

Information and Suggestions as to Sources of Information on
"EDUCATION IN GLENDALE"

THE PUBLIC SCHOOL

Among the data on these sheets are certain facts obtained by me from Mr William B. Gould of Glendale and Atlanta, Georgia. He has an excellent memory and an orderly mind, with a penchant for local history of this region. From early years he has kept a journal and scrapbooks. In these latter he has preserved clippings from Cincinnati papers of matter pertaining to this region, not only of current events but of historical reminiscences telling of earlier days.

Fortunately when he quotes a Cincinnati paper he gives the date of the issue, so if one wishes to check the item he can go to the Public Library and look over the newspaper files preserved there.

In making these notes, when I am citing Mr Gould's records the initials W.B.G. make plain I am indebted to him for the items.

The first school in what now is Glendale was a Township School. The building was frame. Its exact location cannot be determined nor the teachers of the early days identified. W.B.G. Article 5/30/1897 covers?

The Glendale School was organized after the incorporation of the village in 1855. W.B.G.

I am told this building was on or near the seat of the present school and stood flush with the pavement.

W.B.G. states that Mr Ed Albright has, or had, a picture of that building.

Some of the Superintendents have been as follows. (I do not know their order.) Tyler, McClure, Dean, Giauque, Foster, Chapin, Wood, Schwei-kart, Burr, Glade. Everett, Blake.

(Charles Dean, son of a former Superintendent, is a well known newspaper man, and perhaps can tell what years his father served.)

Mr Foster lives at Foster's Crossing and data of his time can be gotten from him.

John C. Chapin's address is 3657 Shaker Heights, Ohio. He still teaches.

Carey C. Wood, took his degree of Ph.D. at the U.C. He is Professor of Psychology at the University of Akron, Akron Ohio.

Samuel Angie Burr Ph.D. is Superintendent of Public Schools, Newcastle, Delaware.

Mr Schweikart is teaching in Hamilton, Ohio

W.B.G. states the Public School building was erected before the Civil War, and was remodeled in 1875.

He states that ground was broken for the present building, 8/19/1899. The corner stone was laid 6/2/1900. The building was dedicated 1/12/1901.

W.B.G. states that Mr Giauque was Principal in 1869. "Enquirer" 1/23/1902. Also that Mr Blake was Principal in 1886. Also that he was followed by Charles F. Dean in 1887, and resigned in 1895.

W.B.G. quotes several times from an article by "One of the Rovers." One date of such a paper was 6/7/1896.
