will plan, fundraise, and coordinate the installation. Theatre honours are a form of battle honour given to publicly recognize a Canadian Armed Forces unit for successful participation in a theatre armed conflict. The RMR was one of 63 units in the Canadian Armed Forces who were awarded the AFGHANISTAN theatre honour in 2014, and this is the first new battle honour awarded to the Regiment since the end of the Second World War. The unveiling is scheduled for November 2019, to coincide with Remembrance Day.

Please take a few moments to think of or utter a prayer for deployed RMR members and those of our regimental family who are battling illness or disease.
