

CHS - SCHOOL POLICIES - 1970-71

I Tardies

1. A student is tardy when he or she is not in his or her desk when the tardy bell rings.
2. A student who is tardy must have an admission slip from the assistant principal before being admitted to homeroom, class, or study hall.
3. A student is allowed two tardies per six weeks grading period without a penalty.
4. For tardies in excess of those allowed above a student will be penalized (1) a thirty minutes detention after school on the day of or the first day after the tardy occurs, or (2) a one day suspension from classes.

II Absences

1. The state department of education requires an explanation of all absences from school.
2. The student who is absent will present the homeroom teacher with a written explanation from the parents as soon as the student returns to school.
3. The homeroom teacher will file the written explanation and issue the student an admission slip which the student will present to all teachers to whom he or she is assigned the remainder of the day.
4. Any time a student is absent three consecutive days or an aggregate of five days during a six weeks grading period that student is to be reported to the assistant principal.
5. The assistant principal will evaluate the absences and call the student before the attendance committee if he determines the need to do so.
6. The attendance committee is composed of the principal, the assistant principal, the counselor, and two teachers.
7. Absences in violation of those listed above which are determined by the attendance committee to be unnecessary can result in a reduction of grades.

III Smoking

1. Students are not permitted to smoke on the Central High School campus.
2. Students in violation of the smoking policy will be penalized as follows.
 - first violation is penalized by a spanking or a one day suspension from classes - the choice being made by the student.
 - second violation is penalized by a three day suspension from classes plus a conference with the parents before the student will be readmitted to classes.
 - Subsequent violations will be penalized by a disciplinary committee of faculty members.

IV Parking Lot

1. All students who drive cars or two-wheeled vehicles must park the vehicles in the student parking lot.
2. Students must leave the vehicles immediately after parking them.
3. It is recommended that all students remove keys and lock cars before leaving them.
4. No student is allowed to return to the parking lot until he is dismissed from school.
5. Students who find it imperative to return to the parking lot during the school day must have the written permission of the assistant principal.

6. Violation of the parking lot regulations will be penalized by a one day suspension from classes.

V Insubordination

1. Any disrespect or disobedience is considered to be insubordination.
2. Disrespect and/or disobedience is a serious violation. Each violation will be treated individually depending upon the degree of seriousness of the violation.
3. Serious violations of this policy will be considered by the disciplinary committee.

VI Damage to Property

1. Students who are guilty of damage to school property will be required to completely restore that which has been damaged or destroyed.
2. If damage or destruction is malicious, the student will be punished in addition to the restoration or replacement of the property.

VII Stealing

1. The theft of any property on the campus is a serious offense.
2. Students found guilty of stealing will be penalized as follows.
 - first violation is penalized by a ten day suspension from school.
 - second violation will be presented to the board of education for consideration.

VIII Students Out of Class

1. Students are not permitted to leave classes, study halls, or homeroom without passes issued by the teacher in charge.

IX Leaving Campus Without Permission

1. No student is permitted to leave the campus during the school day without the written permission of the assistant principal.
2. Violations of this policy will be penalized as follows.
 - first violation is penalized by a three day suspension from classes.
 - second violation is penalized by a six day suspension from classes.
 - third violation is penalized by a nine day suspension from the campus.

X Visitors to Campus

1. Students will not be permitted to take visitors to classes with them.
2. Students will not be allowed to receive visitors any place on the campus unless the visitor has a visitor's pass issued by the assistant principal.
3. Visitors to the campus will be allowed to see students in the office of the assistant principal only.

XI Expressions of Affections

1. Expressions of affections such as handholding, hugging, kissing, etc. are improper conduct on school campuses.
2. Violations will be penalized in the following manner.
 - first violation penalized by notification of parents of students involved.
 - second violation penalized by a two day suspension from classes.
 - subsequent violations will be considered by the disciplinary committee.

XII Profanity

1. Students are expected to be aware of and practice clean speech on the campus.
2. Students in violation clean speech will be penalized by a spanking or a one day suspension from classes.(Student's choice)

XIII Alcoholic Beverages

1. The use of alcoholic beverages is prohibited on the campus.
2. The possession of alcoholic beverages on the person or in vehicles is prohibited on the campus.
3. Students violating this policy will be penalized in the following manner.
 - first violation will be penalized by a ten day suspension from campus.
 - second violation will be presented to the county board of education for consideration.

XIV Misbehavior on School Buses

1. Misbehavior on school buses will be penalized by a five day suspension of the privilege of riding the school bus.
