

FOOTBALL HIGHLIGHTS

The first game of the season the Lions fielded a team with little experience but with plenty of fight. As the record shows, they improved rapidly with age, becoming one of the strongest teams in North Iowa and co-champions of the North Central Conference. The line, although almost always outweighed, was aggressive and very rugged. The defensive record of the Lions proves the ability of the linemen to stop the opposition's running attack. The center, Ron Petersen, and the two guards, Jack Roseland and Veryle Henriksen, made all-state selections. The backfield had unusual depth in reserve strength, featuring speed and a superb passing attack, completing 40 per cent of their tosses during the season's schedule. Right halfback, Bob Replogle, received an all-state selection for his fine playing. The combination of a hard-charging line and an alert secondary allowed the opposition to complete only 17 passes all year while the gold-shirted Lions nabbed 18 interceptions. Fine coaching, excellent teamwork, and plenty of hard work enabled Clear Lake to pile up 212 points to their opponent's 20. The two student managers, Lawrence Fell and Jerry Scott, greatly assisted the team in their successful season.

The fine coaching job of Mr. Heston and Mr. Banning allowed the team to outplay potentially more powerful teams during the season. The record of 8 wins and 1 loss was highlighted by handing Algona their only defeat of the season, 25-6.

BASKETBALL HIGHLIGHTS

The Clear Lake Lions are again the champions of the North Central Conference, making the second year in succession. The Lions boast a record of 10 wins and no losses in a very evenly matched conference; usually each team in the conference loses at least one or two games.

Clear Lake started out with a big roar by defeating Ventura 77-31 but were checked by Forest City in the next game, 56-45. After some hard practices, the Lions started on their 13 game winning streak, which included an over night trip to Cedar Falls. The Lions encountered trouble with Algona in the Conference Tournament played at Webster City. After winning a close 37-36 game from Iowa Falls at home, they dropped a 42-38 game to Algona.

There were some very fine ball games this year, especially the one pointers; but no one knows when his number is up and all good teams have to lose some time. Clear Lake discovered this in the Sectional Tournament when they were beaten by St. Joseph, 40-36. The Lions ended the season with a fine 17-4 record, having scored 1008 points to their opponents 752, averaging a 48-point game to their opponent's average of 35.8.




During the past year, the council has had charge of the assembly programs and other school activities.








Following the game, a short program in the auditorium featuring the skit, "The Lamp Went Out," and a dance in the gym were given in honor of the alumni.
