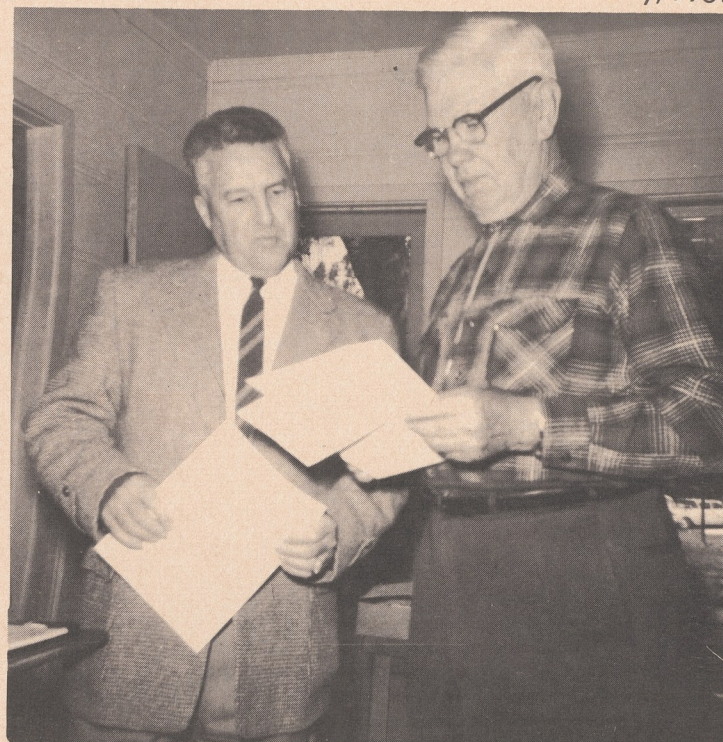

### Comm. Forms Court Rules

The following is an excerpt from a recent letter sent by the Association to Miss Billie Yorke, La Jolla, regarding the use of the tennis courts. The plan was recommended by the Association Tennis Committee.

"In accordance with present planning, there is to be a charge to Association Members beginning July 1, 1961. At that time and subject to the approval of the Association Board of Directors, the Tennis Committee will place in effect Rules and Regulations for the use of the courts. No doubt such use will be limited to Association Members, their families and their guests.

We will be pleased to have you serve as a tennis instructor during the summer of 1961, subject to the Rules and Regulations as may be set forth from time to time. Instruction on the courts is to be limited to week days only, never on Saturdays, Sundays or Holidays; and must be limited to one court only so as not to interfere with use of the other courts.

In order to effect necessary control of the use of the courts, please maintain and furnish the Association office with an accurate record of the pupils instructed on the forms provided by this office. Pupils are to be limited to Association Members, their families and their guests."

## DR. LIEB DONATES NEW SCRIPPS CLINIC ADD'N

Dr. Clarence William Lieb, a well known resident of the Ranch, has donated funds for a new amphitheater at Scripps Clinic and Research Foundation, which is to be located in the Research Laboratory Building that is presently under construction. Vice Admiral Wilder D. Baker, USN Ret., Chairman of the Board of Trustees made this announcement in La Jolla recently.

Dr. Lieb, a noted gastroenterologist and author, is a native of Wisconsin. He was educated at Colorado College and Harvard Medical School, graduating from the latter in 1913.

In 1928-29 Dr. Lieb was Clinical Supervisor of the Stefansson Nutrition Studies conducted by the Russell Sage Institute of Pathology, Bellevue Hospital, affiliated with the Medical College of Cornell University. His various studies in the field of nutrition took him to South America in 1936 to do research on the diets of High Andean Indians. He was also the organizer and director of the Research Institute of the American Tobacco Company.

In 1937 he co-founded the Religio - Psychiatric Clinic with Norman Vincent Peale and Dr. Smiley Blanton. From 1937 until the present he has served as

Vice-President of the American Foundation of Religion and Psychiatry of New York City.

Before he retired in 1939, he published two books, "Eat, Drink and Be Healthy," and "Eat, Drink and Be Slender." Since his retirement he has published three books, "Safer Smoking," "Why Let Smoking Kill You," and "Outwitting Your Years." He is also the author of many magazine articles.

