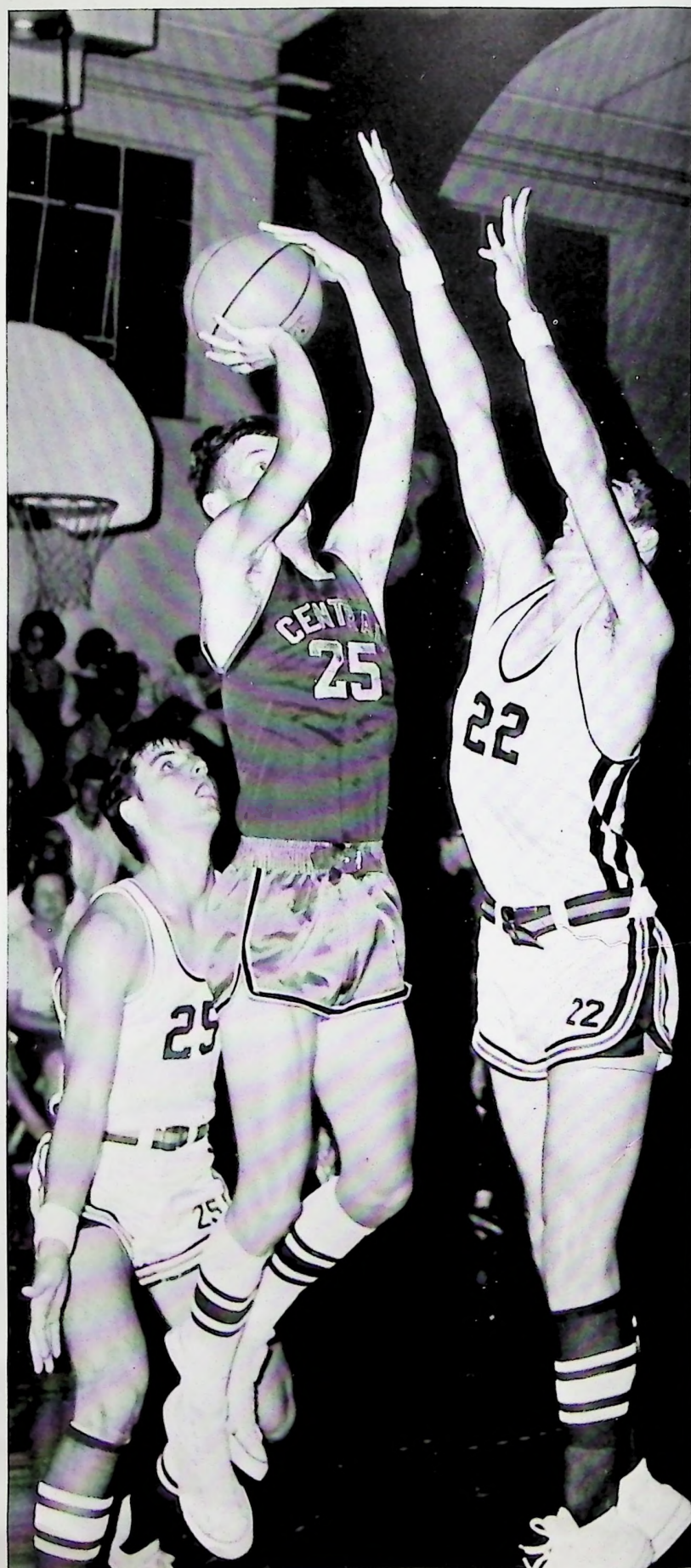

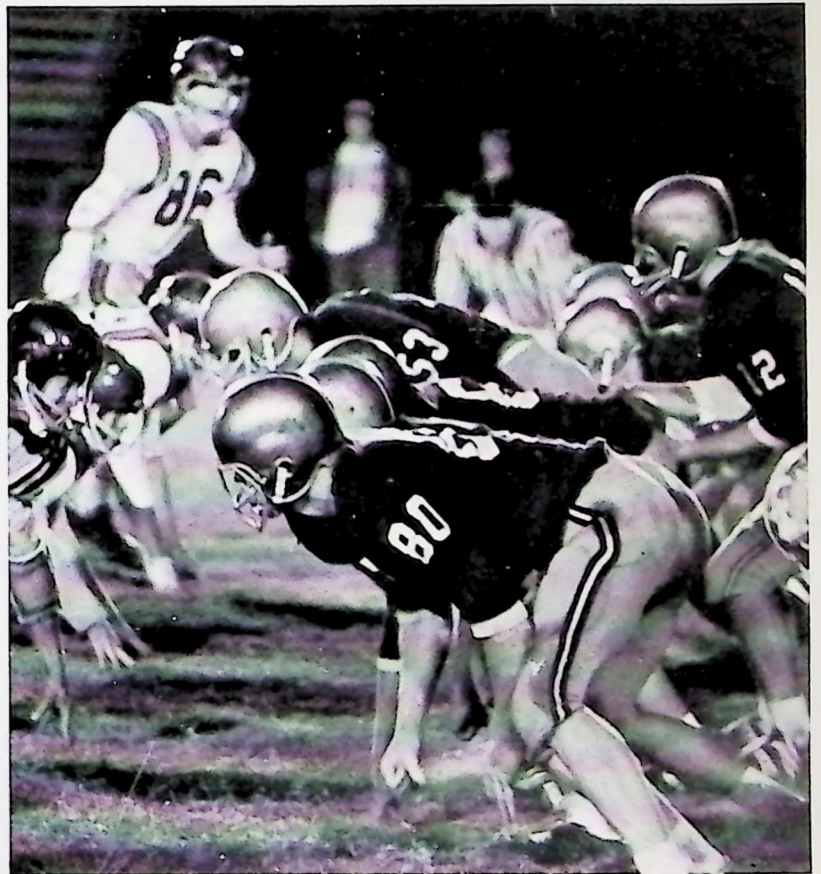

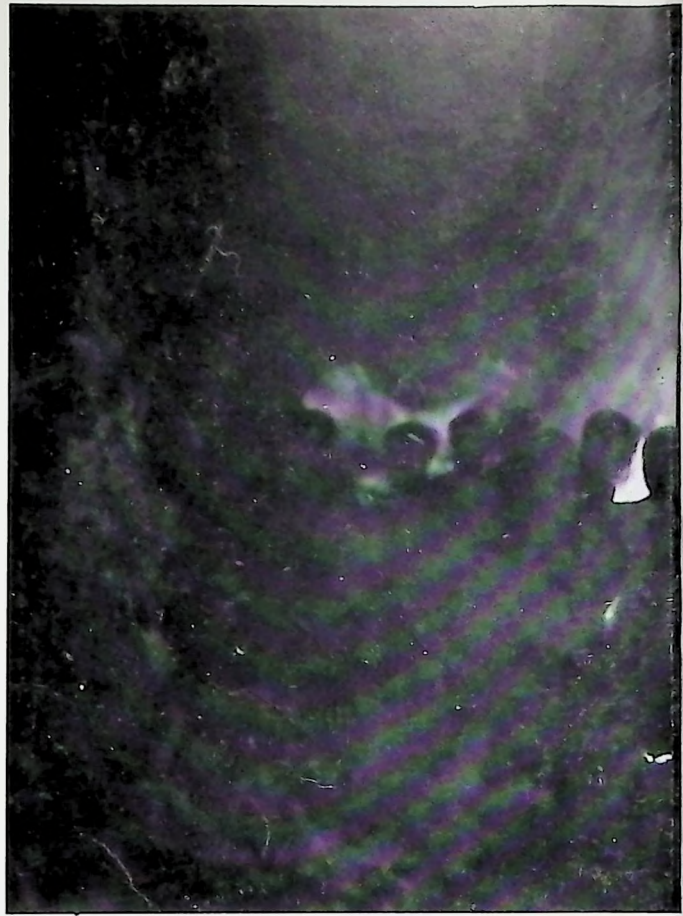

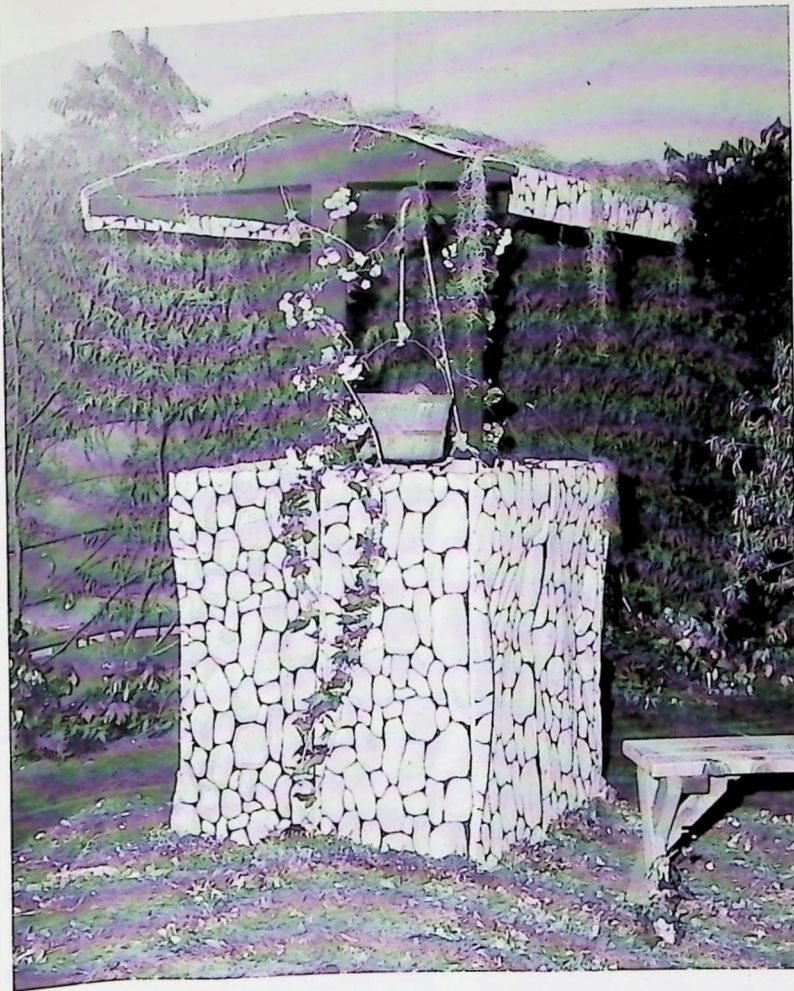
Fantasyland Reigns At Junior-Senior

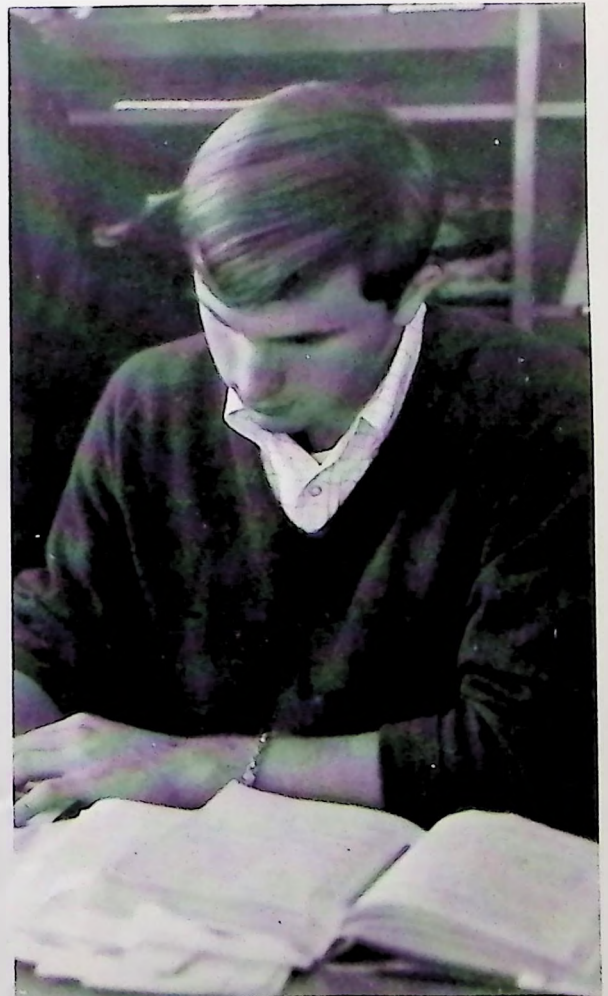
Senior Superlatives

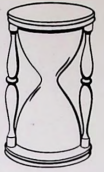

