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INTRODUCTION

The Hinkebein family story begins with Meinard George Hinkebein, our ancestor who crossed the Ocean to begin a new life in America. It goes forward, wherever possible to the present generation.

The information provided in this book is an accumulation of information received from various descendants of Meinard and numerous documents that have been found including baptismal records from St. John's Catholic Church in Leopold, Missouri, birth and death certificates, marriage records and land records. Unfortunately, many records of our family have been destroyed by fires caused by the Civil War.

Putting a book of descendency together is unfortunately never up to date. It can never be completed. Changes are being made each day. Relatives are born and relatives die. This book has some branches up to date - some up to date thru the last family reunion - and some unfortunately not very up to date.

It is our hope that each family will, from now on, keep their particular branch updated.

There are four separate parts of the book. The first and largest provides short stories of many of the ancestors and provides names and birth dates of the children of each. The second section consists of letters or portion of letters written about various family members or happenings. These letters were written by other members of the family. The third section gives a brief story on the founding of Leopold and the civil war and its aftermath. The fourth and final portion of the book provides some pictures of family members.

In the family note section, most of the letters are from members of the John Herman Hinkebein (son of Theodore) family. This book's authors are from this family. We urge other families to compile their remembrances and record them in this book for future generations to enjoy.

We hope everyone who reads this book will find as much interest in our family as we have. We apologize for any

errors that may have been recorded, but in any undertaking this large, there are bound to be some mistakes.

MEINARD GEORGE HINKEBEIN

THE STORY BEGINS

Meinard George Hinkebein, the Hinkebein immigrant, was born 02 Jan 1815 in Germany. Census records and information obtained from descendents show his birthplace as the Hanover area of Germany. However, Hanover is a principality as well as a city and it is most probable that he was born in a small town in the principality of Hanover. Many immigrants to the United States, on census records, would respond to inquiries of their birthplace with generalities and so avoid frustration caused by trying to explain obscure villages. Vincent Hinkebein, great-grandson of Meinard believed that he was born in the town of Hamburg, in the Bremen area.

The Hanover area of Germany is near the Holland border, and the original settlers of Leopold, came from the area of Germany/Holland border. It is the probable area of Meinard's birth even though to date, no records of the Hinkebeins have been found in Hanover. This area and the records of such are huge. So - the search goes on!

Matt Hinkebein, grandson of Meinard, stated that to earn a living while still in Germany, Meinard burnt limestone.

The early 1800's were years of upheaval in the European countries and many families chose to cross the Atlantic to America in search of a better way of life. Whole families left their homeland to head for a land where they could not only advance themselves economically, but where they could also own land, change their occupations if they desired and have a voice in determining their government. Meinard George Hinkebein was one of those determined immigrants.

Conversations with Matt Hinkebein state that Meinard married in Germany, and with his new wife came to the United States on their honeymoon.

However, Vincent Hinkebein states that he came to the United States with his brother.

Actual documentation is extremely difficult since we have been unable to actually locate any German Records. However, restored Hamilton County marriage records 1808-1849 and restored Hamilton County marriage records, 1850-1859 show the following:

Meinrad Hinkebein married Maria Behrens on 10 July 1849 at St. Philomena's Church, Cincinnati, Ohio.

Johan Hinkebein married Catherine Schweitzer on 24 April 1858. (perhaps the brother)

The federal census of 1850, Cincinnati Ohio, shows "Minra" Hinkebein, aged 35 and his wife Ann M, age 31, living there. It also states that they were married within the year and lists his occupation as a laborer.

The marriage record indicates that either Meinard was not married in Germany or he was married in Germany and this wife died prior to 1849. It also shows that Meinard immigrated prior to July, 1849.

Cincinnati in the 1850's was a crossroads for many of the European immigrants. Many would settle permanently there, some would migrate south and many went west in search of the California gold fields. These immigrants tended to move in groups. The 1850/51 Cincinnati city directory shows a George Hinkebein who is listed as a laborer, and living on the south side of 8th Street and east of Lock Street. Most of the neighbors there were also German or Dutch descent. George and his wife probably attended one of the plentiful Catholic churches that were near his home.

Many of the original Leopold settlers attended St. Willibord, but since all records of this church have been destroyed, it is impossible to determine if Meinard was a member of this congregation. However, in 1856, when Father John van Luytelaar moved with twelve families to the new farm lands in Missouri, Meinard was not among them.

Meinard George Hinkebein and Maria Behrens had two children born in Cincinnati

It is probable that there were more children born to Meinard and Maria. Five years between children was not a common occurrence. Family tradition says there was an E. Herman Hinkebein. Perhaps he was born and died between the births of Theodore and Philomena. According to Matt Hinkebein, Meinard's first wife died when Philomena was six months old. This would make her date of death in late 1855.

The Hamilton County Ohio Church burial records 1850-59 (recently found) show Maria Hinkebein died and was buried from St. Philomena Church, 24 April 1855. This information shows that the church Meinard attended was St. Philomena's since both the marriage and burial of Maria was held at this church. However, it does question the birth date of Philomena. Either she was born ca Nov 1854, or she was not six months old when her mother died.

Meinard married Mary Catherine Wesseling shortly thereafter stating that he could not wait to remarry because he had two babies who needed a mother. St. John's Catholic Church book of baptisms confirms that Mary Catherine's name was Wesseling. (In the first book of Baptismal records is noted the maiden names of nearly each of those wives of Leopold Homesteaders. The maiden name of Mary Catherine is shown in the record. At the time of the baptismal entry, a double S was generally written as a single "s" followed by the German hard "S", therefore it is assumed the spelling to be Wesseling.")

It is believed that Mary Catherine knew persons in the Leopold community and wanted to move there. So sometime between 1855 and 1858, they settled in Leopold. It is possible that between the move to Missouri from Ohio, they lived for a short time in Kentucky.

After moving to Leopold, he purchased a farm from Mr. Kohler for \$130.00. He made his living as a farmer and was also a blacksmith.

The 1860 Federal census of Missouri listed George Hinkerbine living in Liberty Township, Bollinger County, Missouri. His worth is shown as \$300.00 real estate and \$400.00 personal property. Land records have not been found that would show more information, and unfortunately, they may never be found as the county courthouse in Marble

Hill was burnt during the Civil War and most records were lost. Neighbors of the Hinkebein family include the Jacob Holweg family and the Frederick Elfrink family.

During the Civil War, it is not believed that Meinard served in a military capacity. However, family tradition states that he did blacksmithing for both the Union and Confederate armies. It is very possible that he had little choice in the matter and did what was demanded for the safety of his family and home. In this area during the war, there were several skirmishes fought, but the greatest threat to the citizens came from "Bushwhackers". These were bands of guerilla armies, neither Union nor Confederate that harassed the town's people, stealing food and livestock, burning homes and often killing innocent victims. It is said that one such deed took place very near the Hinkebein farm, only 40 yards from the house, shortly after the war had ended. Bushwhackers robbed and killed a Mr. Kohler there. This Mr. Kohler is said to have been the one that sold the farm to Meinard for \$130.

Four children were born to Meinard Hinkebein and Mary Catherine Wesseling - HINKEBEIN:

Meinard's family is not found in the Missouri 1870 census. It is possible that Meinard fled the area along with others during the war and had not yet returned. However, going by other data, it is even more likely that census takers either did not list the family or an error was made.

In 1880, Meinard, Mary Catherine, sons Theodore and John are listed on the census. Both daughters had married and moved from the home. It also lists a Dutch girl, Dena Johnson, living in the household and she is shown as a servant. It is doubtful that the family was of such means to hire servants and much more probable that they had given the girl a home (possibly she was an orphan) in exchange for household help. Neighbors of the Hinkebein farm include the Francis Meyers family, the Antonio Rickoff family, the Martin Vandeven family and the Reverend Francis Bettels, pastor of the church.

According to county land records, Meinard bought and sold several parcels of land during the periods 1881-1885. Some of the names mentioned on the deeds were: Johann and Hermana Spooler, John and Mary Ann Wilkens, and August Nenninger. An interesting note is that on these deeds, Meinard signed his name as "Gert" Hinkebein.

Meinard was said to have been a very religious man and active in the community which centered around the church. Several receipts found show that he could always be counted on to donate what he could for the church building and community affairs. The family always gave either a steer or hogs for the annual summer picnic, a tradition later followed by his sons.

Though self educated, Meinard could speak both German and English. Census records show he could both read and write. German was the language spoken in the home. His wife Mary, according to census data, could not write, though whether that means she was illiterate or just couldn't write English is not known.

Meinard died on 25 September 1896 at the age of 81. He is buried in St. John's Cemetery in Leopold, Missouri.

His headstone reads:

HEIR RUTH IN GOTT

This translates to "Here rest in God"

Two years later, on August 25, 1898, his wife Mary Catherine followed him in death. She too is buried in St. John's cemetery.

