

**The Sachsenhausen concentration camp, with an eventual capacity of more than 50,000 inmates, opened at Oranienburg, a Berlin suburb, in July 1936. It was the second large camp, after Dachau. Meanwhile, the smaller, so-called “wild” concentration camps that the Nazis had opened earlier, were phased out and closed. In July 1938, the SS administration of the entire concentration camp system moved its headquarters from Dachau to Sachsenhausen.**

***Sachsenhausen regulations, printed on the inside of this formular lettercard mailed November 7, 1940, allowed two letters or cards per month at that time.***
