John M. Wilson Jr., to construct a screened porch on portion of lot 2, block 12.

Herman Yaras to construct an addition, a storage room, on portion of lot 5, block 16.

Edward A. and Florence A. Day for covenant acceptance on lot 10, Loma Verdes acres, map 3058.

Directors Report

A new flagpole, complete with plaque, will be erected at the Old School building property in memory of the late John Megrew, First Lieutenant, United States Army. Approval was given to the memorial at the Nov. 6 meeting of the Board of Directors of the Rancho Santa Fe Association.

Appearing before the Board at the time of decision was the Lieutenant's father, George Megrew, who read a letter concerning his son from Gen. Douglas MacArthur, dated Oct. 6, 1945.

Paul Galleher heads the memorial committee and is assisted by Claude Welles. Anyone wishing to contribute toward the flagpole may make a contribution to either man.

Public Hearing

Prior to the meeting, a public hearing was held for the purpose of hearing discussion relative to the application of Harold A. Mosier and Wanda Axene to change the number of building sites of lot 98, map 2129, from one to two building sites.

At the meeting, approval was given to the Mosier-Axene application.

The Board also approved the opening of an account for the Association at the new Security First National Bank in Rancho Santa Fe, and the obtaining of a safety-deposit box in said bank.

Mme. Nancy Walker was reappointed to serve as trustee of the Richardson Memorial Fund for the period of one year, term to expire Dec. 19, 1960.

The first month they worked on Linea del Cielo; and the second month, of their own choosing, they cleaned Paseo Delicias up to the new Village Church, turning the corner on La Valle Plateada and going down it. This was so that all the roads surrounding the new church were in readiness for the dedication which took place in October.

In November, the Explorers started work on La Granada and on completion of that street turned their attention to the heavy project of cleaning Via de la Valle. It is expected that this will take them more than a month due to the bad conditions on the road and the large amount of debris.

Plans Approved For Richardson Memorial Park

Of much interest to the community is the news that plans for the George Richardson Memorial Park were presented to the Board of Directors of the Association with the approval of the Parks and Recreation Board at the Nov. 20 meeting.

Cost of construction is provided by the trustees of the George Richardson Memorial Fund, who developed the plans with the cooperation of the Boy Scout Council and Little League officials.

Work is underway with surveying and staking, the plans including a parking area and fence for the Little League Park. Open spaces will be retained for future development of play areas.

The entire development will proceed with complete cooperation between the Board of Trustees of the Richardson Memorial Fund and the Association Landscape Committee, Art Jury and Parks and Recreation Board. Mrs. Gifford Ewing will serve as the landscape and planting consultant.

Annual Christmas Decor Day Set

The Garden Club's annual day set aside for the making of Christmas decorations for hospitals is planned Dec. 16 at 10 a.m., in the clubhouse. Mrs. Hardy H. Kent is in charge of the project.

Everyone is urged to come that day, bringing a sandwich lunch and any baubles handy to decorate the wreaths and swags which will go to the Naval Hospital in San Diego and the Camp Pendleton Hospital.

A particularly welcome gesture is made by former Ranchoite, Mrs. Paul Avery, now of Squaw Valley. Mrs. Avery has organized a group of women in Squaw Valley to make wreaths for hospitals and last year sent to the local group 10 beautiful wreaths, with the promise of the same bountiful gift again this year.

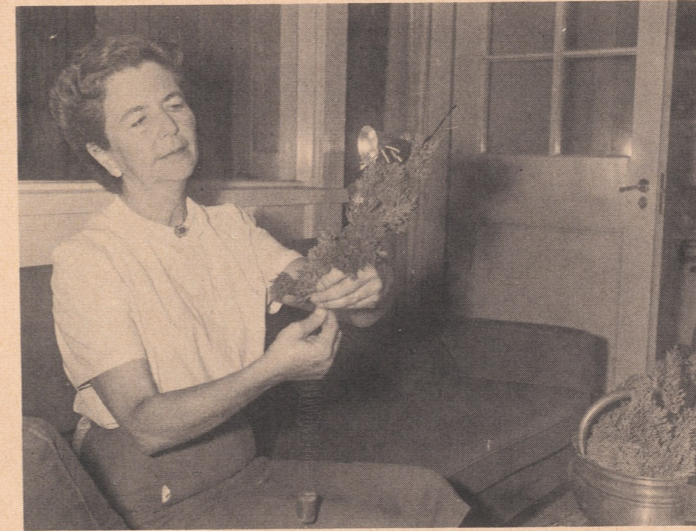
Garden Club members started

For Garden Club members and their children, "especially the children" says Mrs. Remington, the carol singing is planned for Dec. 20 at 7:30 p.m., in the Garden Clubhouse.

Early Ranchoites, reaching back into their memories at least 20 years, remember the carol sing as a Christmas party with gifts for the children — that was when the number of children on the Ranch numbered less than a dozen. In the late 1940's, Mildred Kreuder initiated the carol singing and Mrs. Remington has added a Christmas story.

