Dear Mr. Pitassi;

Inclosed you will find check for Two Thousand Dollars on account of my windows. I am glad to hear that you will send the windows next week. At present I am making a drive for the windows. I have not yet had great results, but expect to work up enough enthusiasm to keep us going on the windows outside of the Clerestory.

Mr. Perry spoke about finishing the side aisles windows first before we go the sanctuary of gallery windows. That is perfectly agreeable to me. According to his suggestion, we would have to get busy right now with the design for the other three side aisle windows, which would have for subjects, viz: Confirmation, Baptism, Holy Eucharist. The subject of Penance would be treated in the windows above the Confessionals. I do not know if Mr. Perry gave you any preliminary matter on these latter three subjects. Perhaps he did, as we outlined the subjects in a general way. However, I wish that you would get real busy with these three windows very soon, so as to be sure and have them here without a question this time, by the end of June, 1930.

Today I received an order for the two section window above the side entrance door in front of the Virgin's Chapel. Subjects relating to Our Lady, St. Anne, and St. Adelaide and St. Aloysius are to go into these windows. By all means do not delay the making of my windows too long, as the continual postponement kills all interest of the people and prevents donations coming in.
