

RECOMMENDED SCHEDULED FOR 1970-71

The schedule recommended for _____ for the school year _____ is listed below. The basis of the recommendation is students grade level, academic grades, standardized test scores, teachers and counselor recommendations. The final decision, however of the subjects in which the student is enrolled is made by the parent or guardian and the student. We expect the student to be enrolled in and to remain in the course of study he or she is scheduled for during this registration period unless foreseen circumstances arise. If a failure occurs or a passing mark is earned that we are unable to detect at the time of registration, it is the students' full responsibility to inform us at the beginning of next years school term in order that he or she may be scheduled properly. In the event that summer school credit is earned it is also the responsibility of the student to show evidence of this by a report card to the counselor. Please fill out the attached scheduled listing every subject you wish the student to take if you do not approve the recommended schedule listed below. If you do approve the recommended schedule, sign the portion of this sheet to be detached and return it by the student to the Guidance Office in one or two days. If the student does not return to the Guidance Office the schedule showing the courses you wish him or her to take or the detached portion of this sheet showing your approval they will be scheduled and will be expected to remain in the recommended schedule listed below.

PROGRAM OF STUDIES - - - CENTRAL HIGH SCHOOL - - - 1971-72

The subjects shown in capital letters on the page are required courses. Students should schedule courses at the grade level. Example: A 10th grade student will normally schedule World History; however, he may, if there is a need, schedule World Geography, which is offered in the 9th grade. He cannot schedule American History as it is required in the 11th grade. Any exception to this procedure must be approved by a school counselor and/or the principal. Students in the 10th, 11th, and 12th grades with an average below "B" should not schedule more than four academic subjects. All 9th grade students must take five (5) unit subjects. All students must schedule a minimum of four(4) academic courses.

INFORMATION CONCERNING CERTAIN COURSE OFFERINGS

English IV-A---For college bound students scheduled by choice of student and parent.

Advanced World History---For college bound students scheduled by choice of student and parent.

9th Grade BSCS Biology---A college preparatory course for those students who are recommended by their 8th Grade Science teacher and with the approval of their parent or guardian.

General Biology---For 10th Grade students who scheduled General Science in the 9th Grade and do not want BSCS which is college preparatory.

Office Practice & Filing---A student must have had 2 courses in Business Education or be enrolled in the 2nd course along with the Office Practice & Filing.

Stenoscript---A one semester course for college bound seniors only. Students who have had Shorthand are not eligible for this course.

Personal Typing---For students who are enrolled in Stenoscript for one semester.

Journalism---For Sophomores, Juniors, and Seniors who have a "B" average in English and who are interested in working on school newspaper or other publications.

Students who take Yearbook Staff, Office Assistants, or Teacher Assistants must be recommended by the staff or teachers for whom they will be working.

In order to be admitted to Vocational Technical School under the senior program, a student must have a minimum of 14 units. They must be as follows:
3 units-English; 1 unit-Phy. Ed.; 3 units-Math&Science; 3 units-Soc. Sciences;
4 units-Electives

The following courses earn $\frac{1}{2}$ unit of activity credit: Band, Chorus, Office Asst. Library Asst., Journalism, Teacher Asst, Guidance Off. Asst. Yearbook Staff, and Physical Ed.

Students who receive a diploma from Central High School with the exception of those attending Thomas Tech or Walden Tech under the senior program must complete 3 units of English, 2 units of math, 2 units of science, 3 units of social studies, 1 unit of physical education, and 7 electives. Four units of English are required in order for Central High School to recommend a student to a college. A student may substitute band or chorus for his physical education requirement. All regular students must have a total of 18 units for graduation. Sixteen (16) of these units must be academic units.
