We went back out at 8:00 only to find that everything closes early or not opens at all like our favorite Las Mercedes

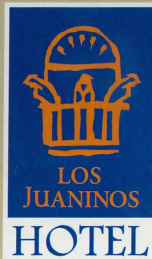
and some others we tried.

After a little discussion about what and where to eat Jim ended up eating a hotdog at one of the street stands. After one more last tour of the Zócalo we called it a night.




Monday August 9. cloudy.

We were very early, so checking in our luggage did not take long. We bought some newspapers and Jim exchanged our pesos (twice).



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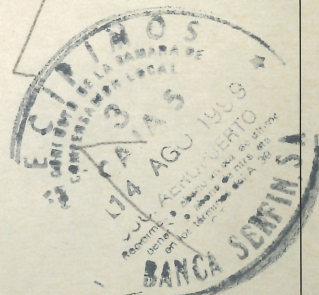
