The INTERCOM is the RMR family's newsletter, which originally started as "The Bugler" in 1914 on the troopship carrying the 14th Bn (RMR) overseas. Censorship quickly squashed the initiative, but the RMR tried again in 1916 with "The Growler" (which was also squashed!). In WW2 the RMR had two battalions, one overseas from 1939-45, and a Home unit stationed in Westmount. In an effort to boost morale and keep the lines of communication open between the two battalions, the "Intercomn" ("n" intentional) was born. The current "Intercom" (masthead from the the 1950's) is published monthly and is intended to keep the friends & family of the Regiment up to speed with the accomplishments of the current serving members of the Regiment and all affiliated organizations.

This event will commemorate the 80th anniversary of Victory in Europe day and the Liberation of the Netherlands, and honour the legacy of Sergeant Leo Major, known for his solo liberation of Zwolle. Guests, including Her Excellency Margriet

Vonno, Ambassador of the Kingdom of the Netherlands, will be present. The ceremony will also feature the consecration of a new Artillery Memorial and a potential helicopter flyby.

April saw several notable events and achievements. The 109th annual Ypres Dinner was hosted by the Warrant Officers' & Sergeants' Mess, continuing a tradition honouring the Regiment's service in the Second Battle of Ypres. Additionally in terms of commemoration, an episode of The Rum Ration podcast exploring the RMR's role in the Battle of Vimy Ridge was released on the 108th anniversary of the battle.

Individual excellence was recognized in April, with Master-Corporal Lachance-Paquin awarded for his leadership in United Way fundraising, and Master-Corporal Sanda-Staicopol also earned 34 Brigade recognition as an instructor on a Canadian Armed Forces mortar course, demonstrating dedication and leadership. Speaking of mortars, serving members also conducted local training on the 81mm mortar at the armoury in April.

Further showcasing advanced training, Master-Corporal Savage qualified as an Arctic Operations Advisor after completing two challenging courses.

The RMR Association's 'Ottawa chapter' held a well-attended 'Beer Call' organized by Sergeant (ret'd) Nikita Rambaransingh, and Branch 14 (RMR Association) held elections and awarded Long Service Pins to members who had marked significant milestones: from five to 50-years! Congratulations to Comrade Sue Guerin for being elected as President of Branch 14 (RMR Association)!

Master Corporal Sanda-Staicopol Earns Brigade Recognition for

Excellence on Mortar Course

Westmount, Quebec — 03 April 2025: During a formal presentation held on Tuesday, 26 March 2025, Master-Corporal Sanda-Staicopol was recognized for his outstanding performance while acting as Detachment Commander on the Canadian Armed Forces mortar course (MEMA 2501). The award of a 34 École de Combat challenge coin was presented by Major Nda-Ngye following a glowing citation that commended his unwavering dedication, adaptability, and leadership throughout the demanding course.

Though it was his first time teaching on a mortar course—and while not formally qualified for the instructional role—MCpl Sanda-Staicopol exceeded expectations. His commitment to the success of his candidates was evident as he stayed after hours to provide remedial instruction, ensured all students had the opportunity to master the material, and worked extended hours across weekdays.

In addition to his training duties, MCpl Sanda-Staicopol stepped into an unofficial leadership role when the course's 2IC was unavailable. He effectively became the main point of contact with the course officer, coordinating schedules, relaying essential information, and setting up leadership meetings. His initiative and problem-solving skills proved crucial in maintaining the course's momentum, even reaching out to fellow RMR members to provide supplementary support when needed.

Members of the RMR can take great pride in MCpl Sanda-Staicopol's recognition, which reflects not only his individual excellence but also the high standard of professionalism and commitment upheld by the Regiment.


Rum Ration Podcast Episode 10: Vimy - Birth of a nation

MCpl Savage Qualifies as Arctic Operations Advisor

Westmount, Quebec – Rain, snow, or Arctic wind—RMR soldiers train to lead in all conditions. Between January and March 2025, Master-Corporal Savage pushed this engagement even further by completing two of the most intense cold-weather courses in the Canadian Army: Cold Weather Operations Leader (CWOL) and Arctic Operations Advisor (AOA).

CWOL, held at CFB Shilo, Manitoba, began with a winter solo survival phase—building shelters, making fires, setting snares, and signaling for rescue, all alone in subzero temperatures. After passing survival, candidates led field missions in deep snow and conducted through-ice survival simulations, learning how to react when a soldier breaks through ice into freezing water.

For AOA in Resolute Bay, Nunavut, candidates further honed their Arctic survival skills by building emergency shelters like igloos and snow caves, and then learning how to advise commanders on operations in the harshest Arctic environments. The course ended with a multi-day sovereignty patrol to a remote northern community.



RMR members train locally on the 81mm mortar

Westmount, Quebec, 08 April 2025 – Some of the 25 members of the RMR who have qualified on the 81mm mortar over the past 2-years had the opportunity to train with the weapon at the RMR's armoury on Tuesday night. Big thanks to Master-Corporal Pratt who managed to arrange for two 81 mm tubes to be lent to the RMR from some of his contacts.

The weapon is a versatile and potent indirect fire weapon used by the Canadian Army, including both regular and reserve units. This medium mortar system is designed to provide infantry units with high-angle fire support, bridging the gap between the maximum range of hand-thrown (or rifle-fired) grenades and the minimum range of artillery.



MCpl LaChance-Paquin Recognized for United Way Leadership

Westmount, Quebec - 02 April 2025: Every year, members of the Canadian Armed Forces (CAF) from coast to coast join forces to support the United Way through the Government of Canada Workplace Charitable Campaign (GCWCC). Invitation to Annual Commemorative Ceremony at the National Field of Honour: 25 May 2025

Westmount, Quebec – 26 April 2025: The National Field of Honour warmly invites all members of the public to attend a special commemorative ceremony on **Sunday, May 25th at 14h00**, commemorating the 80th anniversary of the Victory in Europe day, the Liberation of the Netherlands, and honouring the legacy of Sergeant Leo Major, one of Canada's most remarkable soldiers. He's the only Canadian to win the Distinguished Conduct Medal in two separate wars!

Sergeant Major's extraordinary actions during the Second World War, particularly his solo liberation of the Dutch city of Zwolle, remain a powerful symbol of courage and perseverance. His deeds continue to inspire generations both in Canada and abroad.

Her Excellency Margriet Vonno, Ambassador of the Kingdom of the Netherlands to Canada, will serve as Guest of Honour, paying tribute to Sergeant Major's liberation of her hometown. Distinguished guests will include General (Retired) Walter John Natynczyk, former Chief of the Defence Staff, and Brigadier-General J.G.P. Lemyre, the Commander of 2nd Canadian Division. Contingents from Quebec-based units that participated in the liberation of the Netherlands will form an honour guard.

The ceremony will also feature the consecration of a new Artillery Memorial at the site of the National Field of Honour's 105mm artillery howitzer, and, weather permitting, a helicopter flyby.

This event offers a meaningful opportunity to recognize the sacrifices made by Canadian soldiers and to celebrate the enduring impact of Sergeant Leo Major's bravery.
