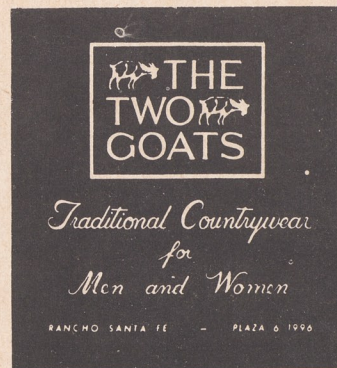
# Record Turnout For Golf Lessons

# Saving of Trees Community Effort

An SOS is going out to Rancho Santa Fe residents to water their eucalyptus trees, as the worst dry siege in history continues to take its toll of the Ranch's famous groves.

Spearheading efforts to save the Ranch's trees is the Beautification Committee of the Rancho Santa Fe Garden Club. Funds raised for the Beautification project at the time of the House and Garden Tour and earmarked for Civic Beautification are being used by the committee in its own program of watering.

Besides the loss of the community's attractive setting if the trees die, present fire hazards can hardly be overestimated. Dead and dying trees and tinder dry underbrush are a major fire hazard while it is a fact that green stands of trees are an effective fire break.

To assist residents in this emergency, the Committee, in cooperation with the Fire Department and the Santa Fe Irrigation District, is working on plans for rented or loaned equipment which can be passed from resident to resident. Details may be obtained by calling the Fire Department, PL 6-1522.

Using its own funds, the Committee has underwritten a crash

program to save trees along Linea del Cielo. Selecting this road as being in the most dire need, the Committee began in July a program of watering by tanker truck, and will continue the project at least through August and September. The truck, loaned by the Fire Department, has a capacity of 1400 gallons per load and is filled repeatedly during each day. The Committee, which pays the cost of the water and the driver's salary, would welcome financial contributions from those interested in this emergency project.

Approval for the Linea del Cielo project came from Chauncy Jerabek, San Diego tree authority who has had years of experience with the eucalyptus trees in Balboa Park. Mr. Jerabek felt that the Committee's procedure, if carried on until January or until the rains come, is very worth while and profitable, and the only thing that can save many of the trees. Among his suggestions for both the Committee's and private watering was that after the initial sprinkling, when the ground is soft, it should be augered so that the water will penetrate. He also said that once watering is started, it must be continued - as the shock of subsequently withdrawing it might prove fatal to the tree.

Another suggestion was that dead or dying trees be chopped down to within a foot of the ground. Then, if watered, the tree will sprout again.

Residents planning large-scale irrigations are asked to call the Irrigation District office to schedule the times they need water (to prevent a sudden drain of pipeline and pumping capacity).

Saving the trees has been taken on as an emergency project of the Beautification Committee, whose next major project is to complete the landscaping at the Rancho Santa Fe Elementary school and surround the adjacent parking area with a harmonizing shrubbery border. # FIRE DEPARTMENT SERVES COMMUNITY IN MANY AND VARIED WAYS

This month the Bulletin takes pleasure in giving recognition to the many services and contributions to the Community being made by the Rancho Santa Fe Fire Department.

The Rancho Santa Fe Fire Department was formed by an order adopted by the San Diego County Board of Supervisors on Oct. 14, 1946, and is legally organized under the Local Fire District Law of the State of California.

The Fire District covers an area of approximately thirteen and one half square miles, has 700 residences and an estimated pop-

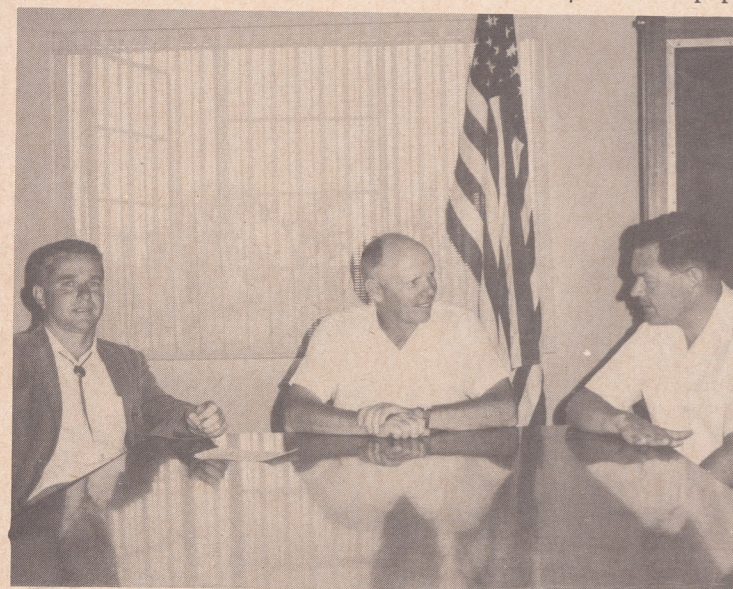


Fireman Crane at Operations Center.

ulation of 2,500. Secured and unsecured valuation for the year 1960-1961 was \$9,202,620.00 and \$160,810.00 respectively, the tax rate was .44 cents.