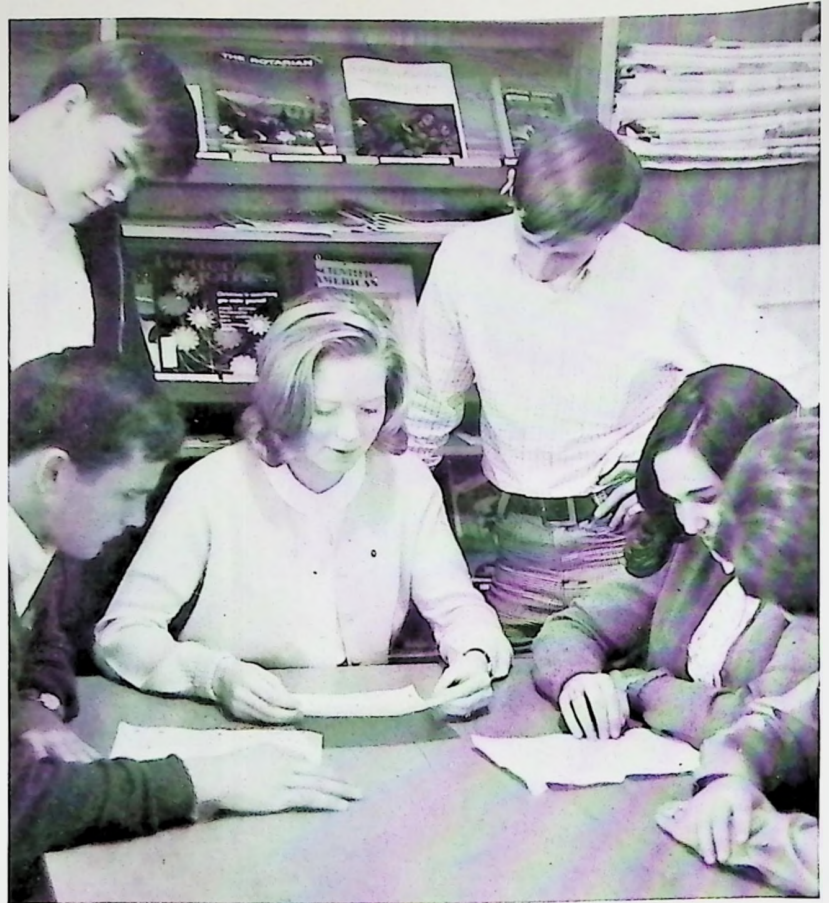


Presidents Club Leads Central's Student Body

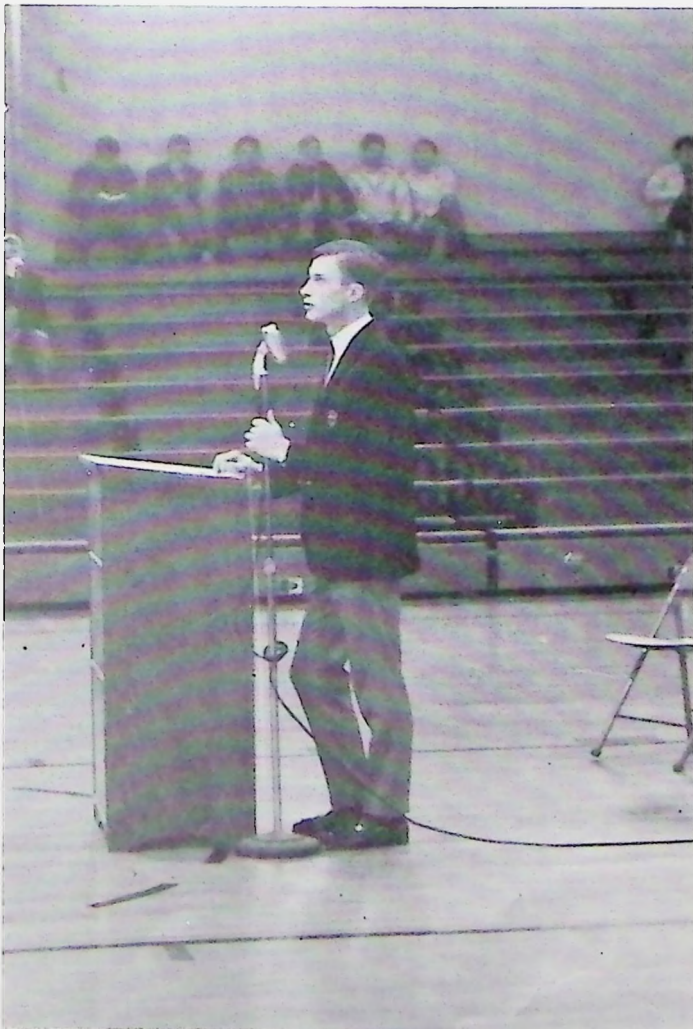

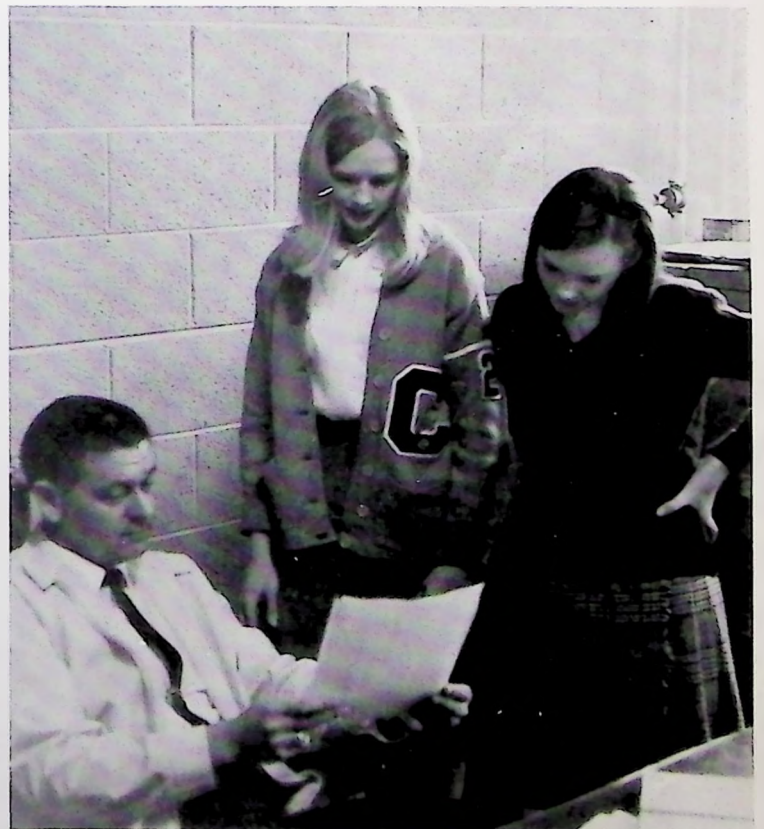

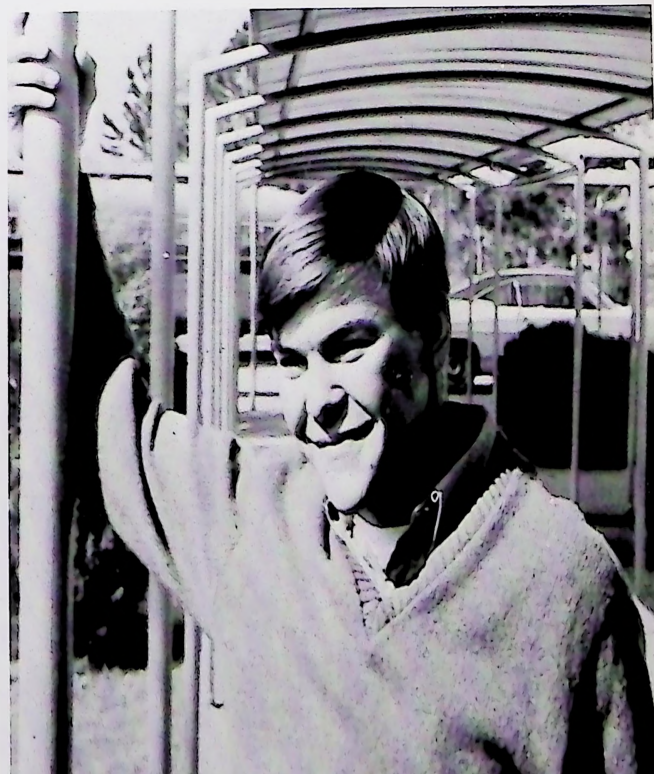

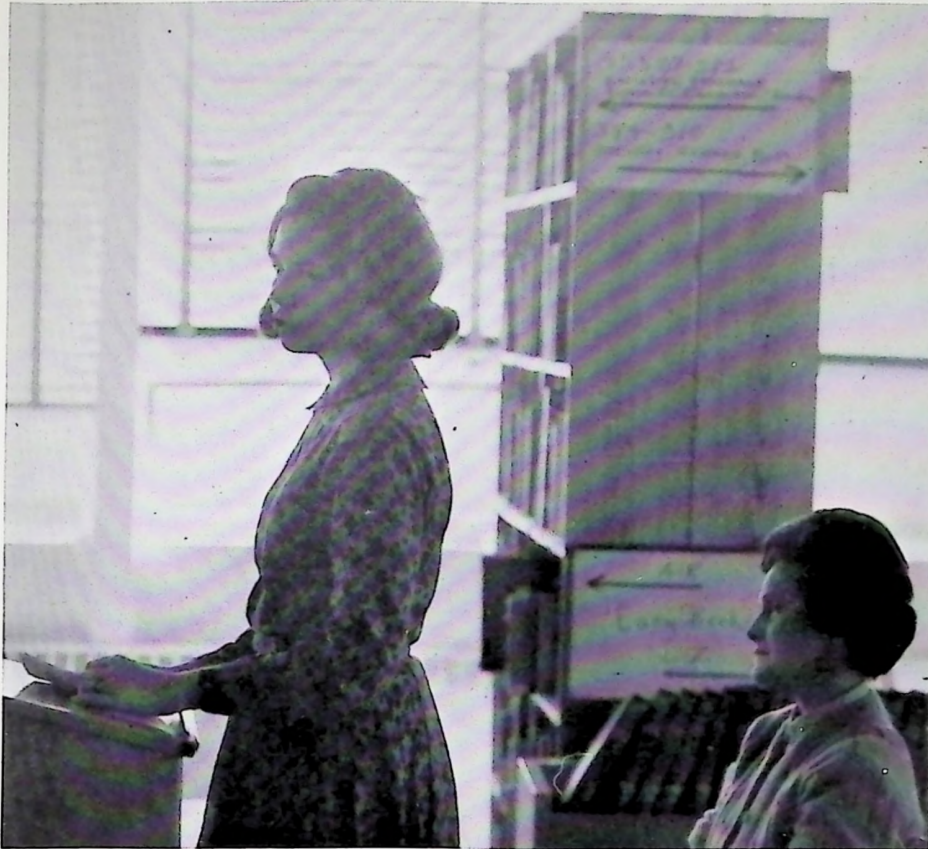

Chi Sigma Tri-Hi-Y Sponsors Joint Meeting

