Story and Purpose of the Harbor House

On April 30, 1950, The Harbor Light Center was established at 26 South Capital Avenue, Indianapolis.

The program was announced as three-fold:

- (1) Meeting the spiritual and physical needs of homeless, unattached men.
- (2) Proving a home for men in the low-income bracket.
- (3) Caring of transient men for overnight sleeping.

Thousands of men have been serviced by this Center in the past 17 years. The Harbor Light Center has justified its existence.



The HARBOR HOUSE is a non-profit residence for unattached working men and senior citizens. It is owned and operated by The Salvation Army.

Any person desiring to be a resident may make application. An interview with the Manager is required. Some additional features of the program include: Guidance, Counselling, Employment Service, and wholesome fellowship.

It is our hope that this facility will prove a real asset to the City of Indianapolis.
