- Do you have pictures of your house or occupants that you would give to us or let us copy?
yes, I have photos of the house before the rehabilitation and addition.
- Do you have any maps, drawings, or records about the history of your house?
yes, I have 1998 drawings.
- What interesting events have happened at your house? Is there a link with other Glendale residents or organizations?
