Also on these grounds are the carriage house, well down to us and the Dr. Louis Brockmeier house at 150 E. Fountain.

Built in 1978 by Viox - When we purchased the house in 2003, we renovated - new Architect - Addison Clipson kitchen + added a room with screened-in porch under it.