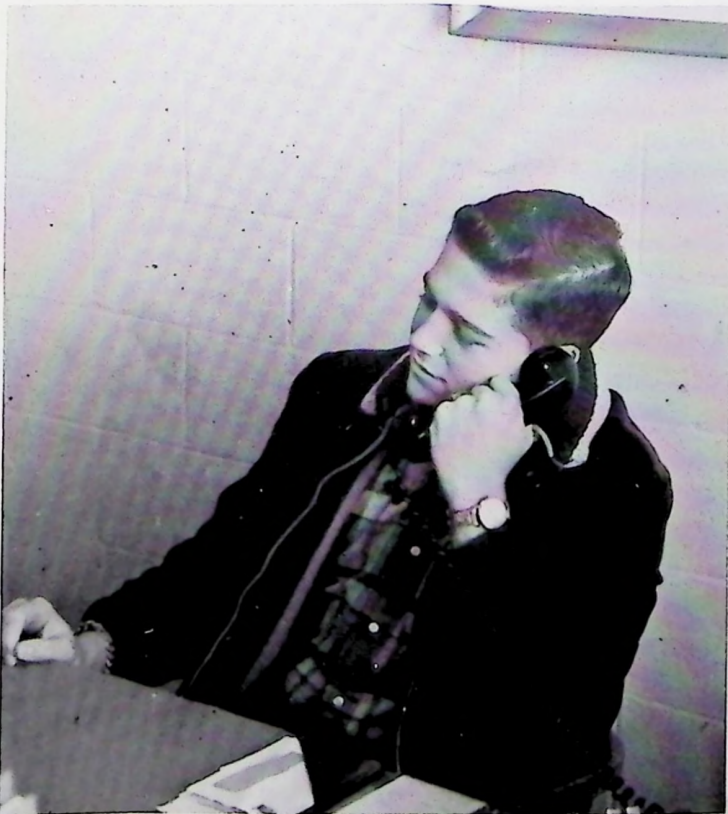

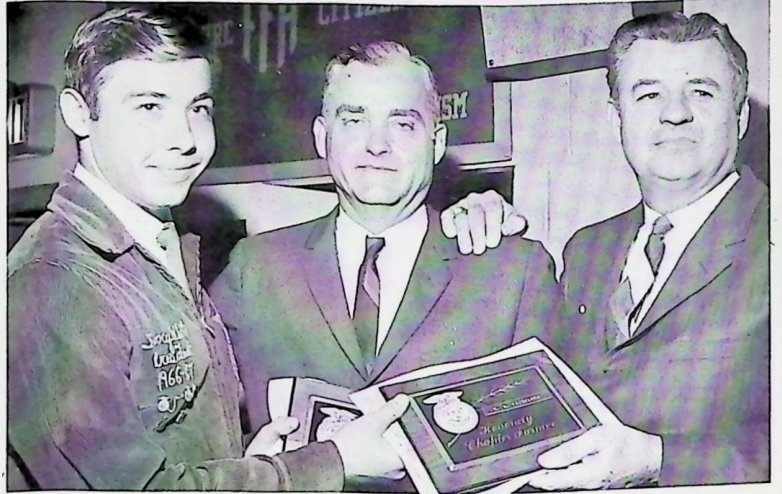

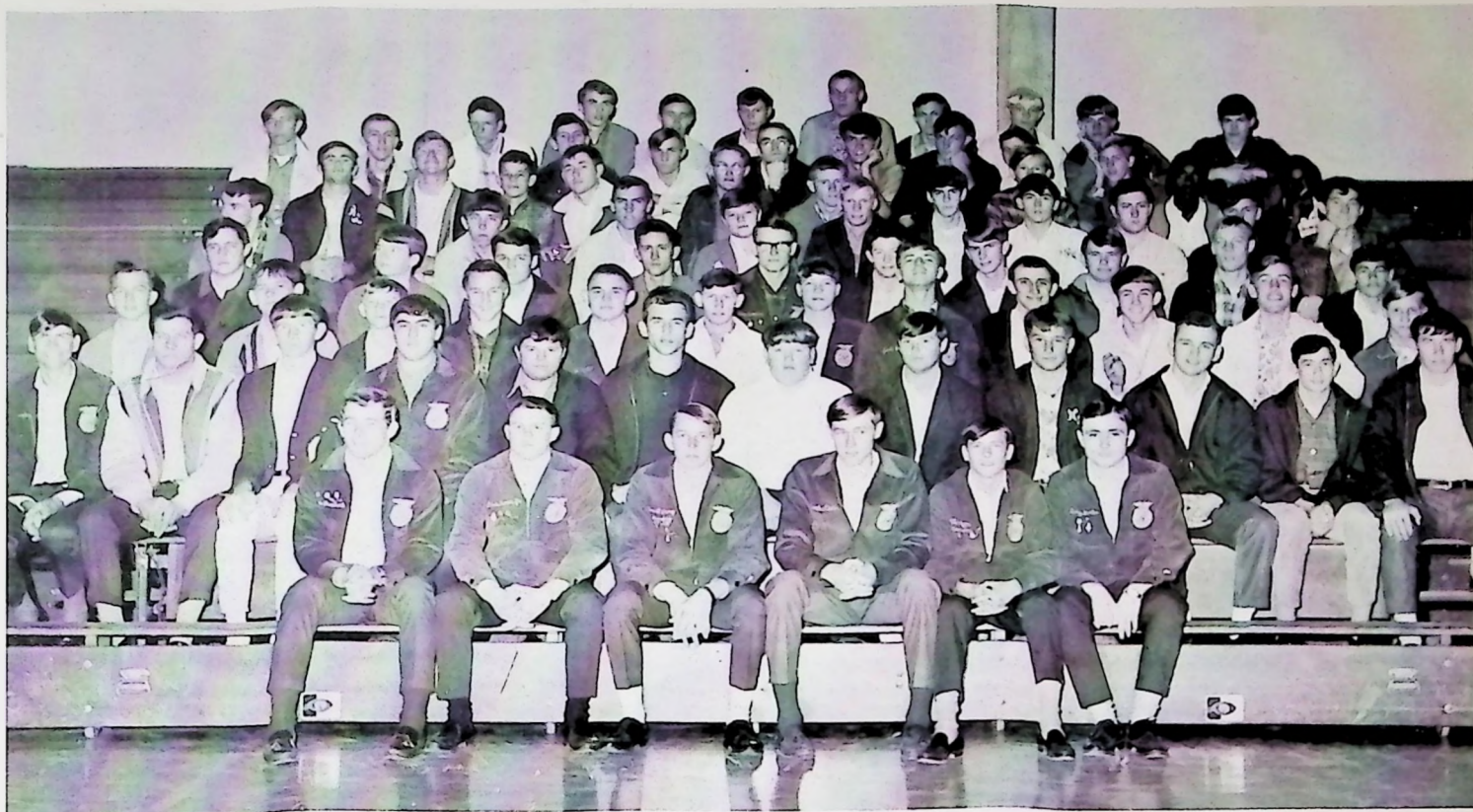

The members have been selling jinx dolls as a money making project. The dolls are made in the colors of the rival school to help promote school spirit.