This year, the story is to be an adaptation of Paul Gallico's "Ludmilla." Mrs. Remington will tell the story as well as accompany the carol singing.

This enthusiastic, white-haired woman, feels that the carol and story serve to remind both children and adults of the real significance of Christmas. She re-

members that during all her young years at her home in Burlington, Vt., that her father, Charles Allen, read Dickens' "Christmas Carol" each Christmas Eve, later her brother, Joseph Dana Allen taking over the pleasant task.

The Remingtons came to Rancho Santa Fe from Philadelphia to be near the Bishop's sister, Mrs. Walter Mitchell, and on her recommendation bought their present home by telephone. And they have not regretted it.

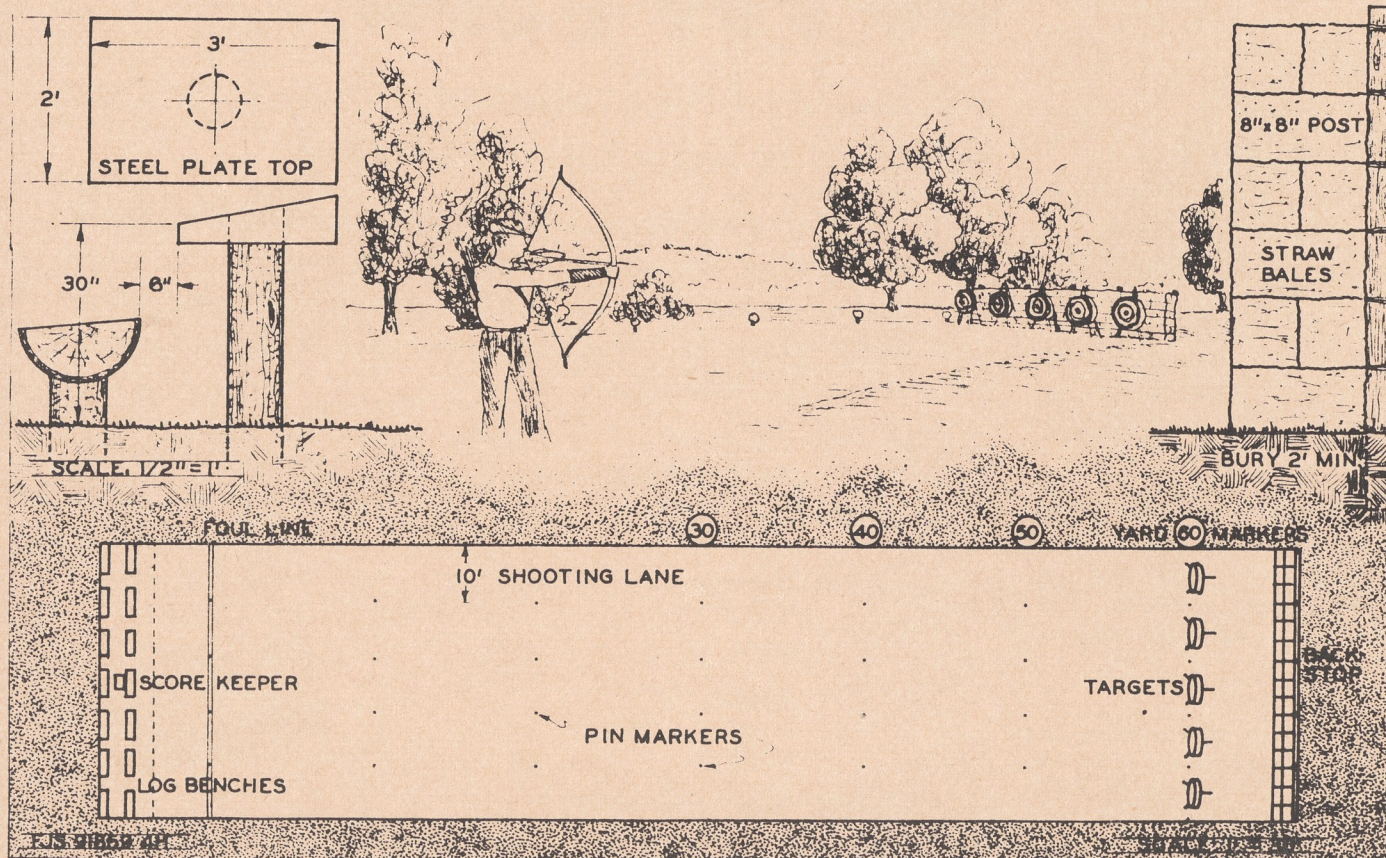
GEORGE RICHARDSON MEMORIAL PARK PLANS PRESENTED TO RSF ASSOCIATION DIRECTORS



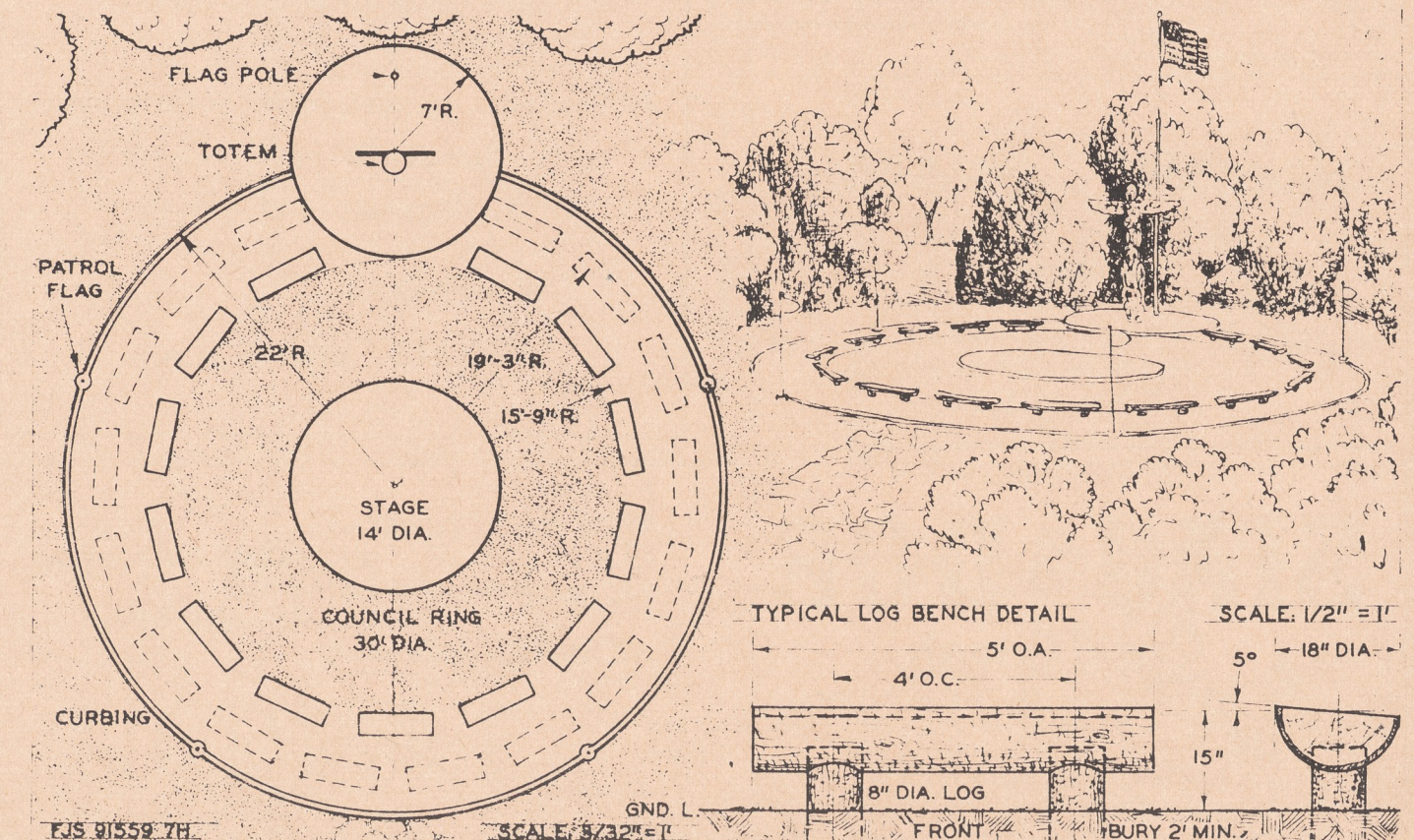
PARK SITE DEVELOPMENT PLOT PLAN

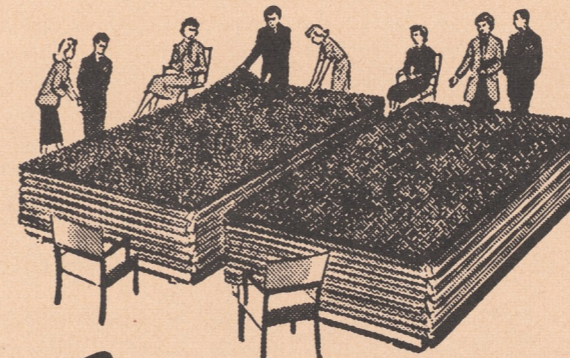

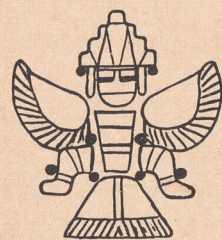

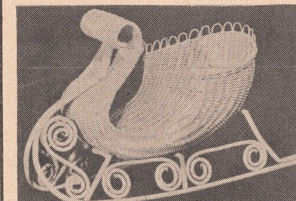
