German Espionage: Deutsches Nachrichtenbüro, Lisbon

The Nazis themselves made use of undercover addresses, fronts, and the offices of established firms, such as the German News Bureau in Lisbon, as letter drops for spies, whose information could be coded and forwarded innocuously onward to Berlin.

A December 5, 1942, air mail letter from the Portuguese office of the German News Bureau at Lisbon to the firm's foreign bookkeeping office in Berlin, censored at Munich.