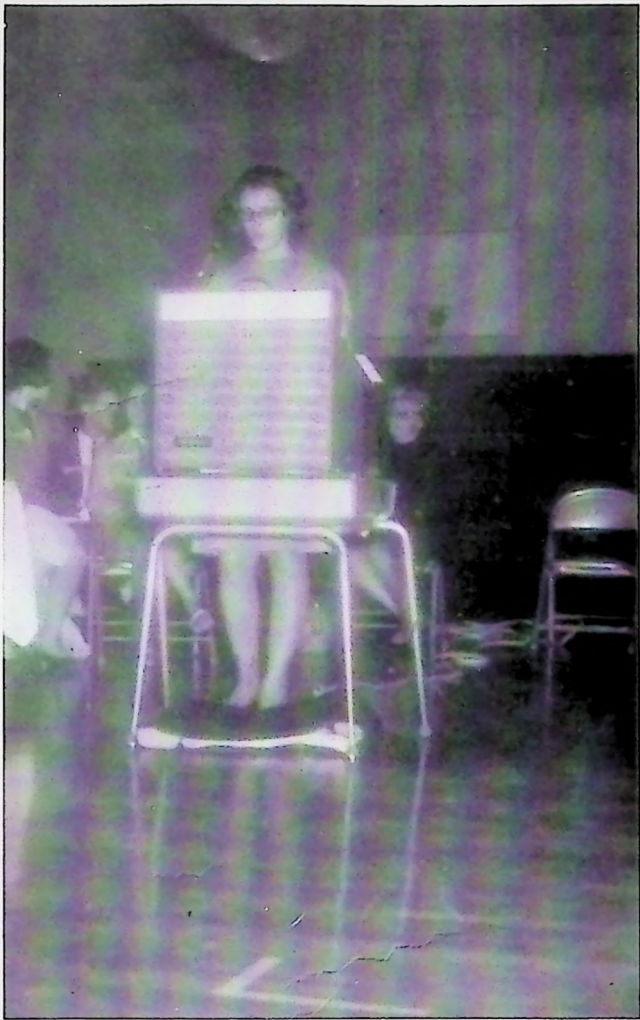

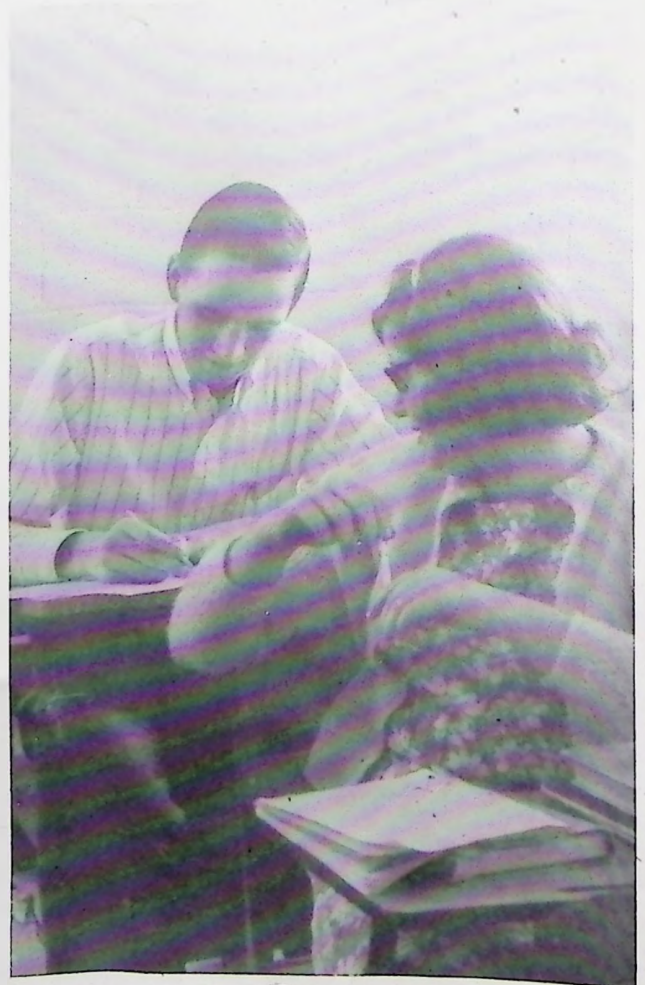

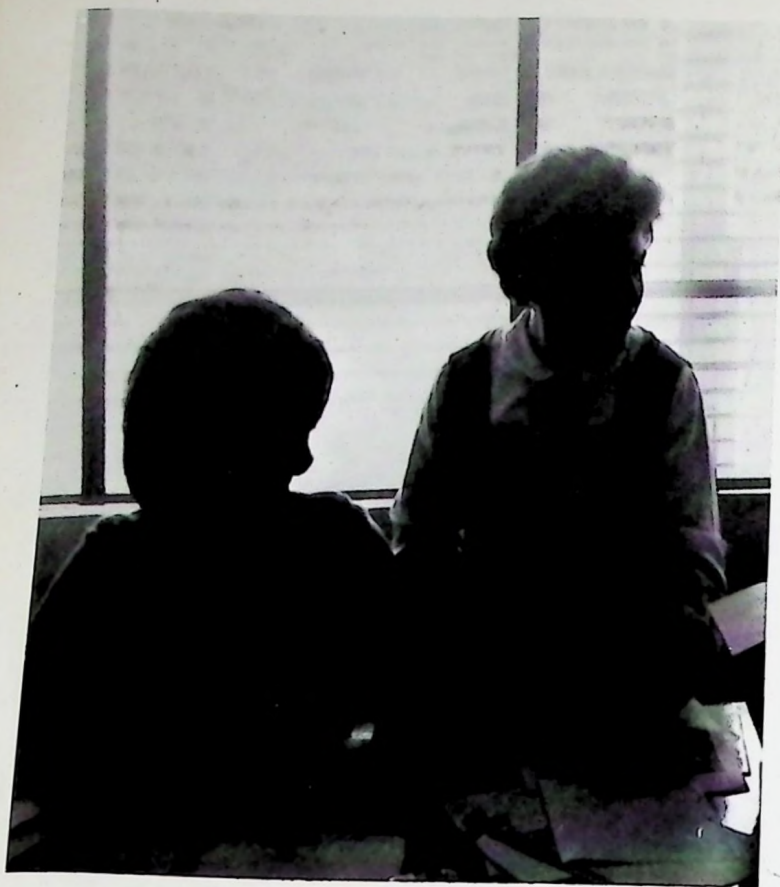

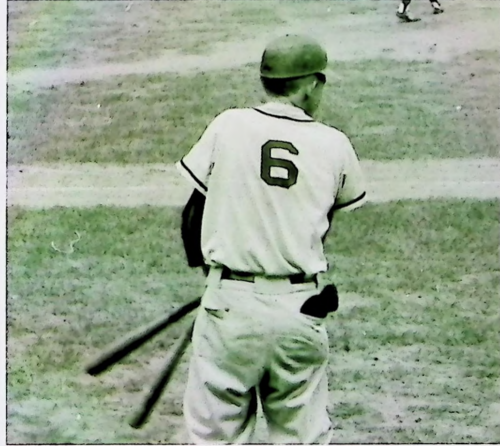

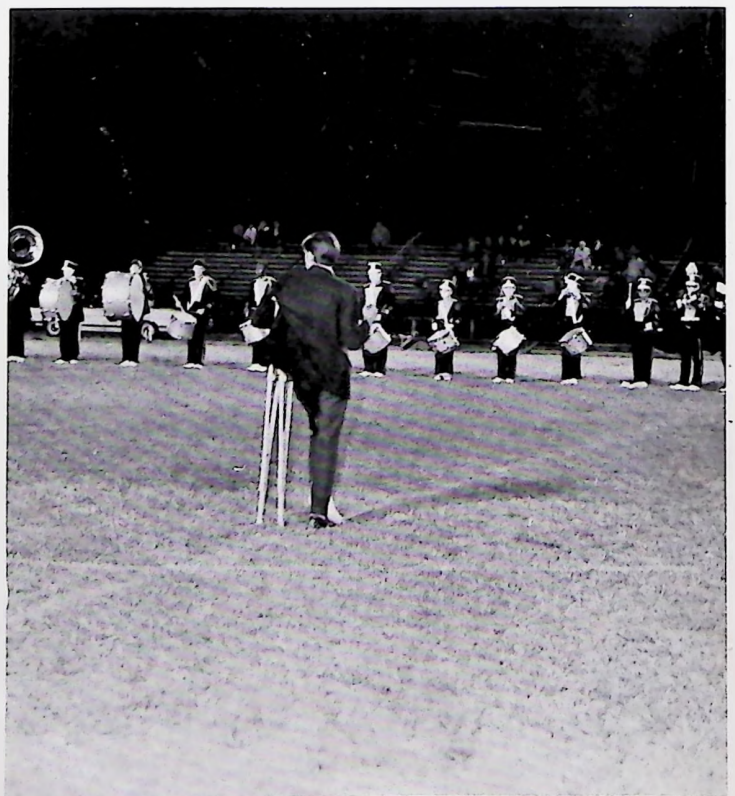
The band marched in the FSU Homecoming parade, the Veterans Day parade, and the Thomasville Christmas parade.

