

HOLY ROD CATHLOTIC  
CEMETERY

Location: Holy Rod is located at the corner of Church Street and Washington Ave. in Glendale, Ohio.

History: Holy Rod was a burying grounds for the Parish of St. Gabriel Catholic Church of Glendale. The cemetery filled up by the time Oak Hill Cemetery had proven itself sound for investment. About 1920 the people of St. Gabriel Parish started burying their dead in the Cathlotic Section of Oak Hill Cemetery. Some families moved the dead members of their family to the new lots in Oak Hill from Holy Rod. Others left the dead buried. From app. 1930 to 1970 stones disappeared from the old cemetery. By 1970 only the three stones which remain today (1982) were to be seen.

When the writer was a little boy the cemetery was filled with stones.

1. A large Monument with the name J. Logan on the base of the stone's south side.

West Side:
