easy going people and they let people start walking all over them. They can't say no. That's why you have to learn to say no before it is too late and ruin your life and attitude. Pretty soon these people are on the defense all the time and do not trust people at all. It gets worse and worse. People can be very mean, once they have you down and know something bothers you. They'll keep picking at you and picking at you.

There is a saying, "God helps those who help themselves", which can be very true. You have to be aggressive and outgoing sometimes. But don't get too pushy, use some finesse. You can't sit on your hands and think someone else well help you or do it for you. You'll be waiting a long time. Get to know what you want and "Just Do It." But remember do it the way a Christian would do it and you're going to go a long way.

If a person has a bad day and people seem to be exceptionally irritating, try to smile and laugh it off. Don't belittle yourself and snap at them. Chances are they are tired and something is bothering them, or your tired and something is bothering you. So cool it and think it out and sleep on it. Being tired is very hard on a person. It's hard to perform your daily tasks easily. Concentration is way down. And your attitude toward yourself, others and life are way down. So get plenty of sleep.
