  - Tell us as much as you know about previous owners or occupants. Do you know the names of the original occupants? We are ORIGINAL owners + Built The house on the spot of Miss Mary Johnston's Woodlands - House design based on the Ashley House in Historic Deerfield, Ma. Built several years before 1733
  - Tell us as much as you know about when the house was built and any significant changes over the years. Do you know the name of the builder? started building current home in middle of 1978 and moved in 1982 - Feb 28<sup>th</sup>. No changes since then. Thomas Wiggers was first architect. Bruce Tulley was starting builder but was replaced - two very young men (early 20's) built the house after spending time measuring + drawing original home in Deerfield
  - Do you have pictures of your house or occupants that you would give to us or let us copy? yes - I (ARLYN Johnson) went to Stoddard N.H to buy the pine boards, had Al Shipped to Glendale where wood was milled, shaped, routed by Bill Wassler and Kevin Jansen, in the living room with our tools, etc. Wood is pegged not bolted
  - Do you have any maps, drawings, or records about the history of your house? In place - of course some concessions had to be made to accommodate Kitchen, Baths etc but we made every effort to copy original details
  - What interesting events have happened at your house? Is there a link with other Glendale residents or organizations? many - my mother's second wedding when she was 85 - All of her great grandchildren were her witnesses - 4 <sup>great</sup> granddaughters were brides <sup>maids</sup> ~~maides~~ 2 to 4 years old - 3 great grand sons 4-7 years were in charge of candles, etc. and Fast Tasting Food + wedding cake
