Dear Mr. Pitassi;

It is a long time since I heard anything about my windows. When Mr. Perry was here in April we corrected the third one of the large windows in charcoal drawings, and Mr. Perry assured me they would be forthcoming very soon. I have not heard anything since.

This method of drawing out the making of these windows is spoiling my chances of getting any donations for windows. The people lose interest. If we are to go on with this work beyond the three windows that ought to be finished by this time, you must give me definite assurance that the work will be taken in hand and be finished by a reasonable time. By the way we are doing it now I cannot get any donations. I had hoped to give the window installation a good boost by celebrating our 25 Jubilee of the parish this fall and have all the lower windows in by that time, but nothing has been done and I cannot enthruse the people by showing them anything.

Mr. Perry said last April that the first window was complete and would be sent on. I do not want a single window sent on. The installation is more expensive and the effect is lost with only one window. Send all three at one

time or none. By this time the three windows for the south side should have been finished- Matrimony-
Priesthood-^s Extreme Unction.

Kindly give me some definite information as to how long I have to wait before these three windows will be sent on, and what you are going to do about the rest. Mr. Perry spoke as if you preferred to do the north three windows- Holy Eucharist-Confirmation-Baptism- first, rather than the Gallery Window or Sanctuary Window. In either case I must know what I am about. I shall not, however, repeat this process of procrastinating.