Born in Cincinnati, Ohio on 27 Sep 1850, Theodore Richard Hinkebein was the first child of Meinard Hinkebein and his wife Maria. His mother passed away when he was approximately five years old.

His father soon remarried. With his parents and sister, Philomena, they moved to Vinemount (Leopold), Missouri to

join in a community of Dutch and German settlers where friends of his stepmother lived.

Theodore had little formal education, possibly as little as 8 months. He spent his young years working on the family farm and learning the blacksmith trade of his father, Meinard. Despite having little actual schooling, Theodore was able to speak both High and Low dialect German in addition to English and some Dutch.

As a youngster, Theodore was called Rich by his parents and siblings and in the 1800 federal census, he is listed as Richard, age 20. It is not known for whom he was named but often times during that period especially in German families, the sons were named after their grandparents. Possibly Theodore was the name of Meinard's father and Richard was the maternal grandfather. However, this is unproven speculation.

In the 1880 federal census, Theodore (age 29) and his brother John (age 21) are shown living at home with their parents and working on the family farm. Theodore had grown to be a strong lean man, standing about 5'10" and weighing around 160 pounds. He wore a black handlebar mustache and had dark hair. The family was active in the small community and Theodore became acquainted with a neighboring family, the Schreckenbergs, through their affiliation with the church. On 22 November 1881, Theodore was married to Catherine Schreckenberg in St. John's Church in Vinemount by the Reverend Francis Bettels. The marriage record is recorded in the county records located in Marble Hill, Missouri in Book 3, page 19.

Catherine, daughter of George Schreckenberg and Barbara Kirchner, was born June 1860 in Gold Hill, California.

The newlyweds lived on the Hinkebein farm for a short time. In July of 1882, Theodore bought 80 acres from his father for \$150.00. This land was adjoining his father's farm. Theodore and Catherine built their home of hand hewn logs and over the next few years made many improvements, adding a smoke house and blacksmith shop. They began farming their land in addition to raising some stock for butchering and also sheep. Catherine is said to have been a very good seamstress and also made clothing and blankets from the sheep's wool.

Theodore and Catherine lived in Leopold their entire lives and there, in 1882, started a family.

A little over a year after the birth of Joseph, at the age of 36, Catherine was stricken with typhoid fever. On 10 Oct 1896, she died leaving Theodore to raise six children ranging in age from 18 months to 13 years.

An article in the Bollinger county times - October 23, 1896 reads:

"We are pained to report the death of an estimable lady, Mrs. Hinkebine, the wife of Theodore Hinkebine died the 9th instant. She had been a long and patient sufferer, but had not been seriously ill but a short time. Mrs. Hinkebine was a devoted wife, a kind and loving mother and a true Christian. She leaves a husband, six children, many relatives and friends to mourn her death."

She is buried in St. John's cemetery.

Safely Home
I am home in Heaven, dear ones;
Oh, so happy and so bright!
There is perfect joy and beauty

Theodore's help came from the Schreckenberg family, in the person of Catherine's younger sister Anne. She came to help with the children, and it is believed that she took the younger children; Anna, Barbara, and baby Joe to live

at the Schreckenberg farm. The older boys; MG, John Herman, and Ted stayed with Theodore to help on the farm.

On 29 May 1900, in Leopold, Theodore married his sister-in-law Anne. Anne was born 22 June 1864.

Theodore continued to work the farm and he and Anne added three children to the family unit.

In the 1910 federal census, Theodore and Annie are listed in Lorene township, Bollinger County, Missouri with eight children. The eldest daughter had already married and was out of the household. Theodore was nearing 60 years of age and had suffered several injuries over the years causing him to be crippled. He still worked the farm as best he could, though he walked with the aid of a cane.

The year 1929, proved disastrous for the Hinkebein family. Theodore suffered a stroke on 2 Aug 1929. On 17 August 1929, Anne, who had been plagued with ulcerated varicose veins for many years, died. And on the 21 Aug 1929, their eldest son, Meinard George (MG), died suddenly at the age of 46.

Theodore, who was now bedfast from his earlier stroke, lived only two months after Anne died. He died 08 October 1929.

The tombstones at St. John's cemetery where both Theodore and Anne are buried are inscribed as follows:

Theodore:

Meinard George Hinkebein was born 07 November 1882 in Leopold, Bollinger County, Missouri, the first son of Theodore Hinkebein and Catherine Schreckenberg. He was baptized on 08 Nov 1882 at St. John's church "Meinardum Georgium". His baptismal sponsors were Meinard Hinkebein and Barbara Schreckenberg. Throughout his life, Meinard George was know simply as MG.

He was born on the family farm in Vinemount (Leopold), Missouri. M.G. attended school in Vinemount and helped on the family farm throughout his boyhood. When he was about 13 years old, his mother, Catherine, died suddenly of typhoid fever. MG and brothers, John Herman and Ted, stayed on the farm to help their father while the younger siblings stayed with their mother's sister, Anne Schreckenberg. Several years later Anne and Theodore would marry.

He was raised in the Catholic faith and attended St. John's Church in Leopold., Mo. Magdalene Hinkebein Stoverink daughter of MG, has the original copy of MG's First Communion certificate issued in 1895.

In the 1900 federal census, MG is found living in Lorance township, Bollinger county, Missouri, with his father Theodore, stepmother Anne and seven of his brothers and sisters. He is shown to be employed as a track worker on the railroad.

On 29 Nov 1911, Meinard George married a young widow that lived nearby. Bernadine Steinar Clippard was born 10 Jan 1883. Bernadine, or Dina, as she was called, had one child, Elmer, who was about 7 years old, from her first marriage. (daughter, Magdalene, has a copy of the marriage certificate).

MG worked as a farmer and on the railroad. He was active in St. John's church and also a member of the Leopold Brass Band playing the cornet.

Meinard's children were all born in Leopold, Missouri. When Hilary was only four years old, Meinard George died. He had a terrible arm infection causing his arm to be amputated. Three hours after the amputation, he died at the age of forty six. Wife Dina, again widowed, raised her large family alone.

MG is buried in St. John's Cemetery. His headstone reads:

*FAREWELL MY WIFE
AND CHILDREN ALL
FROM YOU A FATHER
CHRIST DOTH CALL*

Dina died 15 May, 1959. She is buried in St. John's Cemetery. Her stone is simply inscribed "Mother" and she is buried next to her son Edward.

JOHN HERMAN HINKEBEIN



John Herman Hinkebein was the second child of Theodore Hinkebein and Catherine Schreckenberg and was born on 05 Sep 1884 on the family farm in Vinemount (Leopold), Missouri. John's birth record is recorded in the original birth record book located at the county courthouse in Marble Hill. The medical attendant submitting the record was M. A. Nenninger of Laflin, Missouri. (This record shows the date of his birth as September 7, which is incorrect.)

He was baptized at St. John's Catholic church in Leopold "Joannem Hermanum" on 07 Sep 1884. His baptismal sponsors were John Schreckenberg and Mary Catherine Hinkebein (n.Buetel).

John's childhood and teens were spent in Leopold. As a youngster, he helped on the farm with his father and attended school in Leopold. His teacher was Mr. Lukes.

When John was 12 years old, his mother, Catherine, contracted typhoid fever and died on 10 October, 1896. It is believed that John, his older brother MG, and younger brother, Ted, remained on the family farm with their father, while the three younger children stayed with their Aunt Annie Schreckenberg.

John grew to be a nice looking man. He was about 6 foot tall and weighed about 170 pounds, with brown hair and gray eyes. His brother Matt states that he was quite the "man about town".

John worked on the farm until he was about 20 years old. He then worked in St. Louis, Missouri at the Pevely Dairy. He returned to Leopold where he met and courted Bernadina Stoverink.

Bernadine (Dina) was the daughter of Anton Stoverink and Antoinetta Engelhulst. They had immigrated to the United States in 1881. Dina, born 04 July 1888, in Leopold, was four years younger than John. She was a tall girl, about 5'8" with a slender build and dark brown hair and eyes.

They were married 10 May 1911 by Reverend Peter Kurtenbach at St. John's Catholic Church in Leopold. The original marriage certificate is in the possession of daughter, Edna Vega.

The following is the announcement that was published in the "Banner Press" May 18, 1911.

