## Director Hoyne Resigns

At the regular bi-monthly meeting of the Board of Directors of the Association, the resignation of Director Francis J. Hoyne was accepted with regret. Mr. and Mrs. Hoyne are moving to Rockford, Illinois.

Before the regular meeting was convened two Public Hearings were held. The first for the purpose of hearing any discussion or objections relative to the Petition of R. E. Badger to change the Architectural type restriction from 2 to 1 on the South easterly one-half of Block F, Map 1742 as set forth in Section 3 of Article 5, Rancho Santa Fe Protective Covenant. There being no comments from the floor, the hearing was closed.

The second Hearing was for the purpose of hearing any discussion or objections relative to the Petition of Ronald L. Martinet to change the Zoning from part Class "A" & "B" to all Class "B" on Lot 1, Map 2418, as set forth in Section 3 of Article 5, Rancho Santa Fe Protective Covenant. No comments from the floor, and the hearing was closed.

The meeting was called to order by President Jenkins. Absent was Vice-President Dewey. Approval was granted to R. E. Badger to change the Architectural type restriction from 2 to 1 on the Southeastery one-half of Block F, Map 1742 and to the Preliminary type of Medical Building to be constructed thereon.

Approval was granted to the Petition of Ronald L. Martinet to change the Zoning from part Class "A" & "B" to all Class "B" on Lot 1, Map 2418.

Director William Schofield was appointed to serve as Chairman of the Rancho Santa Fe Association Committee on County Government being formed in the Fifth Supervisorial District under the leadership of Supervisor Robert Cozens.

The Board passed by unanimous vote a resolution granting power to sign checks to

Director Fred H. Lewis, in place of Director Hoyne. Those now having power to sign or withdraw funds are Pres. Jenkins, Vice-Pres. Dewey, Director Lewis and Secretary - Treasurer Smart.

The following resolution was passed by unanimous vote.

**RESOLVED:** That \$12,000 be appropriated to settle the Godfrey Tudor Associates vs. Rancho Santa Fe Assn. Judgement.

The following applications for the 'Keeping of Animals' were approved: Robert Loomis, 2 horses; Elwood Thompson, 2 horses; Douglas Campbell, 1 horse.

Robert C. Francisco was granted approval for additional Grading on Portion of Lot 1, Block 31.

It was moved, seconded and unanimously carried that the resignation of Clubhouse Manager-Chef Milo Lenton, as recommended by the Golf Course Committee, be accepted, with regret, effective as of June 30, 1961 or earlier.

It was moved, seconded and unanimously carried that Mme. Lillian Galleher be employed as Clubhouse Manager, as recommended by the Golf Course Committee, effective as of June 30, 1961 or earlier.

It was moved, seconded and unanimously carried that the Contract of Neil McGregor, as Golf Course Manager, be terminated, as recommended by the Golf Course Committee, effective as of June 30, 1961.

Approval was granted to the Lot Realignment of Josephine Cheyney of Lots 19 and 20, Map 2089 and the Lot Realignment application of Bill Bramble and R. Nordstrom of Portion of Lots 1 and 3, Block 37.

The Board deferred action on the Petition of William Drew et al to change the number of building sites from 4 to 8 on Portion of Lot 2, Block 47, pending further discussion with the owners.

The Board deferred action on the appointment of a Director

to succeed resigning Director Hoyne, pending further study.

Action was deferred on the Preliminary application of George Lewis to construct a Multiple Dwelling on Lot 4, Block E, Map 1742, pending circulation of a Petition by the owner.

The Board deferred action on the Subdivision application of R. Victor Venberg of Portion of Lot 12, Block 32, pending further study by the Art Jury.

The Board deferred action on the Subdivision application of Gonsett Realty, Inc. of Portion of Lot 4, Block 11, pending further study by the Art Jury.

