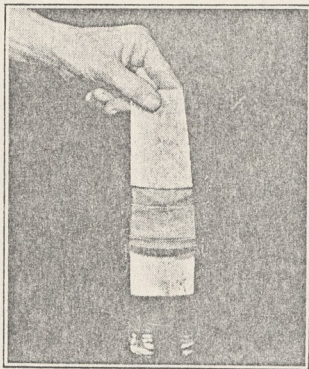

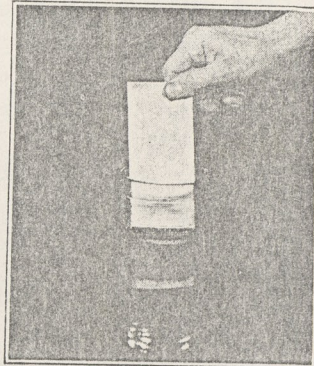
Try this test

Take a glass of sulphuric acid (two parts water, one part acid). Place a strip of the best galvanized roofing in this solution. Let it stay there five minutes. Note how quickly the acid eats away the coating.

In every smoky locality sulphuric acid is slowly but surely eating away the roofing. Soot forms on the roof, rain water mixes with it to form acids which corrode even copper. Salt air at places near the ocean has a similar effect.

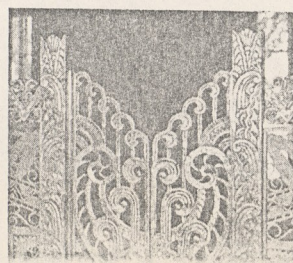