"Hinkebein-Stoverink. Wednesday morning, May 10 at St. John's Catholic Church, Leopold, Rev. P. Kurtenbach officiating, John Hinkebein, Jr. and Miss Dina, the youngest daughter of Anton Stoverink, were married. Miss Barbara Hinkebein was bridesmaid and Herman Stoverink of St. Louis was best man. After the ceremony the bride and groom repaired to the home of the latter's parents, Mr. and Mrs. Theodore Hinkebein, where a large number of relatives and friends had been invited to spend the day, and it was one of unalloyed pleasure that will not soon be forgotten. Refreshments and dinner were served to almost 250 guests. It was enjoyed by all that were present, and afterward the young people enjoyed an all-day dance. The Leopold Brass band played several specially selected pieces during the day. The guests from St. Louis were - Mr. and Mrs. Pete Sondag and family, Mr. and Mrs. John Stoverink and family, Herman Stoverink, Misses Hannah and Dina Vandeven and George Hinkebein, the brother of the groom"

Shortly after their marriage, John Herman and Bernadine moved to nearby Laflin, approximately 5 miles to the east of Leopold. They rented an old, one room log cabin with acreage and John began farming. The house was located near Crooked Creek and often, when time permitted, John would fish.

It was in Laflin that they started a family. Their first son, Laurence, was born in Laflin. A year or so later, they moved to Allenville, where they rented a farm from Father Clement Moenig. Here, in addition to farming, John became involved in the cattle business, buying young calves and selling them for a profit when they had grown. His partner in this venture was the landlord of their farm, Father Moenig, Pastor of the church in New Hamburg, Missouri.

While living in Allenville, three more children were born; Vincent, Edna, and Marie Antoinette. The family attended St. Edwards Catholic church in Dutch town, where the

children were baptized. John's brother, Ted, also lived with them here for a while.

From Allenville, John moved his family to Benton, Mo., where he again rented a farm from Father Moenig. John was never to own his own home or land though he always provided for his family the best he was able. Father Moenig was the pastor at New Hamburg and had become a good friend of the family. The farm was a large one and provided the family with their own food and the extra was shipped by train to St. Louis. Shipping costs ran high, however, so there was not a lot of profit.

Another son, Paul, and a daughter, Clementine, were born while the family lived in Benton. It was about this time that daughter, Edna, aged 7, stepped on a rusted nail and developed tetanus. In those days, there was little treatment for the dreaded infection and the family lived in fear of her death. It would be many years before Edna recovered.

Around 1922, John decided to give up farming and moved the family to Chaffee, Missouri where he had been offered a job as blacksmith's helper on the Frisco Railroad. He was later upgraded to full blacksmith, earning 81 cents an hour. With this job, John no longer farmed though the family always put out a garden to supplement their own needs. John lived in Chaffee for the next fifteen years and the family grew with the birth of five more children; Teresa, James, Henry, John, and Patricia.

In Chaffee, the children attended the catholic grade school and public high school walking most of the time. The family did own a car, a Dodge touring car, though it was seldom used except for visiting the family in Leopold or shopping trips.

By 1930, unemployment levels had risen and John was no longer able to work full time for the railroad. He did any kind of work that he could find just to keep the family fed and clothed. The older children contributed by finding what work they could in factories and such.

These were hard years for everyone, but John never lost his faith and persevered through the Depression years. Though they had little money, the family was a happy one secure in their love for each other.

Finally, in 1937, John was offered a chance for full time employment with the Frisco Railroad, if he would be willing to transfer to Kansas City, Missouri. So the family moved to a new city.

Life in Kansas City was very different from that they had known in southeast Missouri, but the family adapted well. John rented a house on Madison Avenue and later at 2728 Summit where the family would live for many years.

They attended Sacred Heart Catholic Church and the children completed their schooling. The family, like they had been in their previous homes, was very active in the church.

John, who loved to sing and had a beautiful voice, sang in the church choir. Dina was active in the Altar Society and served as its vice president. The Hinkebein home was a place for the young people to gather and dine on the good home cooking of Dina. She specialized in chicken and Dumplings, Cabbage and Potatoes, and Fried Chicken. She baked 5 loaves of bread every other day for her family.

On 15 Jul 1946, at the young age of 58, Bernadine suffered a fatal stroke. She is buried in St. Mary's Cemetery in Kansas City, Missouri.

Most of the family had married and were raising families of their own by this time, though the youngest were still living at home. John lived at the home until 1951. He then moved into an apartment with two of the younger children, Eugene and Patricia.

In June 1954, John was attacked by a group of hoodlums at 17th and Summit as he returned home from work. His hip was severely broken and he received numerous other injuries that left him partially crippled. He was sent to St. Louis, to the Frisco Hospital, where he spent several long months recuperating from his injuries.

After being released from the hospital, John went to live with his daughter, Teresa, her husband Richard Harris and their family on Lowell Street in Kansas City, Kansas. Teresa had several small children and was expecting another.

He then moved in with daughter Patricia and Larry Nesbit on Jefferson Steet in Kansas City, Missouri.

After a time, he moved again. This time he went to stay with daughter, Edna and her family on Oakley Street in Kansas City, Missouri. He lived there for the next three years.

John's injuries had left him very crippled. He then developed Parkinson's disease. When the family was no longer able to care for him at the home, he entered the Woodlawn Nursing home in Northeast Kansas City. He stayed there for about three years.

John passed away 16 May 1966, at the age of 82. At the time of his death, he had 49 grandchildren. John is buried at St. Mary's Cemetery in Kansas city, Missouri, next to his wife Dina.

Aba LAURENCE ANTHONY HINKEBEIN (Meinard - Theodore - John -
Laurence)



Laurence was born 27 Feb 1912 in Laflin, Missouri, the first child of John Herman Hinkebein and Bernadine Stoverink. Moving with his parents, he lived on farms near Laflin, Allenville and Benton, before finally settling in Chaffee.

Like most children of that era, Laurence found his entertainment without spending much money. As a child, his favorite leisure past time was playing marbles.

At the age of 10, he was driving his mother to church in a Model T Ford and as a young man of 13, saved the family home. A roaring fire in the heating stove early one morning put burning embers onto the roof. It caught fire. Laurence got on the roof and tore off the burning shingles and threw them to the ground.

During his young years, he helped his dad on the farm. He would drive the horse driven cultivator.

When he moved to Chaffee with his family, he came face to face with the town bully, but he asserted himself with fists and expertise at marbles.

He attended St. Ambrose grade school and St. Ambrose High School. Both were in the same building. The grade school was on the first floor and the high school on the second floor. The convent was also housed in the same building.

For grade school tuition, he and his brother Vincent would fire the furnace and help sweep the school. They would have to arrive at 5 a.m. for the furnace and stay after school for cleanup. All the children attending St. Ambrose (Laurence, Vincent, Edna, Clementine, Marie Antoinette) would help with the cleanup. This paid for the \$30.00 per month tuition charged for the 5 children. Laurence's tuition was \$22.00 per month.

During his high school years, Laurence became quite an accomplished tennis player.

During the depression, he and a friend, Paul Phefferkorn, ran a filling station. He did this for about a year. In 1932, he joined the CCC's (Civilian Conservation Corps) to help support the family. He earned \$30.00 a month. He kept \$5.00 and sent \$25.00 home. As time went by, he helped manage a theater and his salary rose to \$45.00.

While in the CCCs, stationed in Calico Rock, Arkansas, he met his future wife, Martha Louise Lawson. She was born 07 Nov 1912 in Mansfield, Mo. At the time she met Laurence, she was working in a restaurant.

On 23 Oct 1938, they were married in Kansas City, Missouri at Sacred Heart Catholic church.

After the CCCs, Laurence worked in Panama City, Panama for the Federal Government for about six months. Upon his return to Kansas City, he worked for Van Keppel. This is the company he retired from, though Laurence never really retired. He had several part time jobs. He also owned many typewriters and sewing machines that he worked on in his spare time.

He lived most of his adult life in Kansas City and Raytown, Missouri.

Laurence was a tall, good looking man with an unbelievable memory. He could tell dates and times of incidents that happened 60 years prior. He seemed to remember everything he had ever learned at school. While attending celebrations given for graduating nieces and nephews, he would quiz the graduate on various subjects including algebra and history. He always knew the answers if they would quiz back.

He was a thrifty man, but good hearted. He financially helped several relatives in need during the year.

He, like most of the John Hinkebein family, enjoyed playing cards, pinochle being his favorite. He enjoyed family and often would be the first to arrive at family functions. Laurence would seldom miss visiting a sick relative in the hospital or attending a wake or funeral.

