Dear Mr. Pitassi:

Answering your letter of 14th.

Three feet from this casement window and opening into the same room is a door with glass panels in the upper part of it. There are three panels each with four panes of light amber leaded glass. The panes measure 8" X 3". Across the sanctuary there is another door with same glass. I remind you of this as possibly bearing upon the shape and quality of the glass for these casements.

Further. The two side chapels have each one window about 2' X 3' filled with diamond shaped glass with ornaments worked in. The glass is Old English "seed" glass. Perhaps that two would influence you. These are not in the same wall as the casements.

Moreover you must remember the vestibule screen at the other end of the Church. The glass in this is rectangular, 7 1/2" X 3 1/2", with colored ornaments worked in.

Now with all these features in view I leave you select your own shape and style.

I'll speak about the other glass another time.

Am interested and anxious to see your Chicago windows.

You mean St. Gregory of course.
