Dear Sir:

I have your letter of May 6th. Father Michael is in the office now, and we have gone over the question of the windows. We are accepting your proposition for \$2,071.00 plus \$3.00 each for the vents, and I am enclosing herewith a check in the amount of \$258.10 covering 10% of the above amount as per your instructions, and \$50.00 for the vents.


The width of these widdows may be an inch wider, but I am accepting this proposition with the understanding that there will be no additional cost if there should be any variation at all.

The man getting out the cast stone must go to the place and cut a slot for the windows, and we will send you the full information regarding same at the earliest possible moment. We thought, however, that you could go ahead with your figures *and* the Rose window, and there will be a vent in this window which we will expect you to furnish. We want this to be perfect when completed so there will be no possible chance for rain, etc., to get in.

We are sending your cartoon back under separate cover, insured, and are also sending copy of your letter to Father Michael; and if you should want to refer to him at any time, please do so, as we will only be able to give you information regarding measurements.

We will want these windows in two months, and I understand from Father Michael that you can lay aside your big Cathedral to finish this up for us. We will send you the pattern for the openings as soon as possible.
