



Applying institutions will be notified of the application decision in writing after May 18.


Responsibilities of grantees

- Final Reports: Grantees must submit a fiscal and narrative report to the IAC following the purchase and the initial installation of the work(s) of art.
- Credit: The Illinois Arts Council must be credited in all publicity pertaining to the work of art.
- Insurance: All works acquired through the Partners in Purchase Program must be insured by the grantee.
- 4. Loan of Work of Art to IAC: All works purchased through the Partners in Purchase Program must be available to the IAC for up to eight weeks biennially for a group exhibition in an Illinois institution.

5. Loan of Work of Art to the Artist:

- a. The grantee/purchaser must make the art work available to the artist for inclusion in a public exhibition. Before permitting the artist to borrow the work, the purchaser may demand from the artist or the exhibiting institution documents proving adequate insurance on the work and prepayment of shipping charges to and from the exhibiting institution.
- b. The artist must give the grantee reasonable notice and is entitled to borrow the work not more than once in any 12-month period nor for any single period longer than six weeks.
- c. If the artist borrows the work for inclusion in a public exhibition, it is his or her responsibility to ensure that the exhibiting institution gives appropriate credit to the purchaser and the Illinois Arts Council.
- 6. Ethical Obligation: The grantee may not permit any use of the artist's name or misuse of the work which would discredit his or her reputation as an artist or which would violate the spirit of the work.
- 7. Transfer of Works: No work acquired under the program may be de-accessioned or otherwise disposed of during the lifetime of the artist except by exchange to the artist for another work or works.

It is illegal for the Illinois Arts Council or for anyone receiving assistance from the Illinois Arts Council to discriminate on the basis of race, age, color, religion, national origin, sex, or handicap.
