Dear Miss Pitassi:

We are having Mr. J. J. Akers, our church trustee treasurer, to send you a check for the final \$3,000.

We think that the window is extremely beautiful. The only disappointing factor was the fact that we were very anxious, "for the face of Jesus to be such that as we leave the Church and look up at this window from the inside of the Church, the eyes of Jesus will be upon each and all who look up to it." The language quoted is from our original contract. The eyes of Jesus were not put into the window in this fashion. Perhaps some day you could change that one section, to bring about the desired results. I would like to have your reaction, as to just why the contract was not followed, and just why the changes was made in this one respect.

There are two small windows, about 6 inches in diameter, that apparently were missed and no window was received for. I did not discover this until several days ago. Here again I suppose it will be just as well to leave this as it is, until and unless, we could at some future date do any additional work on the window.

All of us would greatly appreciate it if you would write me in detail, and explain in some manner the various figures, subjects and other things shown in the window. For instance, I know that the scales represents Justice, and that the Donkey's Head represents Humility. However, these are about the only two things that we could understand, other than the seven men, ~~We~~ want to get up a booklet about the window, and you could not go into too much detail, in telling us just what the different small emblems are and mean, and what the other little pictures represent. You could doubtless look at your drawing and give us a great deal of information along these ~~things~~.