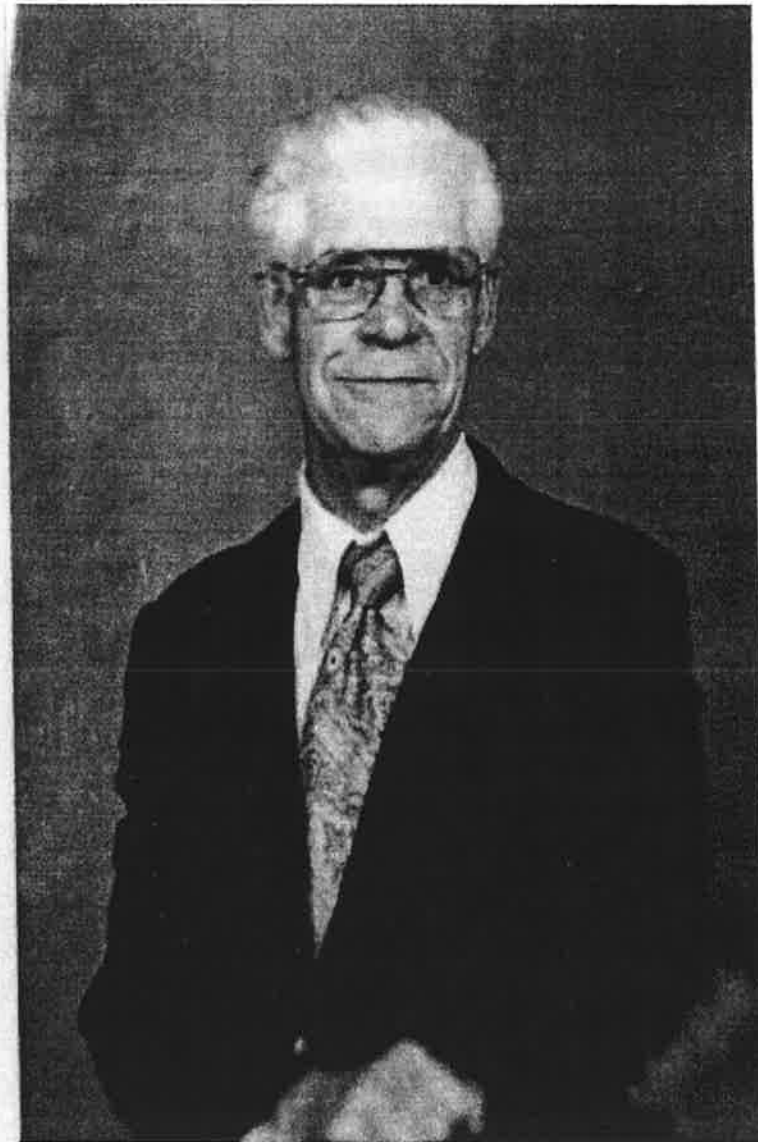
He was extremely intelligent and used this intelligence and hard work to achieve financial success.

Abb VINCENT THEODORE HINKEBEIN (Meinard - Theodore - John - Vincent)



Vincent was born 08 Jan 1914 in Allenville, Missouri. He was raised in Chaffee and attended St. Ambrose grade school and Central High School. He, along with his brother

Laurence, would fire the furnace to pay for their tuition at St. Ambrose. They would have to arrive at school at 5 a.m. More than once, they spent the night at the school, so they did not have to get up earlier than necessary.

During the time when his sister, Edna, was ill and using crutches, Vincent would pull her to school in a little red wagon.

His chores at home included cultivating the large garden. While doing this, he would catch potato bugs to use for fishing and catching crawdads. After catching crawdads, Vince would cook the tails on a bonfire for the rest of the kids to eat - "Delicious!" says sister, Edna.

After graduating from high school, he attended one year at Southeast Missouri State University and later taught upper elementary school in Glennon, Mo.

He moved to Kansas City, Missouri with his parents, brothers and sisters in 1937.

In Kansas City, he held a job as a salesman for Health-Mor for a short time. He also worked for the Ford Motor company in Claycomo, Missouri. He retired from this company after 30 years.

He married Lucille Victoria Vega, daughter of Victor Florez Vega and Grace Ruth Zaring. She was born 18 Jun 1914 in Kansas City, Missouri. She was baptized at Sacred Heart Catholic Church in Kansas City, Missouri on 15 August 1920.

Lucille lost her mother at a young age and helped to care for her brothers and sisters. Vincent and Lucille were married 01 March 1939 at Sacred Heart Catholic Church in Kansas City, Missouri.

Vincent enjoyed playing the harmonica and playing cards. The Kansas City Hinkebein pinochle games were a frequent and noisy part of family gatherings.

His artistic ability manifested itself in wood working and his ability to write in Old English penmanship. Vincent was also a storyteller and loved to tell stories about the family in earlier years.

Lucille died 17 Aug 1973 of complications of diabetes. She is buried at Mount Olivet Cemetery in Kansas City - Garden of the rosary - Crucifixion.

After the death of Lucille, Vincent married Marjorie Bartram and lived in Kansas City and Lee's Summit, Missouri. He spent his time tending to the yard and visiting relatives.

Because of illness, he moved to Jefferson Health Nursing Center in Lee's Summit, Mo. Even in his later years, the stories of the early years in the Hinkebein Saga were entertainment for those who went to visit.

Vincent died 13 Jun 2001. He is buried at Mount Olivet Cemetery - garden of the Rosary - the Crucifixion.

Abc EDNA CATHERINE HINKEBEIN (Meinard - Theodore - John -
Edna)



Edna Catherine Hinkebein was born 19 Aug 1915 in Allenville, Missouri. Allenville is not far from Dutch town. Here, the family attended church at St. Edwards. In

the following years, she lived, with her parents, in Allenville, Benton, and Chaffee.

Edna had several challenges to face through her lifetime that required inner strength and great faith to overcome. Her first challenge occurred at a very early age.

The family had moved to a farm in Lambertsville, Mo., a town near Benton when Edna was seven years old. She had started school in Benton. Upon near completion of the first grade, 20 May 1922, on a Friday evening after school, Edna decided to put up a swing made of bailing wire. Going barefoot, along with sisters, Nettie and Clementine, and playing in the barnyard, she jumped onto a board that had a rusty nail sticking out. Her mother washed the wound with peroxide, but the damage had already been done, she had developed blood poisoning (tetanus).

By Sunday, the foot had become infected and Edna was taken to the Doctor. Tetnus shots did not solve the problem either. By the following Tuesday, Edna had a high fever, spasms, and much pain. Edna suffered with this disease for over ten years. At one time during the illness, the doctors were going to amputate her left leg. However, a small improvement credited to her father soaking her foot in buttermilk, and novenas made to St. Teresa, the Little Flower made the doctors change their minds. Edna would live the remainder of her life with scars from the lancements and one leg shorter than the other.

After the family moved to Chaffee, Edna returned to school at St. Ambrose grade school. She was still walking with crutches. She, along with her brothers and sisters in school, helped clean the school to pay for the tuition. By Edna's own admission, she did not have to work as hard as the others. For entertainment, she and her brothers and sisters attended CYO (Catholic Youth Organization) functions and went to dances and parties in Leopold, Oran, Chaffee, and New Hamburg. Occasional picnics would also be a source of fun.

In 1930/31, when Edna was a young teenager, the depression started and being one of the older children, she went to work to help support the family. She worked in a factory earning 75 cents to a dollar a day if she was able to get 8 hours work.

In August, 1939, after her parents and most of her family had already moved to Kansas City, where her father had obtained a full time job with the Frisco RR, she decided to follow. She arrived and went to work at Lee Walls Garment company on 23rd and Broadway in Kansas City, Mo. She was a seamstress and one of her jobs was sewing pockets into coats.

It was in 1938, that she met Victor John (Pete) Vega. He lived in the same neighborhood and attended Sacred Heart Church, the same church that the Hinkebein family attended. He was the son of Victor Florez Vega and Grace Ruth Zaring.

When Edna met Victor, he was in the National Guard, Corp of Engineers. They were dating when the National guard was mobilized and Victor attended officers school.

He graduated in June, 1942 and he and Edna were married at Sacred Heart Catholic church in Kansas City on 06 Jul 1942 while he was home on leave.

They moved to Muskogee, Oklahoma where Victor was stationed. They lived there until his unit was sent overseas. At that time, Edna moved back to Kansas City and moved back in with her family to help her mother who was not very well. There, on 09 Aug 1943, their first child, Claudette Elaine was born. Victor Joseph (Joe) their second child followed on 18 Mar 1945.

Edna's second great challenge in life occurred on 30 Apr 1945 when she received a telegram from the army stating that Victor had been seriously injured in Germany. For days, she did not know whether he was dead or alive.

He had stepped on a mine while clearing a mine field and would lose his leg and spend the next three years hospitalized and in rehabilitation while Edna continued to care for their children while helping her parents and siblings. These years brought the birth of two more children. Kathleen was born on 26 Sep 1946 and Charles Edward was born 29 Dec 1947. It was also during this time, that her mother, Dina, suffered a massive stroke and died.

After three years, Victor returned home to join his family. He and Edna bought a home at 2407 Oakley, Kansas City, Missouri. This home would be a haven for many relatives in need and also a place where people always felt welcome.

Edna hosted many dinners for her relatives and all the nieces and nephews would always remember the back porch (playroom) and the front closet with the golden books as well as the great dinners that were a joint effort of Edna and Pete.

Edna's life was dedicated to raising a family and keeping house. She was active in St. Michael the Archangel Catholic Church where she was a member of the Altar Society and school PTA. During this time, her youngest sister Patsy moved in with them while finishing high school.

