Leopards Will See Spots

The Bulldogs are overdue! Having stalled in two previous contests, the Maroon Machine is now well-oiled and ready to roll. The fighting Bulldogs fell before the running and passing of one of the finest teams in the history of Caltech.

Not since the Pasadena institution imported the Stanford team during the war, have the Engineers fielded a team that had been able to beat the Redlands squad. But the combined running of Hal Woody, Jack Walker and the passing of Babe Karasawa proved too much for the defensive stalwarts of the Redlands team.

Tonight the Bulldogs have to tangle with a pack of clawing Leopards. The

La Verne team has mowed down all the opposition this year. The Leopards have torn Caltech and Pomona to pieces by the scores of 26 to 0 and 40 to 20.

The opposition is getting consistently harder for the U of R eleven, and as a result the boys are really "up" for this one.

The frosh sensation, Wayne Braga will be seeing plenty of action in this third home tilt. In the backfield with Braga will be Doug Gould, Chuck Luciano and Jack Price. Price, the Southern California JC player-of-the-year in 1950, made his first appearance for the Maroon and Gray last week. A fine passer, Jack is also an excellent runner and field general.

Up on the front line, the Bulldogs

will have Kent Hayden and Manny Jimenez at offensive ends to hold the baskets under the offerings of Price.

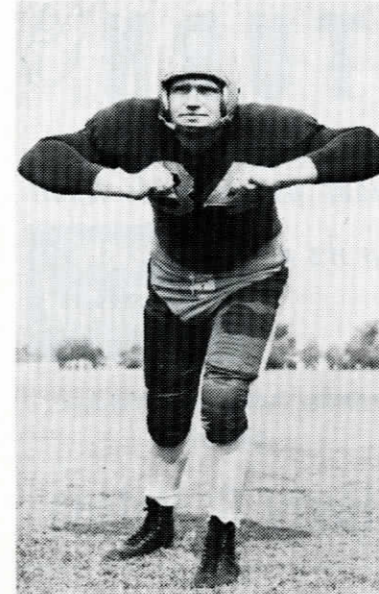

My prediction tonight—The Leopards will be seeing spots after tonight's game. Redlands 27, La Verne 20.

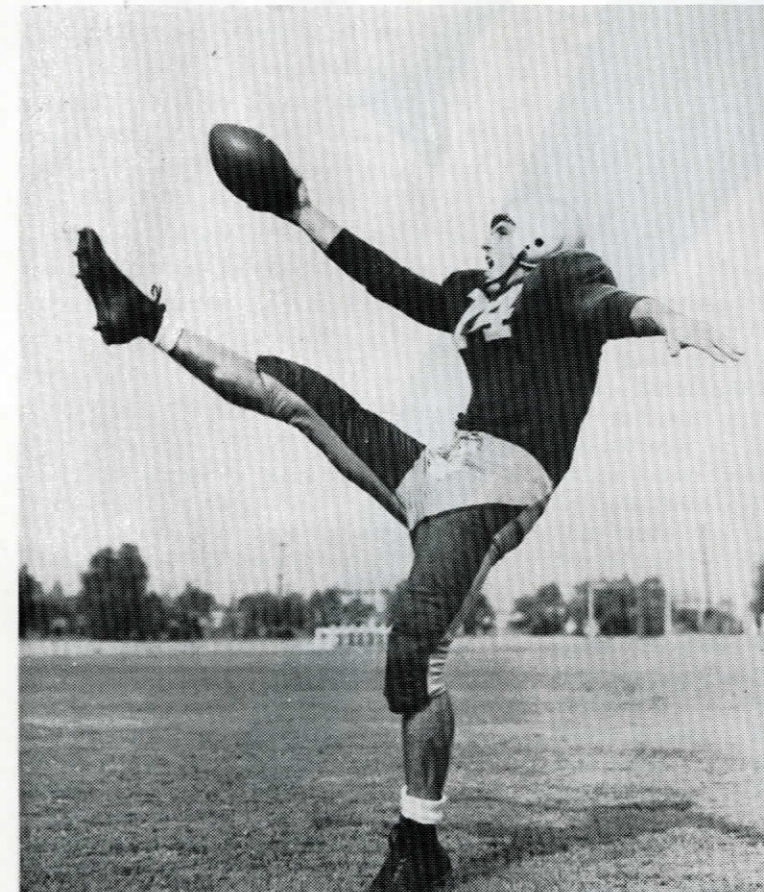

LEOPARDS CAN'T BE TAMED

La Verne Leopards will be out of their cages tonight, and growling for the Bulldogs' hides.

Coach Roland Ortmayer, former Northwestern University star, has his charges ready to go for this evening's contest. Eager to maintain their winning streak, the La Verne team plans to make it three in a row over SCIAAC opponents.

