## Tell Us About Your House!!

For 30 years Glendale Heritage Preservation has kept records on many of the historic homes in Glendale. Research in the 1970's on 59 pivotal structures lead directly to recognition of the Glendale Historic District by the National Park Service. Now GHP would like to expand its archives to include information about all the homes in Glendale.

Please tell us as much as you can about the history of your house so we can preserve this information for future generations. In 100 years, even a new house today will be historic.

Suggested information:

1. • Your house address  
*50 North Lake Avenue  
Glendale, OH 45246*
2. • Names of persons currently living at this address. How long?  
*Edmund Carl Ansorg, III and Penn Ansorg \**  
*Almost twenty-three years*  
*\* (Two now grown children Edmund Cary and Allen Carl, grew up in the house.)*
3. • Tell us as much as you know about previous owners or occupants. Do you know the names of the original occupants?  
*The previous owners were Martin and Bea Moeggenberg. They had four sons. Martin Moeggenberg told us he built the house. He and his family were the original occupants.*
4. • Tell us as much as you know about when the house was built and any significant changes over the years. Do you know the name of the builder?  
*Hamilton County auditor's records indicate the house was built in 1954. Again, Martin Moeggenberg, a carpenter, built it. I continued on other side.*
5. • Do you have pictures of your house or occupants that you would give to us or let us copy?  
*Yes - enclosed.*
6. • Do you have any maps, drawings, or records about the history of your house?  
*Yes - enclosed*
7. • What interesting events have happened at your house? Is there a link with other Glendale residents or organizations?  
*Apparently, Bea Moeggenberg grew up in the house currently owned by Nancy Dubich, 32 North Lake. When Bea and Martin married, they purchased the back portion (facing N. Lake) of two lots (over)*