In 1949, Edna was devastated to learn that her brother, Paul, was diagnosed with Leukemia, an incurable disease at that time. He was married to Victor's sister, Pauline, and had two small children. Edna opened her home to his family, who lived with her during Paul's illness and Edna helped care for the children.

Tragedy, which seemed to mark Edna's life, struck again on 03 Jun 1953 when her youngest child, Charles, while playing with a balloon, choked to death in the home. All efforts to save him were in vain. It was an extremely difficult time for the family.

But life would go on and Edna knew she had to continue to raise her remaining children.

On 05 Jan 1955, another son, James Bernard was born. James would bring a spark to the family that only a new baby can do, and that the family desperately needed.

Because her father, John, was very ill, Edna once again opened her door to help. During the years before he entered the nursing home, he was taken care of by Pete and Edna. Henry Eugene "Gene" Edna's brother, was also in need of a home and he also moved into the home. Gene was legally blind and deaf, and at times a great challenge for the family, but his big heart and caring also brought joy.

1966 to 1970 were perhaps the most difficult time for the Kansas City Hinkebein family. John, the patriarch of the family died on 16 May 1966. It was announced by the priest at his funeral, that his daughter, and Edna's sister, Teresa, had suffered a massive heart attack during thyroid surgery and would not survive. She died 21 May 1966 at the age of 37, leaving 8 children. Both Edna and Pete did all

they could to help her family while grieving their great loss.

In 1968, another sister, Nettie, died of colon cancer at the age of 51, leaving 12 children. Again, with grieving heart, Edna tried to help the family with cooking and cleaning to the best of her ability.

04 Feb 1970, brought yet another death to the family. Edna's youngest sister, Patsy, died after a long painful illness. She left 5 small children.

Twenty five children left without mothers in four years would be a true test of Edna's faith and endurance. She truly missed her sisters and was determined to keep the Kansas City Hinkebein family together.

It was in 1981, that Victor "Pete" was diagnosed with Colon Cancer. He had several operations, chemotherapy, and radiation, but on 19 April, 1986, died on this disease leaving Edna alone for the first time in over 40 years.

Edna continued to live in her home until 1993. The neighborhood had deteriorated to the point that Edna's family was greatly concerned with her safety. So, after a great deal of thought, Edna was forced to leave the only home she had known for 50 years, a home she had devoted her life to. The move was very difficult for Edna. She moved to Blue Springs, Missouri near her children.

In 1989, Edna was found to have a malignant tumor of the colon. This, of course, was very difficult for the family to hear since Victor had succumbed to that disease just 3 years earlier. Edna was operated on within days and fortunately, the doctors were able to remove all the cancer.

Edna lived in good health until 2000 when she suffered a heart attack. Edna had been on vacation in Omaha, Nebraska when she became ill. So, in order to return to Kansas City, she had a long ride in an ambulance.

Her main artery was opened and though she did have some blockage, the doctors decided to leave well enough alone unless she encountered more problems.

In 2001, all the children and many of the grandchildren decided to accompany Edna for a family summer vacation outside Denver, Colorado, in the mountains. En route, Edna stopped to use a restroom and fell, breaking her hip. She was rushed to the nearest hospital and subsequently taken to Denver where she had a hip replacement.

She then returned to Blue Springs for extended care. However, the apartment she lived in had stairs. It was agreed it was in her best interest to move to a one story apartment. So while Edna stayed with each of her children for a week each, the move took place. She moved to Raytown, Mo., to an independent living retirement apartment.

Both Edna and Victor were strong people. Both had struggled back from near death experiences and had lost a child. They were always there for those persons who needed help and their home was open to all.

Edna Catherine Hinkebein and Victor John Vega had five children -VEGA

Victor Vega died 19 Apr 1986 in Kansas City Missouri of colon cancer. He is buried at Mount Olivet Cemetery - garden of the rosary-crucifixion in Kansas City, Missouri.

Edna keeps busy keeping up with her home. She tends her flowers and grows tomatoes. She enjoys crafts, particularly sewing crafts. She visits sister-in-law Pat Vega and together you can depend on them coming up with a unique gift item to be made for the family for Christmas.

VICTOR JOHN VEGA (HUSBAND OF EDNA) Victor John Vega was born 29 Jan 1916 in Kansas City, Missouri. He was the second child and first son of Victor Florez Vega and Grace Ruth Zaring. Victor was better known as "Pete" to all the

family. It is said that he was called Pete because his sister who thought he was such a pretty baby but could not say "Pretty" called him petey baby. From that time on - he was called Pete. (At least that's the story he told.)

Victor attended Sacred Heart Church and Sacred Heart Grade School. He then attended and graduated from Rockhurst High School. His mother passed away when he was 15 years old and being the oldest son, a lot of responsibility fell on his shoulders. He took care of his three younger brothers and sisters and learned quickly to cook and clean.

After graduation, during the depression years, he was unable to find employment so he joined the National Guard. It was not long, thanks to unrest in Europe, that his unit the 110th Engineers, was mobilized and sent to Camp Robinson, Ark., where they stayed for a year. At the time of the Pearl Harbor bombing, he was sent to the coast and was in California. From there, he went to officers school at Ft. Belvoir, Virginia and graduated in June 1942.

On 06 Jul 1942, he married Edna Hinkebein, whom he had met 4 years earlier. They lived in Muskogee, Okla. where he was stationed until he went overseas. Lt. Vega served in North Africa, Italy and France. After returning to the states for a short period, he took the 283rd Engineers back overseas. He was promoted to Captain. His outfit fought through the winter of 1944 and 1945 in Germany and Bavaria. On 30 Apr 1945, as they were cleaning mine fields to enable them to build a bridge over the Rhine river, he stepped on a land mine and his foot and part of his leg was blown off. In an effort to save his own life, he tied his own tourniquet. He spent a month in the hospital in Germany and another three years in hospitals in the United States. His unit completed the bridge and named it the Victor J. Vega Bridge and his jeep was the first to be driven over the bridge. He was greatly admired by those under his command.

He was promoted to the rank of Major, earned the purple heart and bronze star. He was, however, forced to retire from the Army.

He returned to Kansas City, Mo. and resumed life with Edna and his four children. He worked at the Kansas City Missouri Post Office.

He had an artificial leg and it was a source of wonder to all the nieces and nephews! He would tell them, he kept snakes in it. When they were old enough to realize, there were probably no snakes, they would be content to feel it and put their fingers in the air holes. There are interesting stories from many of the nieces and nephews about the first time they walked into the house and saw a leg standing there.

The hardest thing Pete ever had to face was the death of his son, Charles. Charles choked on a balloon and died in his father's arms.

Pete was a hard worker despite having only one leg. He not only held a full time job, but many years put out a huge garden and helped with the canning and freezing. He also would help with the housework and he loved to cook. He was always available to help the kids with their homework - any subject - anytime.

He was a strong person who opened his home to anyone in need. All the relatives would like to be invited to the Vega house for dinner because they knew that Pete would be cooking. He was an excellent cook and was well known for his spaghetti and meatballs and homemade pies.

Victor died 19 Apr 1986 at Kansas City, Missouri after a long illness of colon cancer. He is buried at Mount Olivet Cemetery - garden of the rosary - crucifixion.

Adb MARIE ANTOINETTE HINKEBEIN (Meinard - Theodore - John - Marie)



Marie Antoinette (Nettie) was born 07 May 1917 in Allenville, Mo. At the age of six, she had diphtheria. She occupied her childhood, attending school at St. Ambrose and playing with her brothers and sisters. Marie, along with brothers Laurence and Vincent, and sisters Edna and Clementine, cleaned the school for \$30.00 per month tuition that was charged for the family.

Marie Antoinette was called "Netti" by her family.

She grew to adulthood in Chaffee, Missouri attending grade school and high school there. She went to high school for two years, quit school and went to work for a couple of years to help the family during the depression, and then returned to graduate from high school in Chaffee.

She moved with her parents and brothers and sisters to Kansas City, Missouri where she worked as a seamstress for Lee Walls before her marriage. Lee Walls was a garment company that made coats.

On 07 Jun 1941, in Kansas City, Missouri, she married Corwin Austin Wheeler. Corwin was born 13 Dec 1914. He was a lawyer who worked as a civil service investigator for the federal government. Because of her large family, twelve children, Nettie kept more than busy keeping house and raising her family.

The family made the Kansas City Star when six of the children, Laverne, aged 6; Dorothy, aged 8; Teresa, aged 10; Jerry, aged 11; Anita, aged 12; and Erlene, aged 14; all had their tonsils removed the same day at St. Joseph Hospital in Kansas City, Mo. It took Dr. John T. Skinner 2 1/2 hours.

She was a very religious person who made the family rosary a nightly occurrence.