The Department operates on a call - volunteer basis the permanent staff consisting of Chief and two firemen. The Chief is on a continuous duty system while the firemen operate a 24 hour tour of duty alternately. Attached to the Department are 18 volunteers with drills and instruction taking place each Monday evening. The Fire Department takes this opportunity to thank the Rancho Santa Fe Association and Commissioner Grisct for allow-

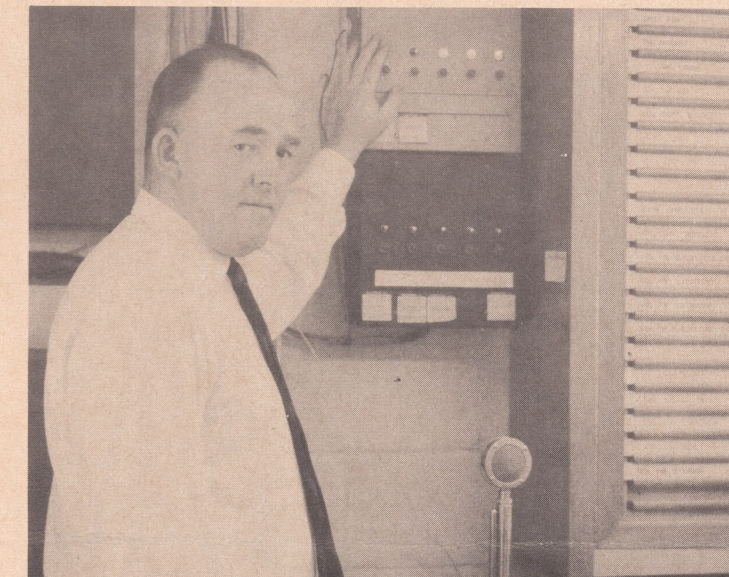
Attached to the Department are five emergency vehicles; 1 750 gallon per minute pumper; 1 500 gpm pumper; 1 tank truck of 1500 gallons capacity equipped with portable pump; 1 1000 gpm Civil Defense pumper; and 1 Pick-up Truck and Trailer.

The 750 gpm pumper was bought by the Department in com-

pliance with a recommendation made by the National Board of Fire Underwriters in 1953. The purchase of the pumper was a material factor in improving the fire protection classification in the commercial area. The tank truck and pick-up were purchased through the State Educational Agency for Surplus Property at a cost of \$200.00 and \$95.00 respectively and adapted for use by Department personnel.

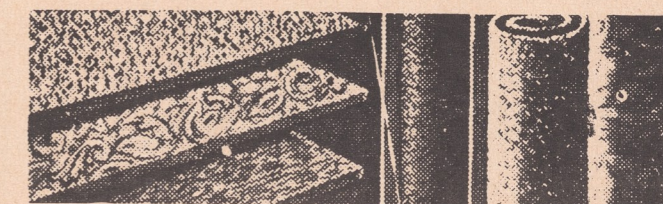

emergency calls and Department business covered a distance of 5,265 miles, pumped for 134 hours, used 1,095.6 gallons of gas and 43 quarts of oil.

Although not as spectacular as extinguishing a fire the work of prevention or at least limiting the effect is just as important.

During the year the Fire Department has eliminated 69 potential fire hazards.

Fire Drills were regularly carried out at the Elementary School and the results recorded.


145 burning permits were issued during the year. Fire prevention inspections and Company pre-fire planning inspections have been carried out from time to time.

The total number of fire alarms responded to by the Department during the year was 44. Casualty and first aid calls amounted to 23.

Special Service calls totaled 119 calls. Also 58 calls for the Sheriff's Department and the Highway Patrol were transmitted to the appropriate departments.

Forestry. Mutual aid pacts have also been signed with all the Fire Districts in North San Diego County.

Firemen Crane and Fireman Durant in their off duty hours during the past year have completed 3 units and 6 units respectively of satisfactory work in Fire Science subjects at Palomar College. This Fire Science program is designed to offer practical technical instruction for firemen and to meet the needs of the various problems encountered in the fire fighting profession.

Chief Fox has qualified in obtaining an Adult Teaching Credential and a Class D Vocational Credential which qualifies him to teach Fire Science subjects at Palomar College and San Diego City College.

During the past year Chief Fox gave five courses in First Aid to the injured. These courses were offered in this area. The courses were for adults and were held under the auspices of the American Red Cross. The Department also gave instruction in artificial respiration to the Back Yard Swim classes.

Again this year the Fire Department served as a collecting agency for the "Toys for Tots" campaign sponsored areawide by the Marine Corps.
