Suggested information:

- Your house address *50 North Lake Ave.*
- Names of persons currently living at this address. How long?

- Tell us as much as you know about the previous owners or occupants. Do you know the names of the original occupants? *Supposedly our lot was sold from the one behind, on Coral, in the 1950's to a contractor who built this house + raised family. Then a 1970's The Anser's bought it + raised their family. Then us.*
- Tell us as much as you know about when the house was built and any significant changes over the years. Do you know the name of the builder?
~ 1952 - 1954 was a contractor who built + lived in it.

- Do you have pictures of your house or occupants that you would give to us or let us scan? *basement stairs moved.*

- Do you have any maps, drawings, or records about the history of your house?
