One unit of non-academic credit may be applied toward graduation. Seventeen (17) units must be earned in the academic field.

The curriculum for Central High School will offer four possible programs toward a diploma. All students do not need to follow the same program or course of study because their talents, interests, abilities, backgrounds and future plans are different. Therefore, students and their parents are requested to study the student's special talents, particular interests, scholastic ability, and choice of vocation - all as a base for choosing his or her course of study through high school.

Teachers are interested in helping students and parents make wise choices of courses. So, it is hoped that students will contact their teachers for help in deciding whether certain programs or subjects are suitable for them. A faculty counselor will be expected to approve the student's program of study each year.

Within limitations, it will be possible for students to elect courses from different programs. Likewise, within limitations, it will be possible to change from one program to another. However, it is especially important that the student who plans to attend college, elect the courses that will prepare him or her for entrance to their choice of colleges. A wise choice of courses now will prevent trouble later.

ELEVEN ACADEMIC UNITS as listed below will be required of all students in Central High School. In addition to these, all students will be required to take part in Health and Physical Education, unless excused by a Doctor or unless the participate in the Band or Choral Music Class. All students in Physical Education classes are REQUIRED to be dressed out in suitable attire.

PLEASE NOTE: VOCATIONAL COURSES for girls means Home Economics primarily, for boys means Agriculture with a requirement of home projects, or Vocational Shop. DRIVER EDUCATION will be offered to students who meet the age requirement of the State Department of Public Safety for obtaining a learner's permit or driver's license. Preference will be given to 10th grade students who do not have a license. The course will be for one semester and will carry $\frac{1}{2}$ unit credit. Therefore, students may enroll in this course in addition to their regular academic load.

Each student, along with his or her parents and teachers, is asked to make a plan of courses for the rest of his or her high school career. Parents are expected to sign the plan sheet. It must be approved by a faculty advisor and the student's parents. It will be used for reference as the student progresses toward graduation. Revisions will be allowed with the aid of a teacher counselor. General college admission requirements are: English, 4 units; Mathematics, 3 units (1 unit each in Algebra and Plane Geometry included in the 3 units in Mathematics); Foreign Language, 2 units; Social Studies, 3 units; Science, 2 to 4 units.