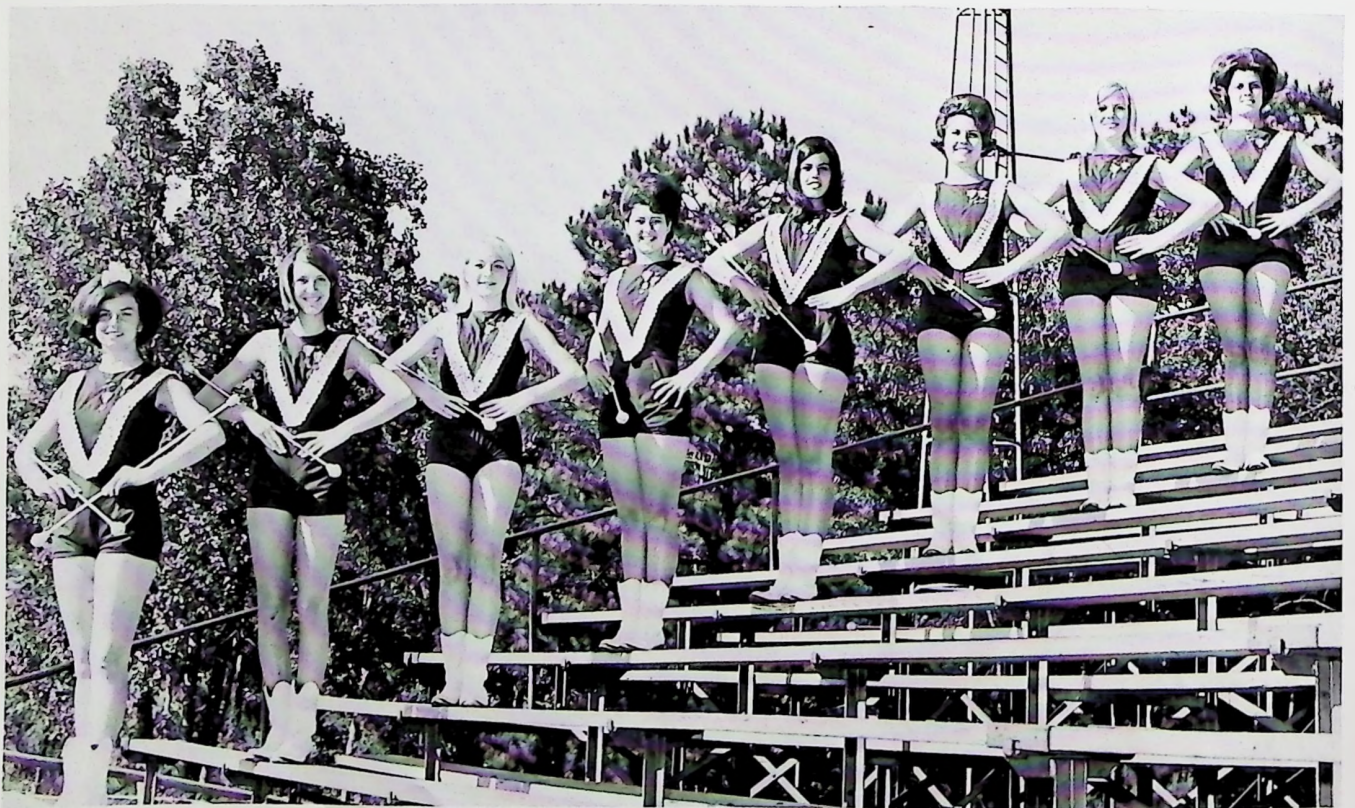

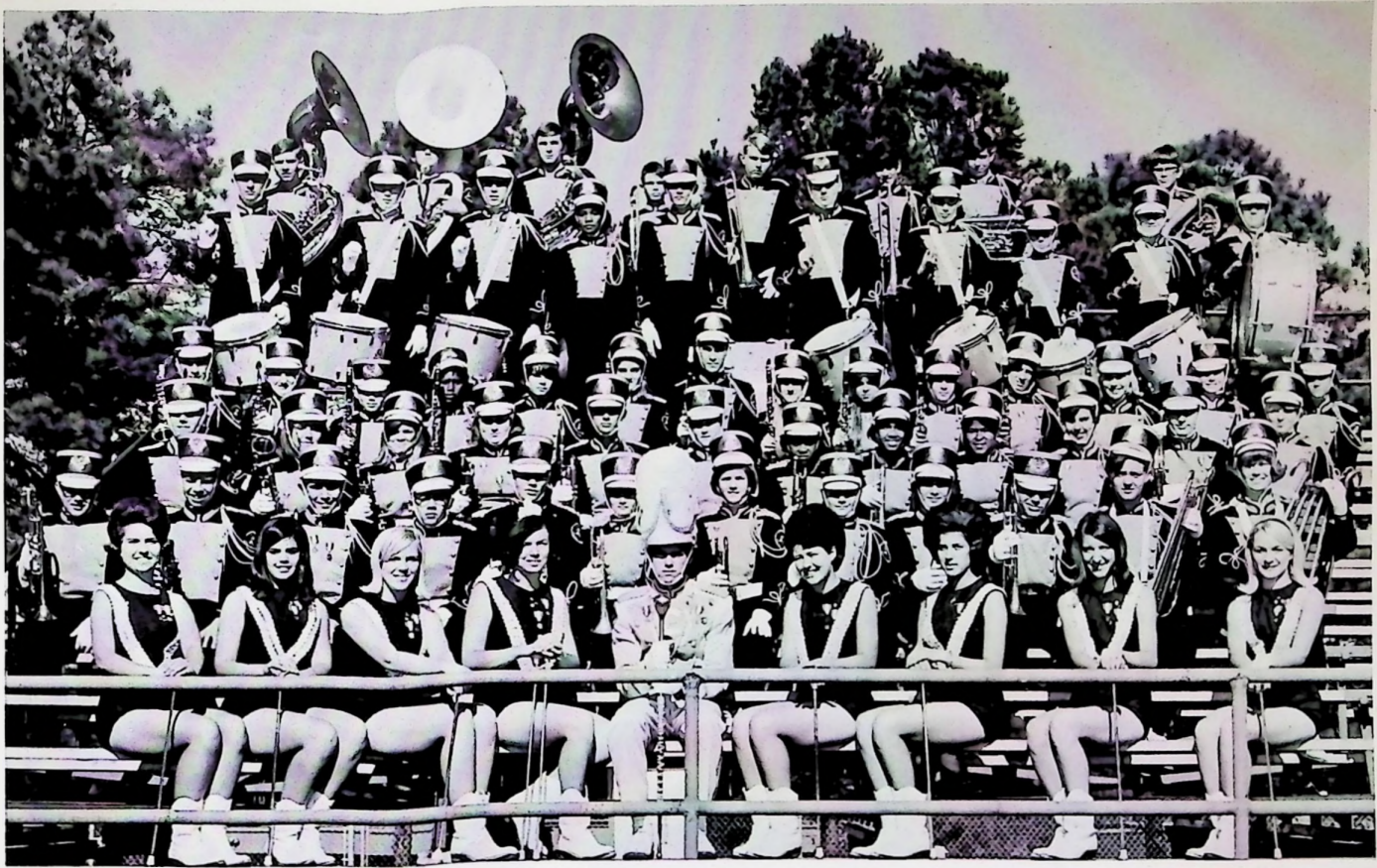

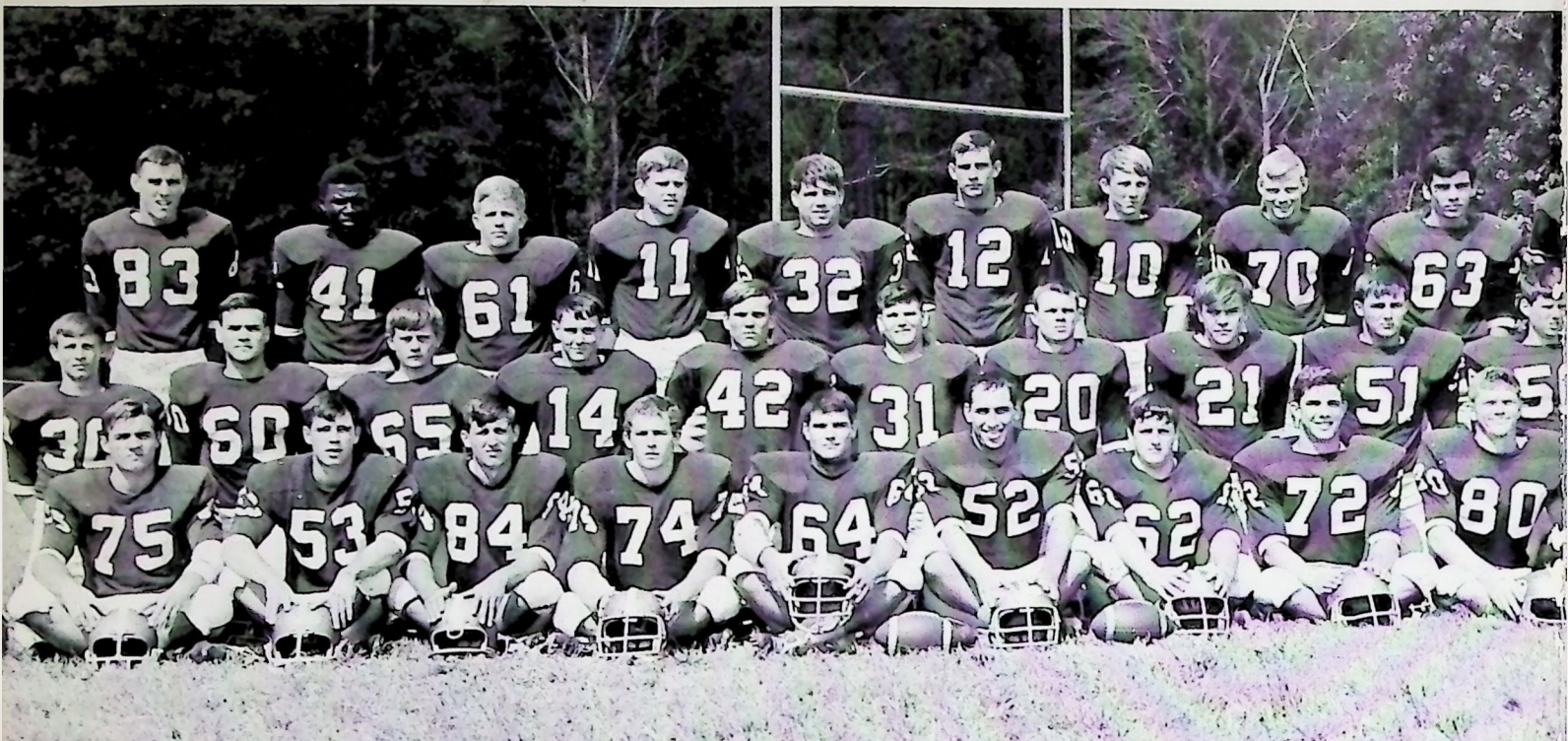
Jackets Hold Fitzgerald Scoreless

Combining thrills and surprises to produce an exciting season, the 1967 Fighting Yellow Jackets finished with a season record of 4-4-2.

