

TWO HUNDRED SEVENTY THREE PUPILS ENROLLED AT NORTH FORK

FIRST AND THIRD GRADES HAVE LARGEST NUMBERS

Of the 273 pupils now on the roll of the North Fork Union School, one hundred and thirty-five are in the Primary Division. In 1934 the total average daily attendance for the year was just 135.

The Third Grade has enrolled the greatest number for the year as that grade has a list of 41 on the register.

Next to the Third Grade in size is the First which has enrolled 40 to date for the class list.

The Second Grade with 36 names on the register ranks third in size for the current year.

It is interesting to note that the smallest classes are the two on each end of the program. The Eighth Grade lists 18 and the Kindergarten is also 18.

The remaining four grades are just about normal with 31 for the Fourth Grade, 26 in the Fifth Grade Room, 35 entered on the Sixth Grade register, and 28 appear on the list for the Seventh Grade.

The average daily attendance at the present time will approximate 250. Some more are listed to leave and a few will be coming in during the year.

Our own Sierra Joint Union High School opened this year with a total of 286. There are 47 Seniors, 58 Juniors, 69 Sophomores and a Freshman Class of 112.

The Mono congratulates each of you on the recognition your classmates have given you.



1949-50 THIRD GRADE CLASS






1949-50 KINDERGARTEN CLASS
