Dear Mr. Akers,

It is now years since your church has done anything toward completing the Stained Glass Windows for which I hold a contract.

I know that for some time such a project was impossible for you to carry out as you had other responsibilities to cope with. At present I feel that you may be ready to proceed with this work and I am ready to cooperate with you in order to get things started again.

I wish to remind you also that I have a good bit of the work done for the Clere Story Windows and that four or five thousand dollars of my money is lying idle under my benches on which I should begin to realize something.

I have at present a large stock of the very best English Antique Glass and Norman Slabs, impossible to obtain now under the war conditions, which is fully adequate in carrying out your work. This should be an added attraction to complete this work now before the stock of good glass becomes depleted in this country. I may add that there are very few, if any, holding such a selection of fine antiques as I hold.

Would you be so kind to let me know at your earliest convenience what the chances are of starting this work again, and if a personal visit to your town would help in reviving interest in this subject?