Already the passing and running attack of the La Verne team has proved too much for Caltech and Pomona. Redlands is the next obstacle for the snarling Leopards.

With an enrollment of only 300 students, the La Verne squad has completely fooled the sports writers of the area with their fine showings to date.

Running from a wing T, the Leopards will be calling upon their two backfield aces, Daryl Brandt and Don Hodson. Brandt is only a 150 pounder, but can throw his weight around with more devastation than many of the bigger boys. Though he is slated for halfback duties, he may double at quarter.

Hodson, a sixty-minute man, is the mainstay of the Leopards' running attack. Don hits the line with 190 pounds of MAN, and is good for yardage any time.

Up front, the La Verne squad will call upon Dick Hepner, Herm Belcher and Myrl Rupel to carry the brunt of the offensive chores.

On defense, Ortmayer will use Spike Steinberger, Mel Baughman, a fine pass interceptor, and Bob O'Neil, charging defensive end.

The Leopards are not planning on having an easy time with the Bulldogs. Long overdue, the Redlands squad is probably more than ready to show the Leopards an offensive powerhouse.

But despite the eagerness of the Redlands team, the Leopards will not be tamed. The La Verne team will turn a growling Bulldog eleven into a pack of whining pups.

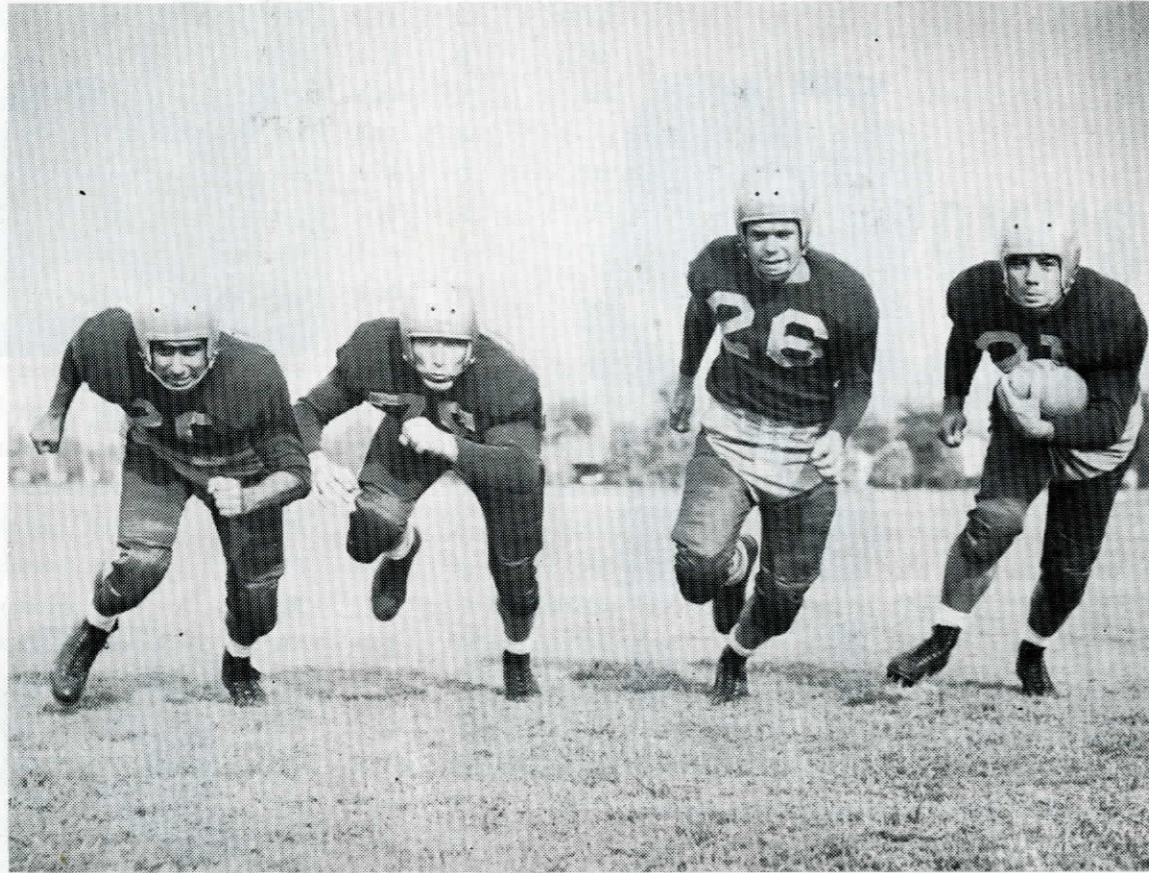