Nettie was a happy person. When you were around her, laughter was a part of the scene. She occasionally got so tickled, that she could not stop laughing. The laughter would spread and before long, the entire room would be laughing.

Clementine (Clemmy) was born 10 Mar 1919 in Benton, Mo. She grew up in Chaffee, Missouri where she attended St. Ambrose grade school and graduated from Central High School.

She worked in a shoe factory before moving to Kansas City with her parents.

In Kansas City, she lived with her parents and worked in a hassock factory where she met Jack Earl Wagner. They were married 22 May 1943.

Jack Earl Wagner was born 15 May 1920. He worked at General Motors Co. in Kansas city, Missouri. He retired from this company. Clementine and Jack lived in Kansas City and later in Raytown, Mo., where Jack built his home. Clemmy always had a large garden and canned the produce.

Clementine and husband, Jack, hosted the annual fourth of July picnics for the Hinkebeins in Kansas City for many years. They had a large area of land and the picnics would be held under the trees at one end of the property.

After his retirement, Jack and Clementine moved to Lake Pomme de Terre in Boliver County Missouri where once again, Jack built his new home.

She devoted her life to raising her children. She was noted for her homemade Macaroni and Cheese Casserole. She enjoyed gardening, especially raising green beans and canning from the garden to feed her family. She embroidered in her spare time.

Clementine was an avid baseball fan and followed the Kansas City Royals. If a game was on TV or radio, she would be listening. She was a member of St. Bernadette's Catholic Church in Hermitage Mo. and was active in the church's ladies guild where she served as treasurer.

Clementine was diagnosed as a diabetic in 1978. Jack suffered a heart attack in 1977, and Clementine suffered a stroke in 1986 and another one in 1990. The strokes left her partially paralyzed in her left arm and leg.

Clementine was forced to endure many hardships, including the loss of a son, William, at a very young age and her disabling physical condition. Through it all, she has been a source of inspiration for all.

He enjoyed playing marbles with his good friend, Harold Crump, a neighbor.

He moved with his parents and siblings to Kansas City, Missouri where he graduated from Bishop Ward High School on 02 Jun 1939.

Paul joined the national guard (110th Engineers) in the spring of 1940 and was called to active duty on 09 Jul 1940 and served in the Pacific during several major campaigns.

After he returned from the service, he worked at Harper Rug Company.

In 1946, he married Pauline Elizabeth Vega, daughter of Victor Florez Vega and Grace Ruth Zaring. Pauline was born 09 Nov 1924 in Kansas City, Missouri. She was baptized at Sacred Heart Church in Kansas City, Mo.

During the short time they had together, Paul and Pauline enjoyed dancing to the big bands when they would be in the area.

He enjoyed sports, especially baseball and he, like all the Hinkebeins, enjoyed playing cards (especially Pinochle). He loved music and had a large record collection.

Paul had an excellent voice and enjoyed singing. His voice sounded similar to Bing Crosby's.

Adb TERESA AGNES HINKEBEIN (Meinard - Theodore - John -
Teresa)

Teresa was the 8th child and 4th daughter of John Herman and Bernadina Philemina (Stoverink) Hinkebein. She was born 21 Dec 1928, in Chaffee, Mo. and named by the Sisters of their parish, St. Ambrose.

John was a blacksmith by trade and work had been sporadic in southeast Missouri at that time. He accepted a job with the railroad and moved the family to KCMO in 1937.

Teresa was 8 years old and a very bright child and when she entered Sacred Heart Grade School, she was advanced a grade. She made friends easily; she was pretty and athletic. She played softball, swam, and loved to ice skate at Penn Valley Park. Teresa graduated from Redemptorist High School in 1946. Through high school, she continued to make good grades and her Catholic faith was very important to her. She had a special devotion to her patron, St. Teresa, The Little Flower and to St. Anthony.

On the 15 Jul 1946, Teresa's mother died of a stroke. Teresa had just graduated from high school and lived at home with her father, brother Gene and younger sister Patsy. Patsy and Teresa were close as sisters and the best of friends.

On 31 January 1949, Teresa's brother Paul died of Leukemia. Although Teresa was deeply saddened by these deaths, her tremendous faith eased her sorrow. This passage was taken from a diary Teresa kept:

"Monday-January 31, 1949

Our Lord must surely have a grand reception committee prepared and waiting anxiously to receive the Immaculate soul of our beloved Paul on this day. How all Heaven must have rejoiced but especially Mama who must have looked forward for this meeting with her Soldier boy since the day her own soul was taken from us by Our heavenly Father."

April 15, 1950 Teresa married Richard Roy Harris in a formal wedding at Sacred Heart Church in KCMO. Father Bauer celebrated the Mass. They lived in KCMO until 1956. In that time, their family grew quickly with the births of their first five children: Mark Richard - Feb 1, 1951, Michael Thomas - Mar 6, 1952, Roy James - Dec 18, 1953, Kathryn Ann - Jan 10, 1955, Edward Evert - March 24, 1956.

In the summer of 1956, the Harris' bought a small house at 1262 Lowell in KCKS and they joined St. Benedict's Church. The house was small but the yard was the biggest in the neighborhood and most afternoons it was filled with children playing baseball, football, tree-climbing or using the large swing set in the yard. Teresa always welcomed

the children's friends, sometimes setting up a table of sandwiches and kool-aid for all to share.

The family continued to grow with the births of Judy Lynn, Aug 8, 1958, John Joseph, Sep 5, 1961, and Paul Elliott, Sep 26, 1963. In Dec. 1963, the family moved about 2 blocks away to a much larger home at 45 So. Valley. March 22, 1965, the youngest child, Patrick David was born. The children attended the parish grade school and Teresa was active in the Altar and Rosary Society and the Mother's Club.

Teresa was a devout Catholic and raised her children in a home where faith was important. She prayed with her children at home and at Mass. She usually carried a rosary in her pocket. Sacraments were important events in her children's lives and she felt very close to all of her godchildren.

School work kept the family busy and Teresa always found time to listen to her children's reading - usually while she bathed or fed a younger child.

Teresa worked hard to keep up with the demands of nine children and a large house. She was a great cook and loved to bake. Cookies, rolls, cakes and pies were special treats and everyday dinners were always delicious.

The demands of a large family didn't allow time for regular work outside the home, but for a few years at Christmas time, Teresa worked part-time in the evenings at 'Daniel's Cleaners'. One year on her birthday, Dec 21 (probably 1962) the cleaners was robbed while she was working. She must have been terrified, but she asked the armed man not to hurt her because she had 7 children. She wasn't harmed and that evening she told Richard that she was sure the assailant was just trying to provide a nice Christmas for his own family. That was Teresa's kind forgiving nature.

Holidays and birthdays were celebrated with love at the Harris home. Teresa loved to make Halloween costumes, surprise the children with Easter baskets and share their joy at Christmas.

The affects of cigarettes and caffeine were just being made public in 1966. Teresa drank a lot of coffee and smoked

heavily. Her health was not the best, as she was on medication for an irregular heart beat and she had developed a goiter which required surgery.

May 13, 1966, she entered St. Joseph's Hospital in KCMO for the surgery and planned to be home the following Saturday. That evening and next day, she made numerous phone calls to friends and family. Teresa had entered the hospital knowing that her father was gravely ill and had made an arrangement to be allowed to attend his funeral if that was necessary.

Monday, May 15, Teresa suffered a massive heart attack during the surgery and was moved to Intensive Care in a coma. The following day, her father, John Hinkebein, died at the age of 80. That week was one of great anxiety and sorrow. The Hinkebeins had to plan their father's funeral while their dear sister Teresa lay unaware that he had died. Every day, the family prayed for her recovery and held on to any word of hope. John was buried on Friday, but Teresa's children did not attend his funeral as their mother had taken a turn for the worse during the night. Saturday, the day she should have gone home to her children, Teresa's 'immaculate soul' joined her father, mother, and dear brother Paul with Our Heavenly Father. Her funeral mass was celebrated May 24, 1966 at St. Benedict's Church and she is buried in the garden of St. Anthony at Mount Olivet Cemetery in Raytown, Mo.

Teresa gave much to the world in her short life and she was loved by many. At least 4 girls were named for her. She had big brown eyes that twinkled with her ready smile. Teresa gave us her laughter, her compassion, her faith and her love. Even though it has been 28 years since her death, she is missed daily by those she touched.

Teresa was awarded a certificate of recognition by the Wyandotte County Chapter of the American Red Cross for saving the life of a young girl after she and her date were overcome with carbon monoxide gas in their car. Teresa administered mouth to mouth respiration after being awakened by the frantic screams of the girl's father. This heroism was covered in the Kansas City Star, January 1, 1961.

