

BAND CLINICIAN

Bernard O. Powers is in his ninth year as Director of Bands at Sun Prairie High School. Mr. Powers taught previously at Mineral Point, Platteville and Janesville, Wisconsin. He received his B.S. and M.S. degrees in music education from the University of Wisconsin-Platteville.

Mr. Powers is active as a guest conductor, clinician and adjudicator. He has conducted All-Star groups throughout the upper Midwest, directed summer camp clinic bands in Wisconsin and judged district and state contests and festivals for solo/ensemble, concert and marching band in Wisconsin and the surrounding states.

Under Mr. Powers' direction the Sun Prairie Wind Ensemble has performed twice at the Wisconsin State Music Convention, once at the WNBA Convention in Wisconsin Rapids and will be performing at the M.E.N.C. North Central Division Convention in St. Paul, Minnesota. In addition to convention performances, the Wind Ensemble has won 1st place awards at Six Flags Over Mid-America in St. Louis, Missouri; Knoxville World's Fair; National Cherry Festival in Traverse City, Michigan as well as numerous other competitions.

The Citation of Excellence was presented to Mr. Powers in 1986 by the National Band Association and he was given the Distinguished Bandmaster of America Award in 1981.





Refs blow it, game fumbled

ROSHOLT — How about a homecoming without a football game? Sounds a little awkward, doesn't it? It happened Friday night.

Friday night, the referees never showed up for a key Central State Conference showdown between Rosholt and Amherst. Both teams were 3-1, with a possible title at stake. To top it off, it was Rosholt's homecoming.

The officials planned to switch with another crew, but signals got crossed. So two crews showed up at the Almond-Tigerton game in Almond.

By the time two officials backtracked to Rosholt, the game had been called off. Hornet fans were really buzzing by this time.

Instead of blowing their whistles for the game, the officials might have used their tooters for directing traffic. It was one of the largest crowds ever for a Hornet football game, according to Rosholt Athletic Director Mike Neary. "It was kind of anti-climactic," said Neary. "The game hasn't been rescheduled, although a Tuesday make-up sounds probable."


