GCHPF Work

Section G-4 and G-5

The GCHPF has worked diligently on the lake area improvement and new sections G-4 and G-5. We have successfully improved drainage and redirected waterflow in the lake area. Sections G-4 and G-5 embankments have been strengthened and reinforced with gabion lining and dirt. The gabion lining will help preserve the configuration of the topography and prevent erosion in this area. These sections will be sodded in the future and will retain a natural and aesthetically pleasing look.

Ravine Gardens

Taking advantage of Glenwood's unique terrain, The Center is situated on the banks of a small Ravine. The Main Lobby and Gathering Space has floor to ceiling windows that offer a breathtaking view of the cemetery, both spaces have glass doors leading to the Terrace. The Ravine has been cleared of dead trees and brush and will be stabilized with sodded grass which will help prevent erosion. The Ravine Gardens will be created to safeguard valuable land and will add beauty to the serene greenspace for those that visit our grounds. Using native plants and flowers beautiful gardens will be created that will be effective in preventing erosion while complimenting and accentuating the natural beauty of the Ravine and the cemetery landscape.

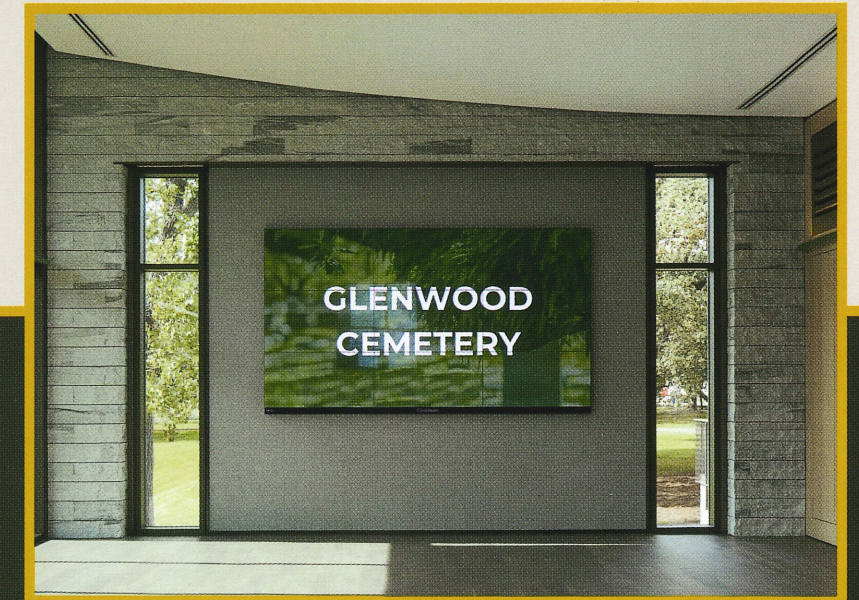

Gathering Space



The Gathering Space is 1,447 SF and offers a sweeping view of the cemetery grounds and Ravine. The Gathering Space can hold a reception of 100 seated guests, or table and chairs for 80 guests.

THE CENTER FOR GLENWOOD

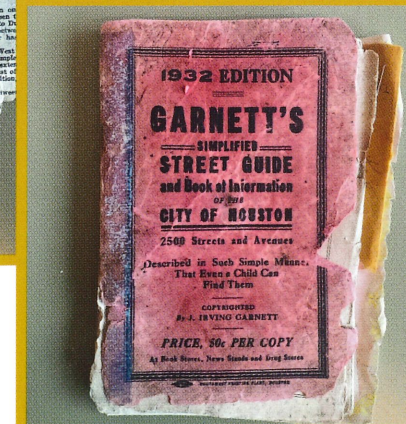
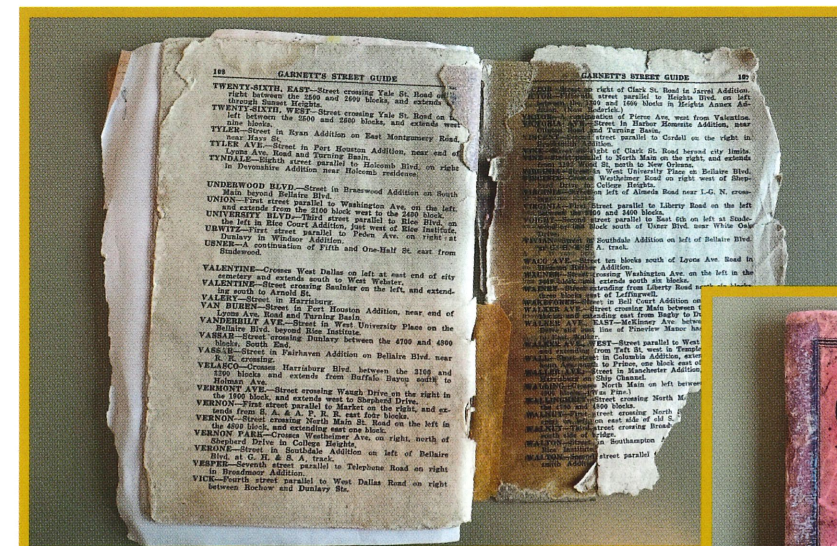
Welcome, *The Center for Glenwood* is now open! *The Center* is a unique space that combines modern architecture with natural elements. The high ceiling windows throughout *The Center* offers a beautiful view of the grounds and Ravine from almost every room, and gives the feeling of being among the treetops. The stone was imported from Italy and then cut from large blocks to a specific thickness and chiseled into individual pieces by hand. The stone flows into the building from the exterior. The flooring throughout the public spaces is a stunning dark micro terrazzo that gets extended out to the Terrace and part of the front entrance. The flooring in the Gathering Space is a beautiful white stained oak that is complimented by all the natural light from the floor to ceiling windows.

Archive Room

The Archive Room is a unique space adding value to both Glenwood and the City of Houston. It will be a dedicated space to access Glenwood's archives for research and educational purposes, engage the community through programming and other offerings, and advance and promote Glenwood's historical significance. Through our archive collections, we look forward to providing the community and the entire City of Houston with the remarkable opportunity to access its past.

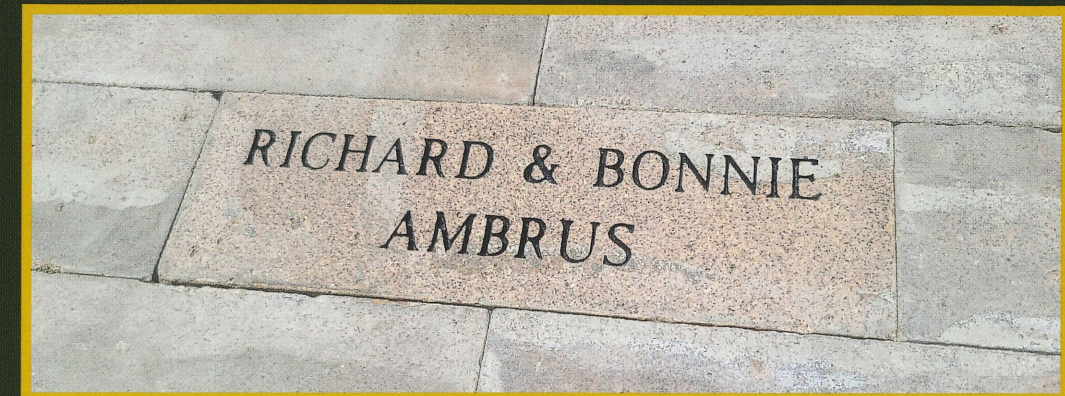


Boardroom & Reception Area
