

NORTH FORK UNION HAS NEW REPORT CARD

The North Fork Union School has a new type of report card for the children this year.

The card is a report of progress of the pupil, rather than the old kind which just reported the "standing" of the pupil.

The new report will include both the Subject Development and the Social Development of the pupils in our institution.

Since there has been in recent times considerable thought given to reading, that subject will have a special report of the progress of the pupil in that subject.

The social qualities will be marked with a plus mark for the boy or girl who is commendable and a check mark for the child who needs to show improvement in the social field.

The subject development in the academic field will be marked with several keys, depending on the child. It may be strong progress, normal development, improving, unsatisfactory or weak and needs attention.

In keeping with modern journalistic trends, characters will help to carry the message of the pupil's progress to the parent or guardian.

The subjects in the academic part have been divided into phases of the subject to further explain the part the child is progressing in at the time the report is issued.


Let's forget the things we haven't got,

Their bounty at our door.


So may we nevermore forge,


