Dear Mr. Pitassi:

Our Pastor and the Window Committee at the Myers Park Methodist Church have further considered your drawings today, and we would like for you to make a few changes in the principal characters and their arrangement. We should like for them to be, looking from left to right, as one looks at the window, as follows:

We want to leave out the English king and the Austrian queen, as we feel that possibly a good many of our members would not like them. Moreover, we prefer that Steven and Saint Paul, both Biblical characters, be at the sides of Jesus. We feel that certainly the names now decided upon can well stand for the respective virtues. You will note that we have changed the arrangement with respect to humility and courage, so that Steven standing for Courage will be next to Jesus and Francis of Assissi standing for Humility will be in the left center, as one looks at the window from the inside of the Church. On account of this change, you will doubtless want to switch the emblems or what-not at the top and the bottom of these two figures just to the left of Jesus, as one looks at the window. In other words, the reference dealing with courage will be in the window just to the left of Jesus, as one looks at the window, and any and all emblems and references to humility will be in the center window, to the same left.

I trust that these changes will meet with your approval. We are very enthusiastic about the window that you are making for

us; and we shall look forward with great anticipation to the time when the window will be finished and shipped to us.