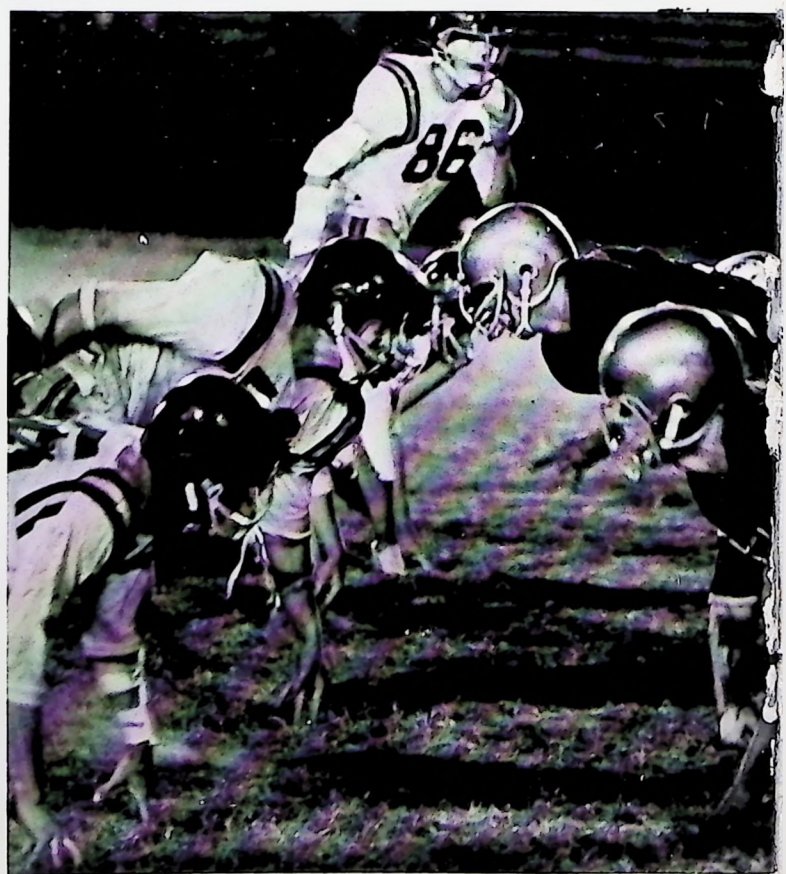

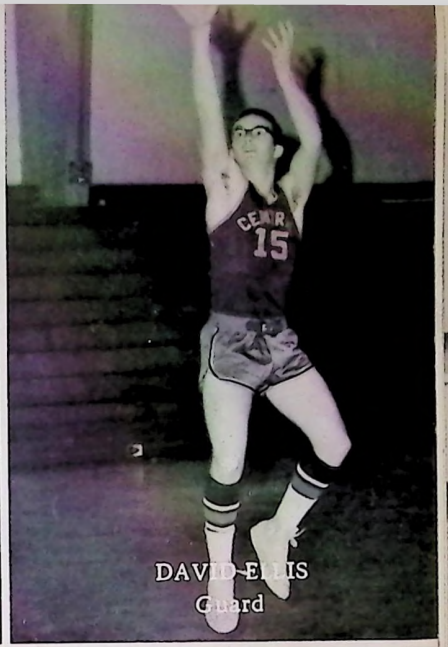
Jackets Finish Regular Season With Winning Streak

