

Joseph Sackett jr succeeded him in 1747 to 1757 when Jonathan Lawrence became Sheriff until 1778 and Wm W. Thompson in 1781 In 1829 Joshua Conger became Sheriff until 1832. I knew him in 1840. It was said the Conger's came home after the war with red coats on.

Henry G. Wisner was County Clerk 1813 to 1815. was a lawyer in 1803. Saml. W. Egan in 1813. John Blagg (Blagg's Cove) in 1727.

There is a monument erected at Gothen in honor of Henry Wisner who died March 4, 1790 - 70 years ago. who was a member of the first Continental Congress and voted for the Declaration of Independence erected by his Great Grand Daughter Frances Wisner Murray 1887.

The Wisners were related to father in some way. I have a letter written in 1805 by John Latham to his son Wm B. Latham ^(my father) in which he speaks of Wisner as a lawyer

Your letter is very interesting to me and hope you will write soon and send me a copy of that will of Jabez Atwood's - and all you can say about the Woods or Atwoods -

~~Gerow~~ "Gerow" was originally "Gereaux" French Huguenots - Latham was sometimes Lotham in England - Many names are changed here sometimes for various reasons.
