Before the Revolution our ~~business~~ mail was a great
business. In 1775 a shilling & a penny were charged for carrying
200 to 300 miles. Riders employed for every 25 to 30 miles
3 times a week on the regular job - road from Salisbury Mass
to Savannah Georgia. Off the road a carrier had to be
supplied by the community wanting to send. One rider
stipulated at \$16 in cash for a quarter or half a bushel of rye
or 3 lbs of Indian corn for 3 mos. from each settlement
The riders however on the South "Open the gate to the King's Post."
They took a tremendous oath, swearing by the Everlasting God
to carry the mail safely.

First complimentary salute fired (17 guns) as Washington
went on board the British ship to discuss treaty peace with
Mr. Jay Carleton.

Nov. 1783 - 3 days. played cards during that time.

Paris among the early settlers to leave the woods.
Orange = Aurangie in Holo.

James Livingston de Vray (15th of April 1839) arrived
at Tappan - bought the land from Indians.

1783. the 14th passed the Annetas
under Sheriff settlement (Van Wagoner) buying road
Cornwall's house. 134 years old near Alpine.

Indians. British first station of them from 1778 to 1783. Total 3400
to the flag. The old house of the Perry Marches. Mollie's brother