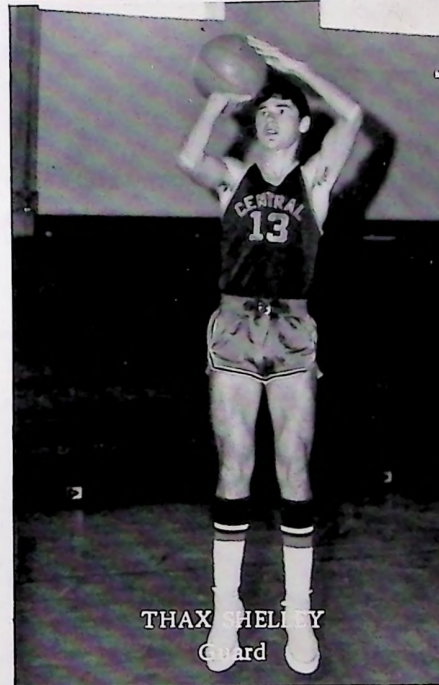

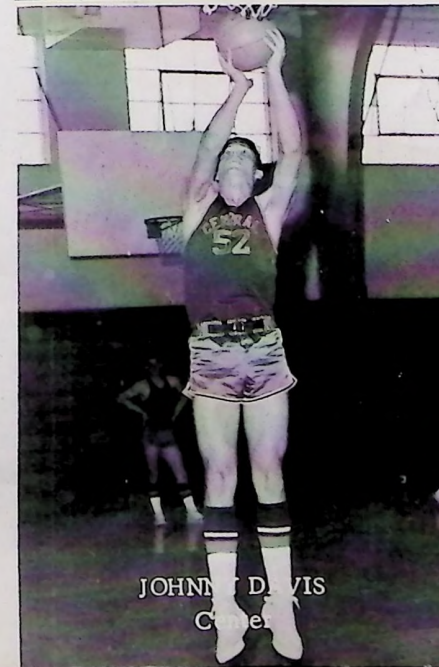

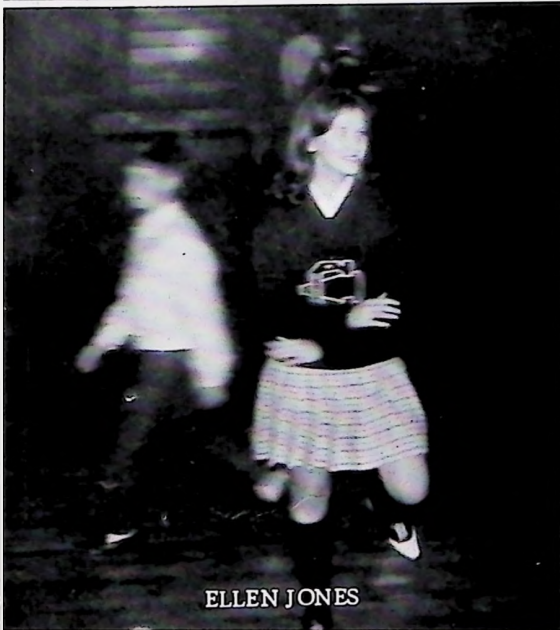
Basketball Cheerleaders Sell Tupperware

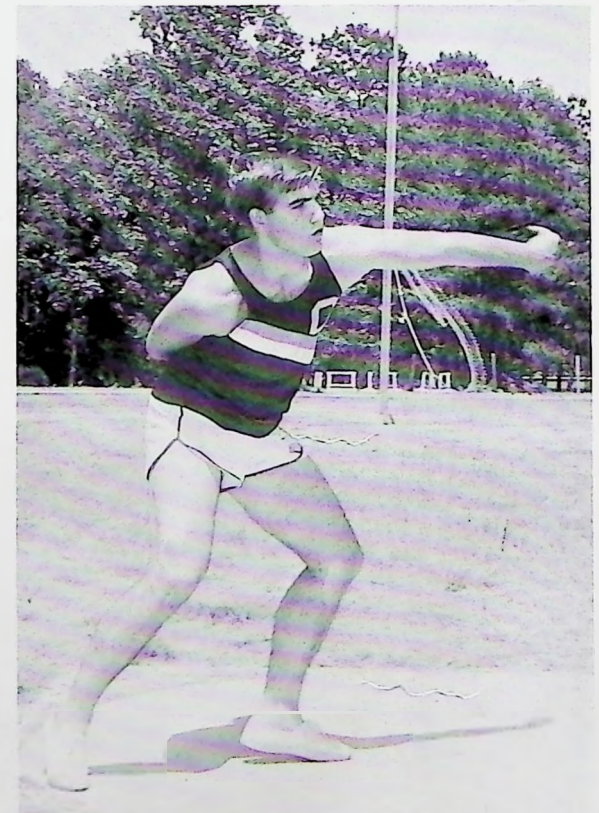


Track Team Wins State

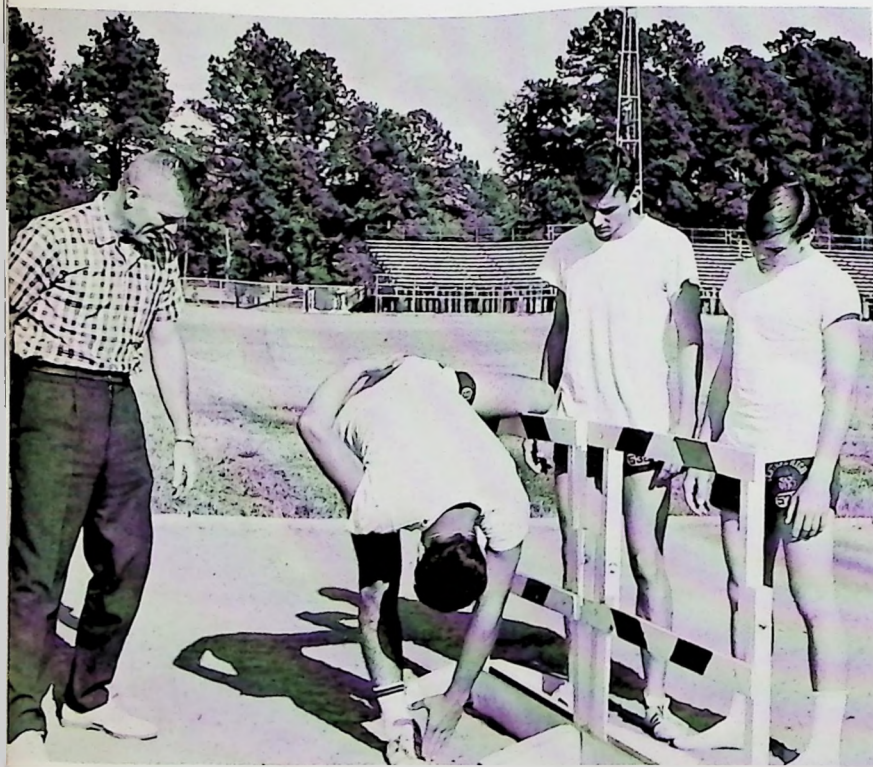

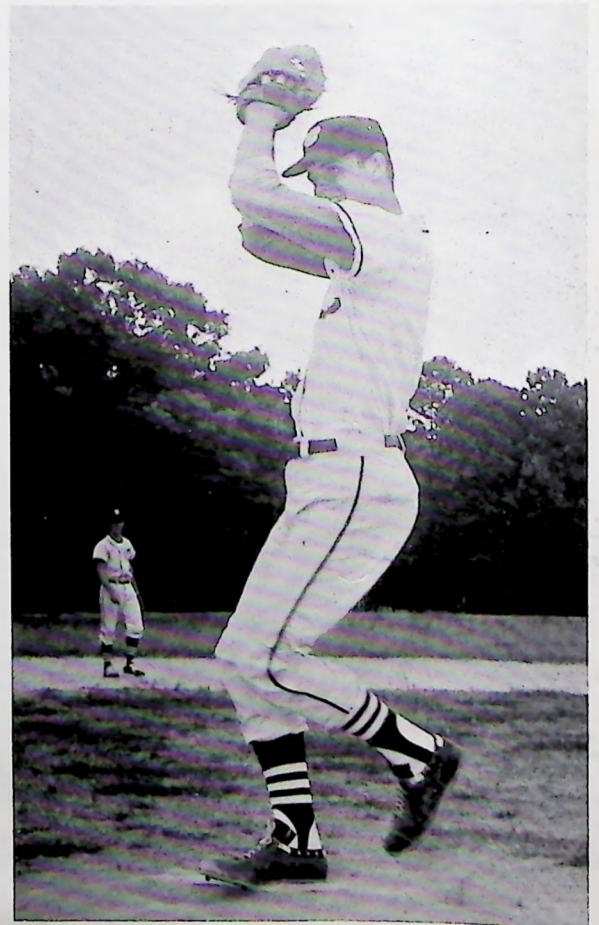

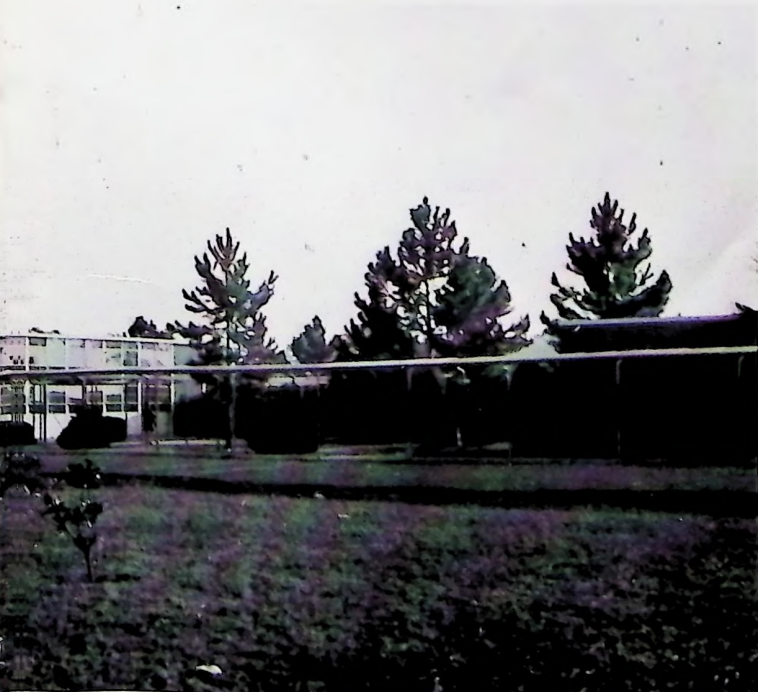




Elementary Principal Wayne Smith

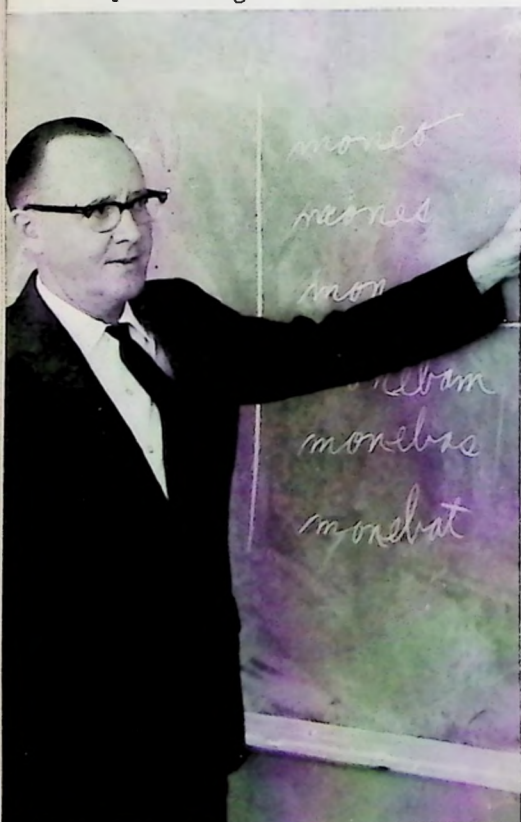
To students wanting to learn a foreign language there is a choice of either Latin or Spanish.

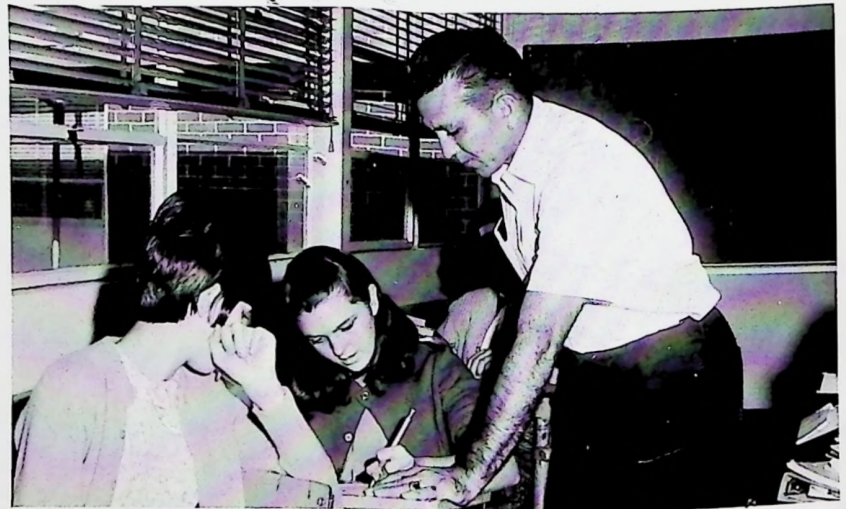
Teachers Review Today's Changing Math

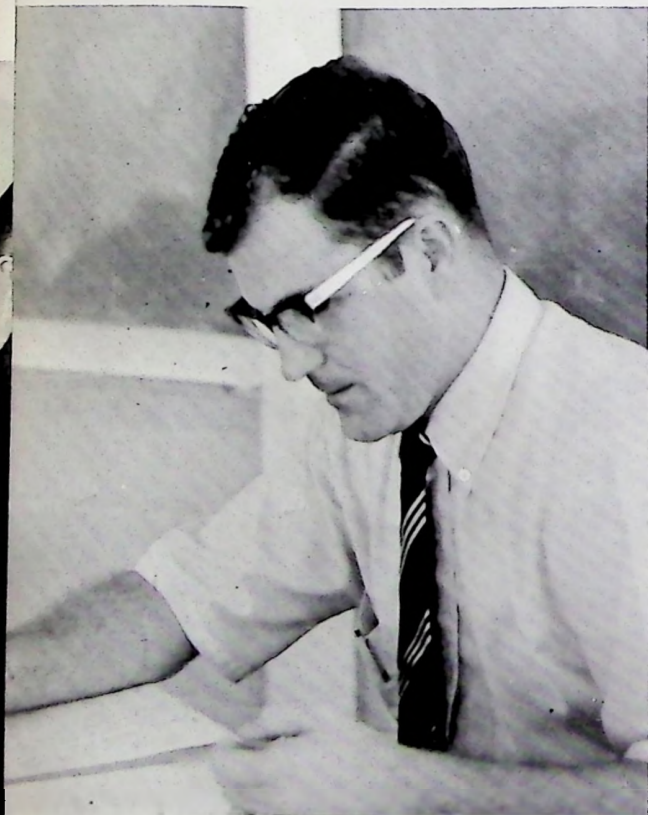
Math teachers continually review new methods of teaching today's changing math. They pass their knowledge to the students with the aid of new books and an overhead projector.

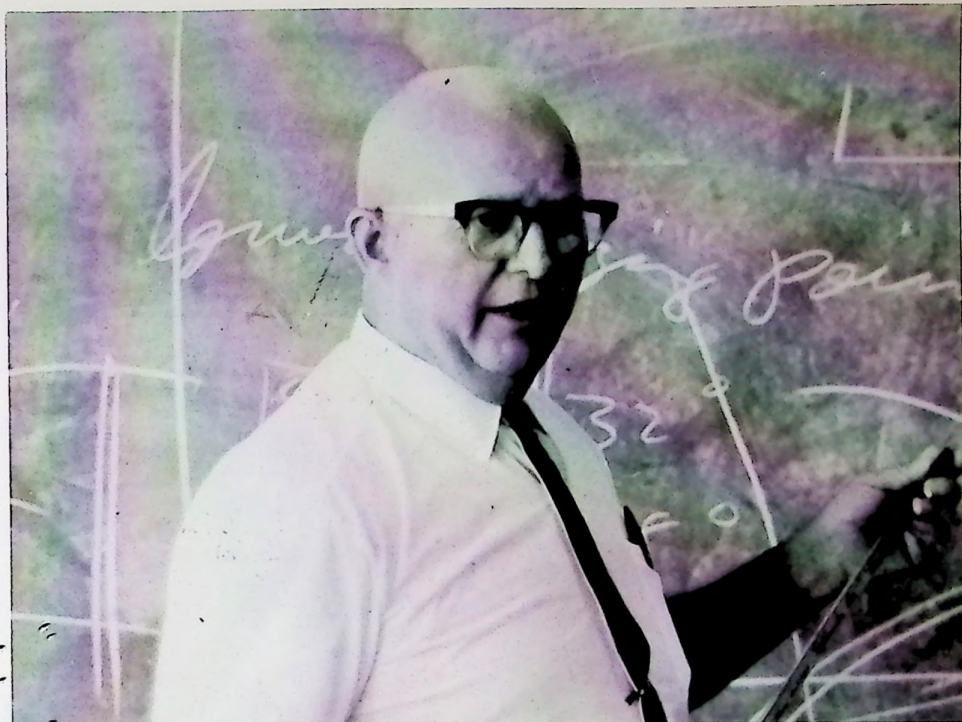
Fair A Big Success

In the CHS Science Department, students are enabled to acquire a fine knowledge of the sciences by the encouragement of a dedicated staff.

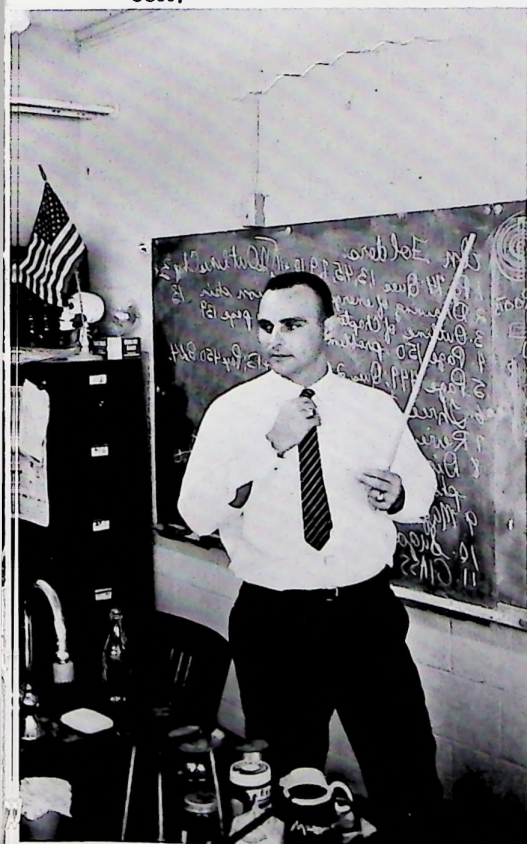
During the past year many new items were added, improving already efficient laboratories. Many new chemicals and equipment were provided for the students' laboratory research.

