A Soldier on pass who requires medical aid must apply for it, personally if possible, to the nearest Military, R. Naval or R. Air Force hospital or other Medical formation, showing this pass. If, however, he resides more than two miles from such hospital, etc., he may apply to a civilian doctor, to whom he will show this pass, and the doctor will then be allowed the following rates for medical attendance on the soldier at the latter's residence.

When the soldier visits the surgery of a civilian doctor, the fee payable in respect of such visits will be:—3s. per visit.

The Soldier will at once report the employment of the civilian doctor by a letter addressed to his Commanding Officer to whom the civilian doctor will submit his claim on Army Form O 1667 for payment.

If hospital treatment is necessary, the soldier will at once report the fact, if possible, to the nearest Military, R. Naval or R. Air Force Hospital, Military Reception Station or Medical Inspection Room for Troops, and failing that to his Commanding Officer, when arrangements will be made, wherever possible, for any necessary treatment to be given from Military sources. If a soldier is admitted to a R. Naval or R. Air Force hospital, he will report the fact immediately to his Commanding Officer. If, in the event of emergency, a soldier is admitted to a civil hospital he will report the fact immediately to his Commanding Officer, who will at once notify the Assistant Director of Medical Services concerned.

When a soldier on pass is prevented by sickness, which must be properly certified, or by other unavoidable causes, from rejoining his Corps by the date on which his pass expires, he is to report himself before that date—

To the nearest General or other Officer of the staff of the Army or to the Commanding Officer of any unit or detachment of the Regular Army; or (if none of these be within convenient distance) to a Justice of the Peace.

If in Eire, he is to furnish the medical certificate to his C.O.

A Soldier on leave or furlough who requires emergency dental treatment must apply for it to the nearest Military, Royal Naval or Royal Air Force Hospital or Dental Centre.

If he resides more than two miles from such hospital or dental centre, he may apply to a civilian dental practitioner to whom he will show this pass; the dental practitioner will be paid only for strictly emergency treatment and at the rates admissible under the National Health Insurance Act (Dental Benefit Regulations).

The soldier will at once report the employment of the civilian dental practitioner to his Commanding Officer, and the practitioner will submit his claim for payment on Army Form O 1667, and forward it to the Deputy Director of Medical Services at the headquarters of the Command in which the soldier is temporarily residing.

These instructions, where applicable, will also be held to refer to an auxiliary of the Auxiliary Territorial Service or to a member of a Voluntary Aid Detachment called out for service.

If his pass exceeds 24 hours a soldier is to leave his address with the Captain of his company, and he must at all times be prepared to rejoin on the shortest notice, if ordered to do so.

NOTE.—The above instructions are not applicable to a soldier on Field Service overseas.
