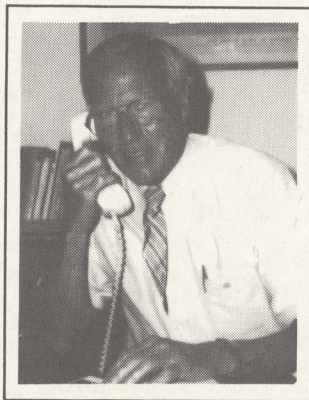

Introducing Master Chef Bill Holbert

"Ruler of the Kitchen" at the Rancho Santa Fe Inn

As they say in the nicest novels, Bill Holbert first saw the light of day in the small town of Milaca, Minnesota where his parents were actively engaged in the interesting business of harvesting wild rice and maple syrup. As a youngster, he regarded wild rice for breakfast just as normal as oatmeal. Thus his gourmet taste began.

Since his parents had a great deal of involvement in the hotel business as well, Bill's teen-age years included many a job in the kitchen, as well as many a taste treat in the form of freshly baked goodies. So it was only natural that, upon graduation, he apprenticed with Jean Claude Tindillier, master French chef at a five-star restaurant named Chouette in Wayzata, Minnesota. It was here, at the age of 23, that Bill received his basic classical training in French cuisine.

In the early 70's, Bill joined the kitchen of the New French Cafe in Minneapolis at a time when "Nouvelle Cuisine" was becoming more and more popular. Here, as sous-chef, he started creative cooking in earnest.

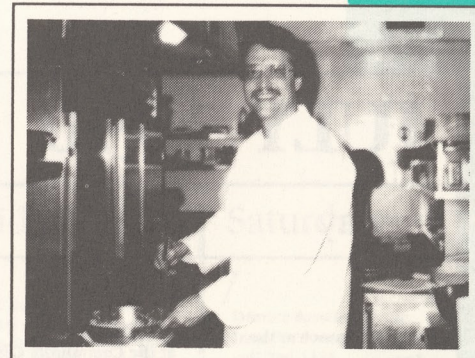
After four years it was time to move on. . . "on" being executive chef of the 270 room Preferred Hotel, the "Marquette" of Minneapolis.

Onward and upward. . . this time to the Netherland Plaza Hotel in Minnesota. . . the time following to the Famous Parker House in Boston, Massachusetts. Later, when the call came to become head chef at Wheatleigh Hotel and Restaurant in the Berkshires, Bill was ready. With the sounds of the Tanglewood Music Festival and the William Tell Overture close by, the next five years were spent serving an international clientele, and his reputation grew.

In the meantime, Bill had married Barbara, and three daughters and one son were born to the Holbert family. His Mother was living at Rancho Bernardo, his Dad in Escondido. Desirous of leaving Massachusetts for the West Coast, Bill was very interested when he heard that the Inn at Rancho Santa Fe was a member of the Relais and Chateaux group (which only allows Inns of fine cuisine, comfort and character into their prestigious organization). In addition, the Inn was searching for not just a chef. . . but an *extraordinary* chef. The rest is history. Bill is now "in residence" at the Inn at Rancho Santa Fe; and his wife and children will be here to stay on the 4th of July.


Many, many wonderful changes are in the offering. Some of them many of you have already experienced in the dining room. There are many more to come. Many more. Welcome, Chef Bill Holbert!

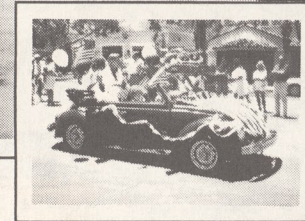

Betsy's Cafe is the brainchild of Betsy Royce, Food and Beverage Manager of the Rancho Santa Fe Inn.

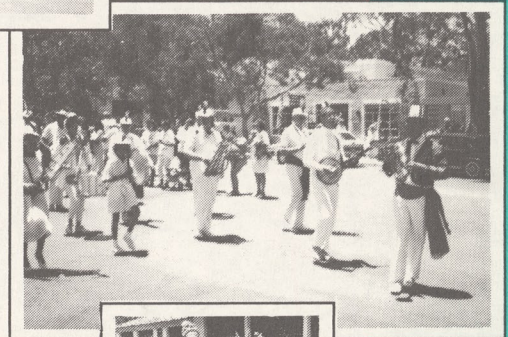

Dine outside near the pool and enjoy Betsy's Cafe all summer long!

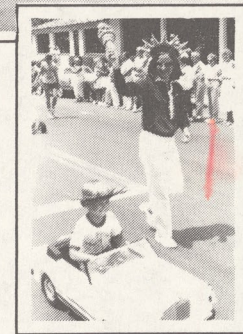


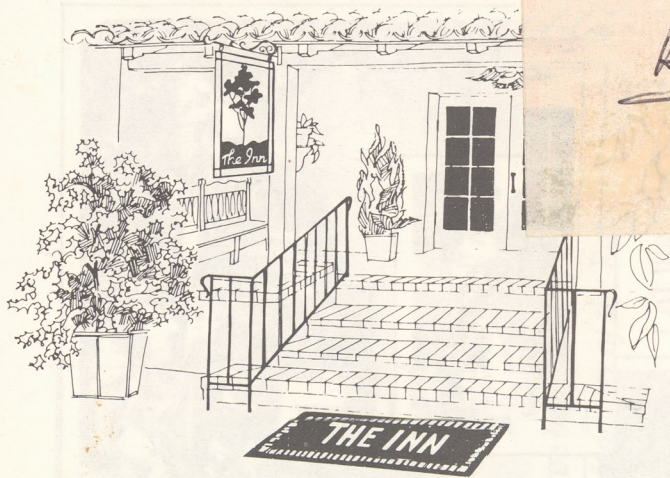
Come one! Come all! To the Rancho Santa Fe 4th of July Parade