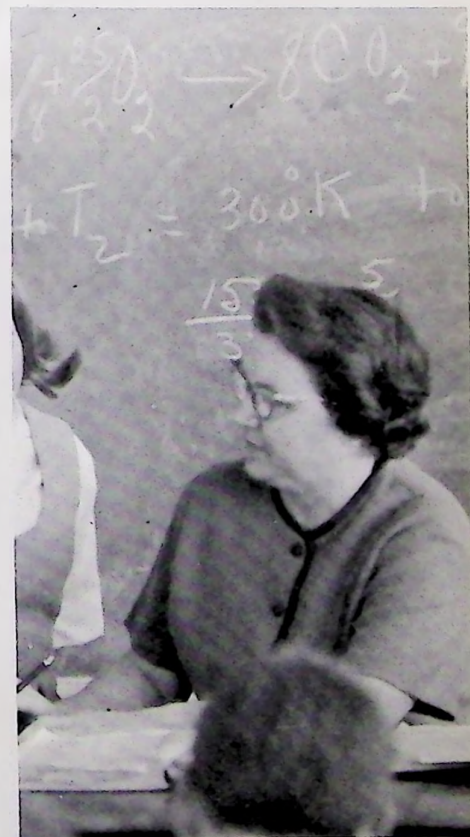

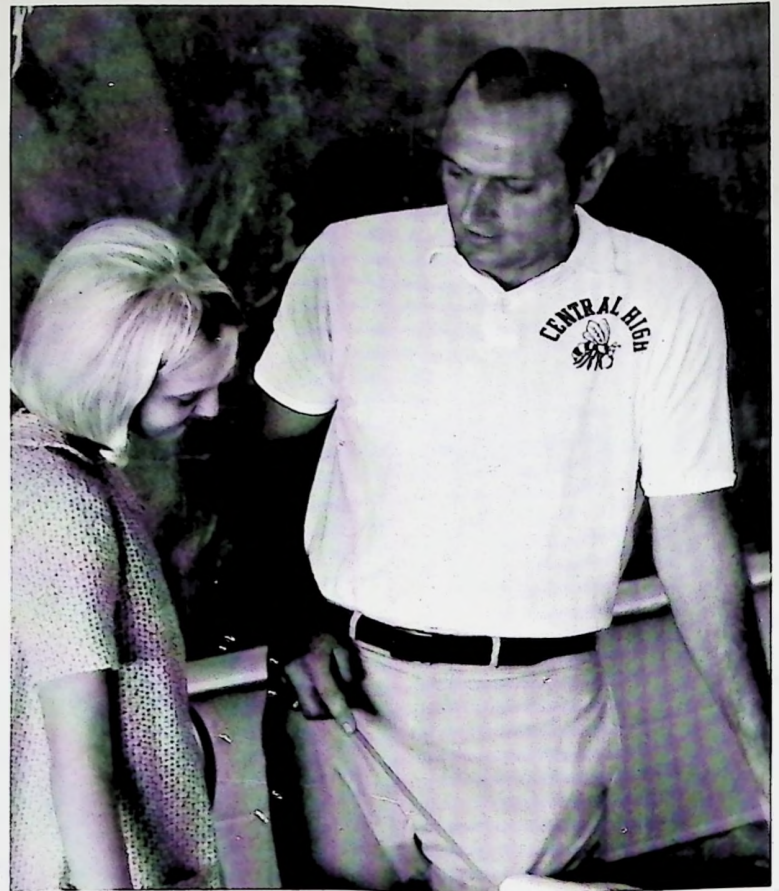
Social Science Department Acquires New Teaching Aids

In addition to a new teacher, the department has received new maps, books, and an overhead projector.



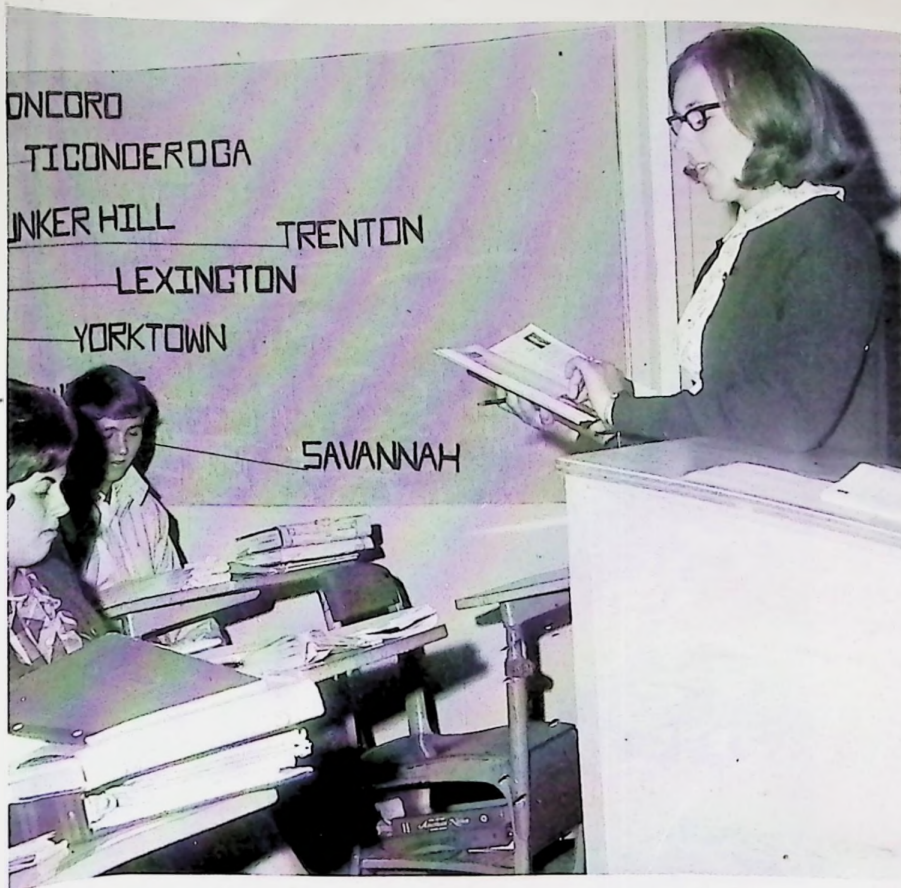

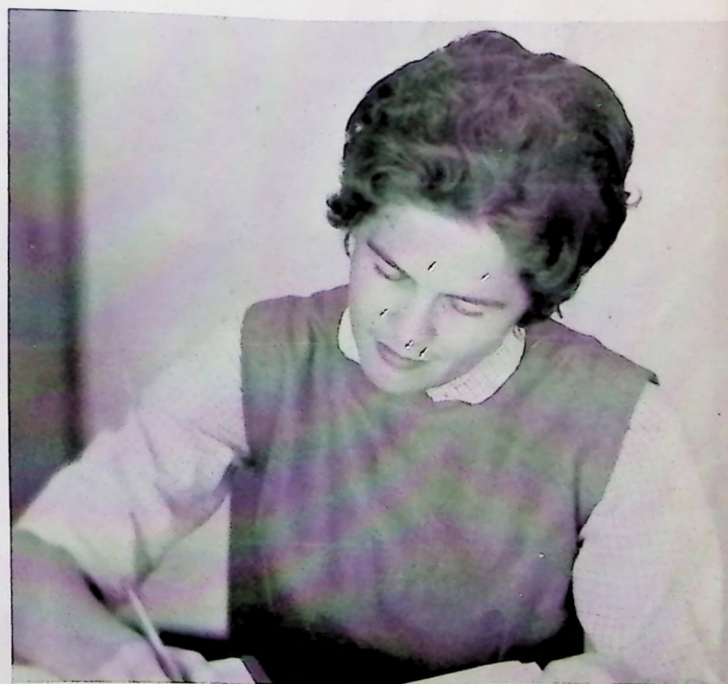

Forestry, livestock, carpentry, and field crops are taught over a period of four years in Vocational Agriculture. During the year each student presents a required annual project.

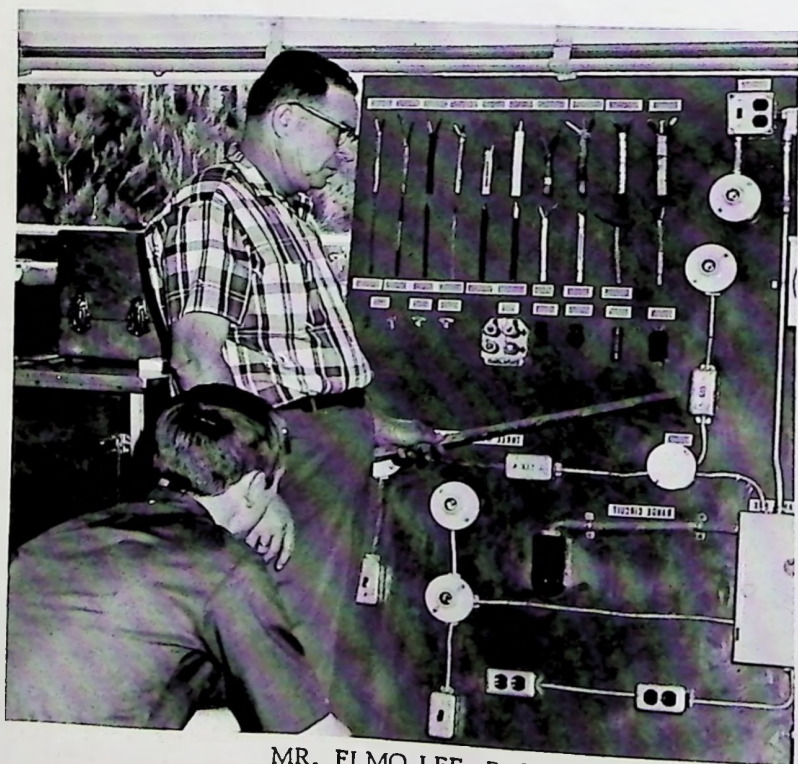