RICHARD ROY HARRIS (Husband of Teresa Hinkebein)

Richard was the only child of Emma Cordelia Hurst and Roy Peter Harris. He was born in KCMO June 30, 1929. Although he was an only child, he was raised near his maternal aunts and uncles who were close to his age. His aunt Olive came to live with them when Richard was very young. Richard dropped out of high school to join the Army in 1946. the war had just ended and he was stationed in Europe, working with the rebuilding effort.

On April 15, 1950, he married Teresa Agnes Hinkebein. Before the marriage, he had converted to Catholicism. Richard worked for the Santa Fe Railroad as a carman. They lived in Kansas City, Missouri until they bought their first home in Kansas City, Ks in 1946.

On March 21, 1953, Richard's father, Roy died of a heart attack at the age of 46. Roy's death at such a young age was hard for Richard. This was the first death he'd had to deal with and it brought home his own immortality. Teresa and Richard moved Emma in with them and their two boys, Mark and Mike. In December, their third son , Roy, was born and named for his recently deceased grandfather.

Feb 6, 1954, Emma married John "Evert" Lattin. Evert was a quiet, reserved man who immediately took on the role of grandfather and loved his new grandchildren and they loved him. They lived in the Argentine area of KCK.

Kathy was born the following January, and Edward Evert "Eddie" named after Grandpa Evert, followed in March of 1956.

Richard's father-in-law, John Hinkebein was aging and in poor health and lived with the family in the mid 50's.

With 5 children, the Harris' needed a larger home. In June of '56, they bought a small but affordable house at 1262 Lowell in KCK.

Being an only child didn't prepare Richard for the life of a large family, but he loved his children and worked hard to provide for them, holding a part-time gas station job, in addition to the railroad.

They lived in the Lowell house for 7 ½ years and added a daughter, Judy and two sons, John and Paul to the family during those years.

Between Christmas and New Year's Eve of 1963, the family moved two blocks away to a much larger home. Richard loved to entertain, and in the house barely 24 hours, he hosted a New Year's Eve Party to christen the new home.

Richard left the Railroad in 1965 and worked as an insurance underwriter with his brother -in- law, Larry Nesbit. This arrangement lasted just a little more than a year.

March 22, 1965, Patrick David, Richard's last child was born. In September 1965, he and Teresa hosted a party to celebrate John Hinkebein's 80th birthday.

Teresa's health was not good. She had developed an irregular heart beat and a goiter which required surgery. May 21, 1966, she died, six days after surgery. 36 years old, a widower with nine children, Richard was in an unenviable position. Always there, his mother and step-father, Emma and Evert Lattin stepped in to help.

Richard took a job as a bartender at Sam's bar and grill. He enjoyed this job and was successful at it. Richard was a well liked man who always had a story to tell.

After the death of his wife, Richard and Emma hired a housekeeper to look after the children, cook and clean. In

a years time, at least a dozen women had come and gone. Their ages ranged from mid 20's to 70's, and all with varying degrees of skill in the kitchen. A sense of humor was mandatory to survive in that household.

Richard met and married Shirley Mayhew in June, 1967. She was a young divorcee with three small boys. The marriage ended in April of 1968.

Then, in June of 1969, he married Mary Lou Matthews Lowrey. She had a son, James, aged 9, and a daughter, Mary Ann, aged 5.

Small businesses could not afford to provide benefits, such as health insurance, which was a necessity with such a large family. Richard worked for a vending company briefly and then went to work for Roto-Rooter as a serviceman and later as a service manager.

At the age of 45, Richard suffered his first heart attack. He was advised to stop smoking, cut out the fat from his diet and quit drinking. Richard attempted to follow these guidelines, but he failed saying he wanted to enjoy his life and live the way he wanted to. In the next 7 years, he was hospitalized for heart problems, including Congestive Heart Failure and Cardiomyopathy. His doctors recommended that he retire and take disability, but he continued to work. He died September 8, 1982 at the age of 53. Richard was buried next to Teresa at Mount Olivet Cemetery in Raytown, Mo. His funeral services were held at the Simmons Funeral Home in KCK and were attended by many. His oldest son, Mark, read a touching tribute and Monsignor Bauer who had converted him in 1950 and married him and Teresa presided with the Police chaplain. His mother who had always been there for him comforted his children, as she buried her only son. "Parents aren't supposed to bury their children. Even if he is 53, he's still my boy."

Sorely missed by many, but especially his children, his spirit lives on in their lives. While only 8 of his 13 grandchildren were alive at the time of his death, and most of them too young to remember Grandpa Rich, they all know about him and their grandmother from the frequent references and stories told about them by their parents.

Henry (known as Gene) was born 30 Apr 1927 in Chaffee, Mo. He grew up in Kansas City, Mo. on Madison Street and later on Summit Street. From birth, he suffered from poor eyesight and poor hearing.

Even with these disabilities, Henry worked from the age of 18 to the age of 55 at Business Men's Assurance Company where he managed the stockroom. He was an avid bowler and carried an amazing average in spite of his poor eyesight.

He was a member of the drum and bugle corp. in Kansas City and enjoyed waking people up with his bugling. Henry was well liked by everyone he came in contract with. He owned a place at Lake Pomme de Terre and had an annual gathering for many of his friends he worked with.

Gene was a member of the Eagles club in Raytown, Missouri. The last Saturday of January, for several years before his death, he held an annual chili dinner for the benefit of disabled children. He would plan the event, cook the Chili

and mingle with all his friends and relatives who would fill the hall to overflowing.

The year following his death the club held the event in his honor. Gene was affectionately known as "The One Eyed Eagle".

One of his favorite parts of the year was Christmas. He would dress up as Santa and distribute gifts to the nieces and nephews. He was good old St. Nick to at least 45 nieces and nephews, and some great nieces and nephews. He also was Santa for charitable organizations and friends.

He lived with his sister Edna Hinkebein Vega for several years before his marriage. He first married Francis Bayles and later married Sharon Oster. He did not have any children.

He died 24 Aug 1991 of a heart attack. He had also been suffering with colon cancer.

As a final unselfish act, Henry donated his body to science.

The tragedy of the death of his younger brother "Charles" in 1953 when Joe was only eight years old affected the entire family. But it must have been especially difficult for Joe, since he and Charles had spent many hours each day playing together.

Joe attended St. Michael the Archangel Catholic Grade School. He had a rather rocky start to school. In kindergarten, he cried every day for the first two weeks and he had to be picked up and taken home. Finally, his cousin Ted Hinkebein who was in third grade came and sat in

the kindergarten classroom with Joe until he finally accepted that he had to stay there.

Joe served as an altar boy and sometimes, at play, pretended to be a priest - showing off the fact that he knew some Latin.

One of Joe's favorite childhood pastimes was the YOYO and he was very accomplished at such tricks as "Walking the Dog".

He along with Claudette and Kathy would play apartment house in a large tree in the back of their yard. Joe would always be the landlord because he would not climb any further than the first fork in the tree.

His first job, at the age of 13, was working at "Spud nut" donuts. He would pick up several dozen donuts and go door to door selling them. The Vega family ate a lot of donuts during this period of employment.

He was a boy scout and played football for St. Michaels school. Joe also learned to play the trumpet.

At home, he shared a bedroom with Uncle Gene, who lived with the Vega family for several years. Joe attended Rockhurst high school and during that time, worked for John's Drive Inn at the corner of 31st and Van Brunt. Here, he made, sold, and ate hamburgers and fries.

It was during this period he met friends Frank Fiorella and Ed Cockrell. A favorite pastime was to have a Friday night poker game at the Vega House.

After graduating from Rockhurst High School, he continued his education at Rockhurst College majoring in accounting. During his college years, he worked part time in the office of Western Auto. He graduated in 1967. He then was employed for a short time at Sunflower Ordinance in DeSoto, Kansas, but was soon drafted into the Army.

He served his military time during the Viet Nam conflict and was stationed there.

Upon his return from Viet Nam, he went to work for the H.D. Lee Company where he was in management in the accounting area. He is extremely well versed in computers and has

spearheaded many computer program projects for the Lee Company.

For fifteen years, Joe planned and executed the H. D. Lee Company picnic for all the employees in the Kansas City area. In 1997, Lee Company declared "Joe Vega" day in appreciation of Joe's hard work, excellent performance, and dedication for making the picnic an event that all employees looked forward to. On Joe Vega day, all the employees wore a button with a picture of Joe on it.

For many years, Joe also would have a baseball pot during playoff and world series games.

It was at H D. Lee Company that he met Monica Jane Myers whom he married 10 November, 1973. Monica, daughter of Jan Royer and Jack Myers was born 31 May 1952.

Joe and Monica made their first home in a mobile home at the Heart Trailer court, but soon purchased a home in Raytown, Missouri.

The trailer that was their first home was moved to Lake Pomme De Terre where it provides a quiet get away for anyone who wants to escape.

On 08 Dec 1975, Joe and Monica's first child was born 2 months premature. She weighted only 3 ½ pounds and was afflicted with Cerebral Palsy. The first few weeks were crucial but Mary Beth has been a fighter from birth and came through fine.

