St. Mark's Church is interested in developing a plan for all of their windows in the church. At the present time we have one large window over the altar and one small one in the baptistry. Both are good windows. The church is of English Perpendicular architecture and has six large windows in the clerestory on each side as well as two in the back clerestory (large) and two in the chancel.


There are likewise ten aisle windows in the nave and chancel making a total of 26 windows yet to be done. We have admired your work in the Holy Rosary Cathedral here and would like the opportunity to meet with you to discuss plans, prices etc. We would not be able to put in all of the windows at once, but have reason to believe that there would be some immediate work as soon as a completed plan is formulated.

This seems to offer an excellent opportunity for a man of your calibre to do an outstanding job. It is our intent to have fine windows, and we feel that a conference between you and our committee could be mutually beneficial.

It might interest you to know that among those on the committee are Mr. Lawrence Bellman, Toledo's leading architect, and Mr. Blake-More Godwin, director of the Toledo Art Museum.

It is our hope that you could come in September after the 8th and avoiding the 14th, 15th and 16th. Hoping for a favorable reply, I remain,