He is a member of the New York State Medical Society, New York Academy of Medicine, American Medical Association, American Gastroenterological Society, American College of Physicians, Harvard Medical Society and the Pan American Medical Society.

Dr. and Mrs. Lieb have lived in Rancho Santa Fe since 1942. They have three daughters and a son.

The new Research Laboratory Building being erected at Scripps Clinic will expand the area for basic research in the medical sciences by providing space for a new Division of Experimental Pathology. The amphitheater will occupy part of the first floor and will seat 100 persons. It will become known as the Lieb Amphitheater.

# Humane Society Launches Drive

Members of the Rancho-Coastal Humane Society began a drive for funds during April. General Chairman of the Drive is the Rev. Chester L. Tolson of Rancho Santa Fe. Special Gifts Chairman is Cecil G. Gray, also of the Ranch. Area chairman working for the success of the drive are Newton Sterne, Cardiff, Encinitas, Leucadia; Mrs. Margaret B. Dixon assisted by Col. Waldron J. Cheyney, Del Mar; Harry Kleist assisted by Miss Mary Bill, Rancho Santa Fe; and G. William Jacox, Solana Beach.

The Rancho-Coastal Humane Society began as a volunteer project by individual citizens, in much the same fashion as thousands of other Humane Societies the world over. The work of these individuals in aiding animals in distress has steadily grown for three years. Other residents of the area began to help. As the requests increased for aid to lost, injured or abused animals, funds were needed and a few people have been voluntarily paying for the care of animals found in distress. Last year the Escondido Humane Society was forced to withdraw its program from this area and the six San Dieguito communities

were left without help. Then the need grew by leaps and bounds.

The Rancho-Coastal Humane Society has been founded as a legally approved incorporated group for public service, conforming in all respects to State and County requirements. Twenty residents of the San Dieguito area were officially approved as Founding Members, and have elected from among their number a board of twelve trustees. With funds to be accumulated from donations, the Society is purchasing a suitable piece of property for the proposed Shelter, a location approved by the Board of Supervisors, the Chief Administrator and the County Planning Commission. The need for the Shelter is too acute to delay longer in its conjunction. With the Shelter Fund Drive now in progress it will be possible for the Rancho-Coastal Humane Society to erect this facility and thereby provide the six communities this much needed service.

A fund of \$50,000 is needed for the building and equipment to be erected in Encinitas. The

# Reward Offered For Info

All the members of the Board of Directors of the Rancho Santa Fe Association were present for the regular meeting held on Friday, April 7, 1961.

Before the regular meeting was convened, a Public Hearing was held for the purpose of hearing any discussion or objections relative to the Petition to George J. and Mary L. It was moved, seconded and unanimously carried that the Association offer \$100 reward for information leading to the arrest and conviction of any person or persons willfully damaging or removing trees, signs or shrubs within the confines of Rancho Santa Fe.

It was moved, seconded and unanimously carried that R. M. Clotfelter, Carl Muench, Raymond Gordon and Dr. Victor Stark be appointed to serve,

with William Schofield Chairman, on the County Government Advisory Committee.

It was moved, seconded and unanimously carried that the Association purchase 20 electric Carts. The Board referred the matter back to the Golf Course Committee for further consideration of the model Cart to be purchased.

The Board recessed at 12:18 p.m. and reconvened at 1:45 p.m.

Mr. Cohu was born in New York City in 1895. He was graduated from Princeton University in 1917 and served as an Ensign, USNRF, during World War I. He was a member of the Board of Directors of TWA from 1933 to April, 1954, and served as its president from April, 1947, until his election as president of Convair in June, 1948. He was one of the founders of Northrop Aircraft, where he served as Board Chairman and General Manager from 1939 until his election to the presidency of TWA in 1947.

Mr. Cohu was a member of the Board and Executive Committee of General Dynamics Corporation from April, 1954, though 1957 and served as president and a member of the Board of Convair (then Consolidated Vultee Aircraft, Inc.) between June, 1948 and March, 1952.