In the next six years, three more children joined the family: Matthew Joseph was born 28 Mar 1978, Angela Kathleen was born 13 Sep 1981, and Charles Frederick was born 06 Jan 1984.

Both Joe and Monica were very active in sports teams in which their children are involved. Both have held position in the soccer league in which their son Matt, and daughter Angela played. They were also involved in both baseball and softball.

Joe and Monica, along with Mary Beth have donated hours of their time and energy in fund raising activities for Cerebral Palsy. Their youngest son Charles is an accomplished musician and plays the French Horn in the

Kansas City Youth Symphony and in the Raytown High School band. He also plays the piano.

In 1995, Joe was diagnosed with Colon Cancer. This disease had taken the life of his father and his mother had also had the disease. Joe underwent surgery and several months of Chemotherapy. This aggressive treatment has eradicated the condition.

When H D Lee Corporate offices were moved to North Carolina, Joe opted not to transfer with the company and he was offered a job establishing and procuring items of the H. D. Lee archives. Joe retired from H. D. Lee Company in December 2001.

She also enjoys crafts, especially those involving machine sewing and together with her neighbor (and Joe's Aunt) Pat Vega had completed several different projects.

Monica returned to work, again at H. D. Lee, after all the children were in school.

Kathleen (Kathy) Vega was born at St. Joseph Hospital in Kansas City, Mo. on 26 Sep 1946 joining the family already consisting of Claudette and Joe. Kathy was the first of the children born after their father returned from WWII. She, therefore, always held a special spot in his heart.

Kathy spent early years playing with the neighbors, first Connie Taylor and later Linda Shelly.

She went to St. Michael and Archangel grade school where she made lifelong friends. She was active in a Girl Scout Troop associated with the school. Her favorite story about scouting is when her scout troop went camping at Lake Jacomo shortly after it opened. The girls slept on the ground in sleeping bags while the adult leaders, having heard stories about snakes being there, slept on the picnic tables.

The death of Charlie, her younger brother, in 1953, affected her as well as the rest of the family. She thanks a teacher, who when she returned to school, had her talk about it which seemed to help her cope with his death.

In grade school, she sang in the church choir and took piano lessons. She and Claudette still recall the piano duet they performed at a recital. Needless to say, neither will be seen performing today.

Kathy attended Cardinal Glennon High School which by this time had become an all girls' school. She was a good student and member of the National Honor Society.

After graduation, she worked at the Business Mens Assurance Company.

It was through her that she met her future husband, Rodger Krewson. Rodger was born 08 Feb 1943 in Centerview Mo. He is the son of Chester Krewson and Eunice Merl Allis.

On 24 Apr 1969, at St. Michael the Archangel Catholic Church, they were married.

Rodger is a farmer in Centerview, Mo. Kathy continued working for Social Security. They lived in a small one bedroom house until after the birth of their first two children, Rodney and Brian.

In 1976, they moved into a new house that Rodger built, with the help of his brother and father.

In Dec 1976, their third child Paul was born.

Kathy had become a stay at home mom after the birth of Brian.

In 1981, Kathy was diagnosed with Hodkin's disease after a long period of feeling weak but stumping doctors with the problem.

After the diagnosis, she faced an operation, several months of chemotherapy and radiation treatments. It was a very difficult time for her family. Kathy was away from home a lot and would be extremely sick after her Chemo treatments. But the results were positive and Kathy completely recovered from the disease.

However, in 1989, she suffered a heart attack while attending a wedding in Sedalia, Missouri. She was once again hospitalized. After spending a short time in the hospital in Sedalia, she was life flighted to St. Lukes Hospital in Kansas City, Missouri. There she underwent bypass surgery. After months of recuperation, she once again returned to a normal life.

After all of her children were in school, Kathy returned to work at the Social Security office in Warrensburg, Mo.

The death of her father in 1986 was very difficult for Kathy. She had been very close to him and he had always been there to help her through her difficult health problems.

But her health problems were not over. In 1992, she again had trouble with her heart and again underwent bypass surgery.

Though all of her health problems, Kathy has continued to work, succeed in raising her three boys and lived life to the fullest.

She has been an active member of Sacred Heart Catholic church in Warrensburg. She enjoys doing crafts and does exceptional woodworking projects. Her summers are filled with canning and freezing the produce from the garden, especially sweet corn. She enjoys playing cards and she and Rodger have a group of friends who play regularly.

Paul was born October 17, 1942 in Kansas City, Mo. He grew up in Midtown, attending St. James Grade School, Rockhurst High School, and graduating summa cum laude from Rockhurst College in Physics. He then took a fellowship at Princeton

University where he received his PHD., in nuclear physics in 1968. At that time, Paul modestly took the position that if Princeton University was good enough for Albert Einstein, then it was good enough for him. Paul worked as a physicist, project leader, liaison to the Secretary of Defense, and an associate director at Lawrence Livermore National Laboratories for 33 years concentrating primarily in the field of development in the field. In 1990, he received the DOE Weapons Recognition Excellence Award. He was a member of the American Physical Society, Alpha Sigma Nu and the Livermore-Amador Symphony board of directors. He also coached soccer and served as a volunteer for the Pleasanton Community concert Band. He was a member of the APS-Plasma Physics Division and was the scientific editor of Defenses Research Review. He enjoyed classical music and world travel with his wife and cheering on the Kansas City Chiefs from afar.

Among other things, Paul got to see a total solar eclipse in Hungary in the summer of 1999. He got to see the Three Gorges on the Yangtze River in China and travel to the far reaches of the world, including New Zealand, Tahiti, Canada, Mexico and Central America, several Caribbean Islands, eleven countries in Europe. But the highlight of Paul's life was seeing the Pope and receiving a papal blessing during a trip to Rome.

She was a good student and played softball, basketball and track. With three older brothers, Kathy's best defense was to always keep her parents informed of any of their misdeeds. This earned her the nick-name of "Snitch-witch".

At the age of 11, Kathy's mother died. Her grief was overwhelming, but she "had to be strong for the little ones", so with the support of her father and grandparents, she and her siblings somehow managed to get through those dark days. As the oldest girl in the family, Kathy took on the role of a caregiver to her younger siblings. She had had the best role model in her mother, and although no one expected an 11 year old to live up to that level of care,

Kathy tried to do that for her brothers and sisters and is still trying today with her own children.

Judy was a little shy at school but held her own at home with her 5 siblings.

At the tender age of 7, Judy's mother died. Even though she was so young and her memories are hazy, she remembers the pain that comes with such a loss, but more so she remembers the love that she now misses. One can see the shape of Teresa's eyes when looking at Judy, but more evident is her kindness, compassion and laughter that Judy inherited. With 6 children, everyone was amazed how much activity one more could add. You see, John was full of life from the beginning and he never slowed down. John was an adventurer. One never knew where he might be found, as he had no fear and knew no limits. "Get John!" was heard frequently around the house.

The death of his mother at the age of 4 ½ affected John deeply. The numerous caregivers employed by the family were not equipped to deal with John's grief or his energy. When John was 5 ½, his father remarried and the family added 3 step-brothers, one who was one year older than John. This marriage lasted only nine months, and there were 2 more years of various caregivers before Richard married Mary Lou Matthews Lowrey in 1969. She too brought a son one year older than John and a younger daughter to the family.

Emma and Evert Lattin, John's grandparents were always there for John and their unconditional love was a great asset for him. John attended Prescott Grade School, St.

Benedict's and Central Junior High School. John struggled in school and dropped out at an early age, but to his credit, he earned his GED.

Richard died 3 days before John's 21st birthday. Two years later, on his birthday in 1985, his grandparents were killed in a car accident. His grandparents helped him cope with his father's death and his siblings helped him cope with their deaths, but these losses were great and difficult for him to come to terms with and he has struggled to find stability in his life.

For 3 years, numerous housekeepers were employed by the family and his father had a brief marriage, so it is easy to see how a little one in such a large family, could become lost. However, the stabilizing force of the children's paternal grandparents is evident. Emma and Evert Lattin were the ties that bound the grieving family together. Paul's strong side emerged and he was never "lost". When he was 5 ½, Richard married Mary Lou Matthews Lowres and she brought two children to the family.

Paul's elementary education was at Prescott Grade School and he attended Central Junior High School. He earned his GED. He was in the National Guard for two years, and after the death of his father in 1983, Paul joined the regular

Army. Richard had encouraged him to do this and would have been proud of his military career.

He was stationed in Germany, when his grandparents were killed in a traffic accident in Sept 1985. Paul had lived with them and helped to enlarge their lake home. Their deaths were very difficult to deal with on the other side of the world, without his family. Paul came home for the funeral and took a one month leave. While in KC, he married Leisa Gardener 23 Sept 1985. They lived in Germany for three year. They were divorced.
