1. Lieutenant Joseph Cross on U.S. Ship Constitution when it conquered British Guerrière in War of 1812. He was presented a sword by the State of Maryland. Cousin Lizzie Cross, his daughter, who took "Tea" at home of Louis T. Clark when he was a child, gave sword back to State before her death. It is now at State House, Annapolis, Md.
2. Colonel Truman Cross, acting Quartermaster Gen. on Staff of Gen. Zachary Taylor in Mexican War, was killed there, and is buried in Congressional Cemetery Washington, D.C.
3. General Osborne Cross, served in Mexican War, and was grandfather of Edith Clemson, now in Washington, D.C. He and Truman were West Pointers.
4. Howerta Cross, served in Army or Navy.

So the Governor was related by blood distantly, but as a family connection.