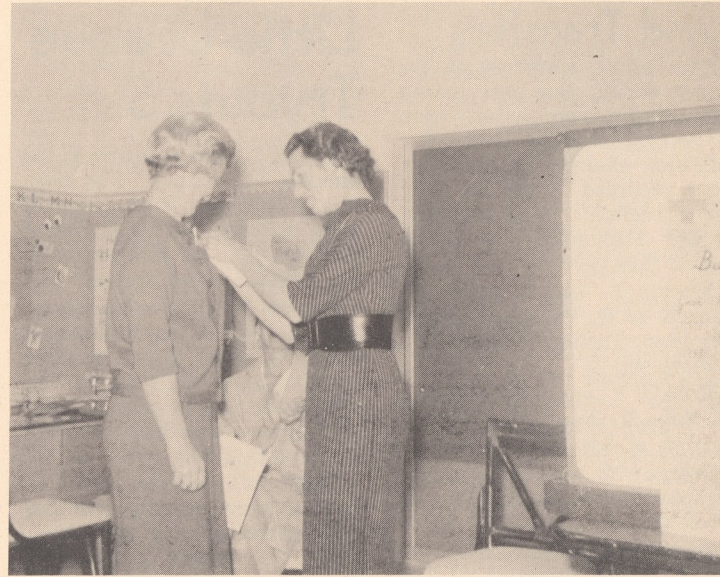

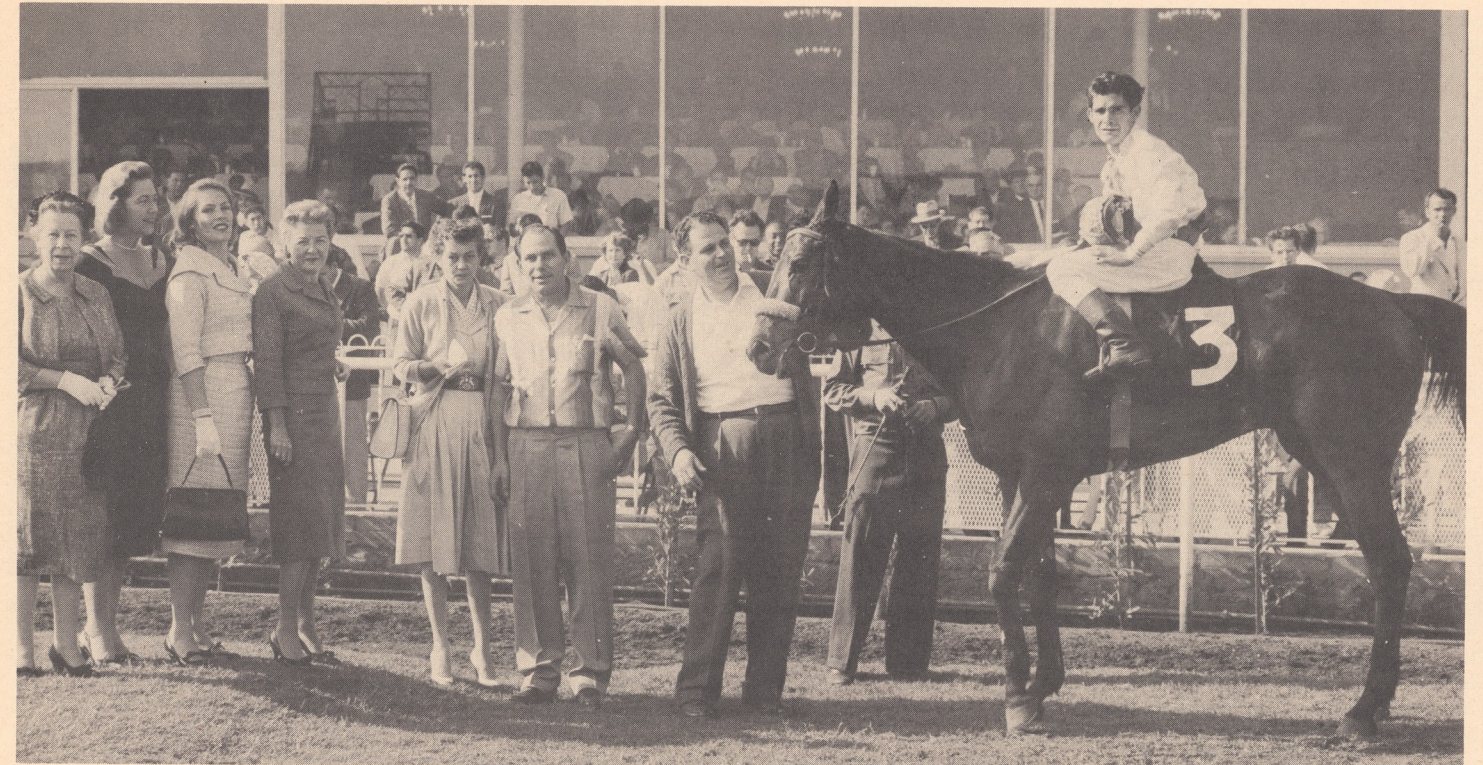

Friends is open to anyone and the dues are two dollars a year.

