#8 RACHEL JACKSON
(1767-1828)

Rachel Jackson was the wife of the 7th president (1829-1836). She was the victim of the most malicious attacks ever directed against a president's wife. She was called the Frontier First Lady although she died a month before he entered the White House, at the age of 61 years. She was essentially a home-keeping frontier woman, but played her role of a national figure with simplicity and sincerity. She had worked their plantations - Hunter's Hill, and The Hermitage and was happiest in that freedom. It was almost with regret that she heard of Jackson's presidency. After her death, the president gave her place to lovely Emily Donelson, the young wife of ~~their~~ his ~~Secretary~~ Andrew ~~John~~ whom they had adopted. They had no children, but there were 2 White House weddings during the Jackson administration.
