Dear Mr. Pitassi;

Those metal casements have been ordered from that firm in Pittsburgh. I ordered them sent to you for the glazing.

I do not fancy the diamond shape. In the vestibule screen they are rectangular. That is better.

Your idea is good - "light tinted quarries with a slight film of paint and little accidental ornaments here and there". That sounds good. Or how would that old English glass - such as you sent me as a sample for the light fixtures - in different shades of amber, with irregular leading AND the accidental ornaments, miniatures or such?

You may put ~~\$600~~ \$300 into it. Now I think that ought to put in something proper, if not let me know, I do not want to spoil the job for a few dollars.

The windows in the Chapel and the Guild room have only the rough single glass now. I was waiting till I could put something pretty in them, but I find it necessary to put in the other glass now to prevent the damage from the melting of frost on the single glass. I think you have the measurements of them / I wish you would suggest what to put in there and something about prices of the stuff, I might have you make them and send with the casement / .

I am sorry about the eyes. Do not overwork them to accommodate me. Glass can be made anytime, but eyes cannot.