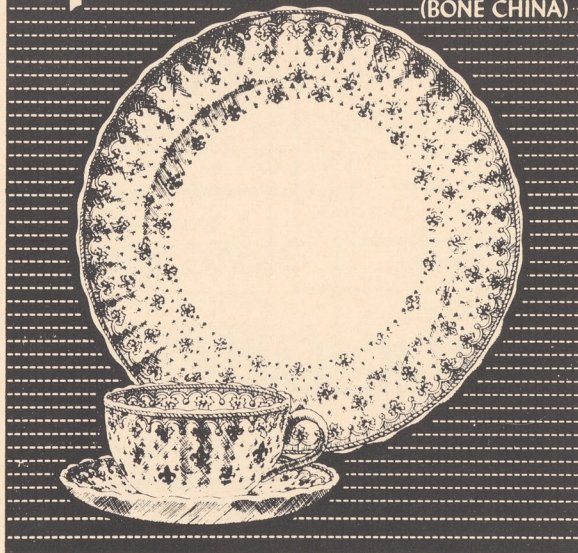

# Ass'n Joins Advisory Group

At the March 3 regular meeting of the Board of Directors it was unanimously carried that approval be given to the request of Supervisor Cozens that the Association participate in effecting the Organization of an Advisory Group in the Fifth Supervisorial District.

Mrs. Eugene Freeland and Mr. Alfred D. Hill appeared before the Board to request permission for the Red Cross to fly their flags in the Civic Center during the month of March. The Board's approval was granted. Also appearing before the Board was Mr. Lewis L. Lintner in regard to the activities of the Civil Defense Organization.

The Subdivision application of Nelda Challman of Portion of Lot 6, Block 27 was denied. Messrs. Biggers, Lintner and Manion wrote to the Board regarding this Subdivision.

It was moved, seconded and unanimously carried that the Subdivision application of Mesa del Rio Company of Portion of Block J, Map 1742 be approved. An easement agreement is to be filed in favor of the Association with the County granting a 5' easement along each property line to be set aside for sewer and/or water lines.

President Jenkins, on behalf of the Board, presented past Board Member Weddell with a Plaque thanking him for his services to the Community.

The Board referred to the Art Jury for its advice, the request of Mr. R. C. Francisco for additional Grading on his property described as Portion of Lot 1, Block 31.

It was voted that a refund of an Advanced Playing Privilege Card, Class "B," be granted to Mr. Lebedeff.

As of March 3 the status of Advanced Playing Privileges were "A" 178 cards, "B" 170 cards.

Secretary Smart presented the Gross Revenue for the Month of February, 1961 as follows:

# Riding Club Plants Area

Of interest to a great many Rancho residents is the news that the actual planting of the Rancho Riding Club area is in progress. In the interval between the time that the plans for landscaping of that area and actual planting took place a great deal of ground work had to be accomplished. The Riding Club spent in the neighborhood of \$1,000 before the actual planting could even begin. First the barranca along the east side of the stable and on down to the end of the property was cleaned out and bulldozed. Then barley seed was sown and disced in to hold the soil and keep it from washing when the rains came. The matter of drainage then had to be considered. During a heavy rain there is a terrific deluge of water that spreads over the Riding Club grounds from the hill just west of the property. They devised the plan of diverting the water through a shallow drainage ditch leading from Los Morros around the southwest end of the new stable and draining on into the barranca. Some of the old and unsightly corrals were moved to make way for the drainage ditch, and new ones were built on higher ground. They have laid a water line to accommodate the maintenance of the plantings at a cost of \$410. The whole planting program involves an expenditure of from \$1000 to \$1,500 or more. This simply cannot be accomplished in a short time as all the necessary funds are not in sight as yet. However, several unsolicited donations have helped to speed the planting program and are deeply appreciated by members of the Riding Club.

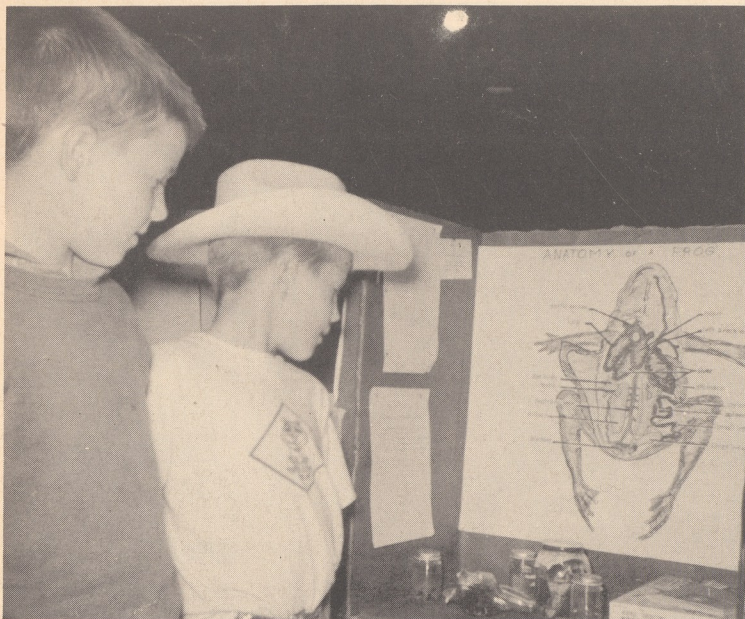
