The INTERCOM is the RMR family's newsletter, which originally started as "The Bugler" in 1914 on the troopship carrying the 14th Bn (RMR) overseas. Censorship quickly squashed the initiative, but the RMR tried again in 1916 with "The Growler" (which was also squashed!).

In WW2 the RMR had two battalions, one overseas from 1939-45, and a Home unit stationed in Westmount. In an effort to boost morale and keep the lines of communication open between the two battalions, the "Intercomn" ("n" intentional) was born.

The current "Intercom" (masthead from above is from the 1950's) is published monthly and is intended to keep the friends & family of the Regiment up to speed with the accomplishments of the current serving members of the Regiment and all affiliated organizations.

April will also be a busy month as the Regiment and affiliated Cadet units get ready to wind up their collective training year. The Warrant Officers' and Sergeants' Mess will be holding their annual 2nd Battle of Ypres Dinner to be held on Saturday 22 April 2023. This traditional Mess Dinner is held on the Saturday evening closest to April 22, and is presided over by the RSM. It is held to commemorate the Second Battle of Ypres, in 1915, which was the 14th Battalion (RMR) CEF's first battle and incorporated the horrors of gas warfare used for the first time on the Western Front.

Before you know it we will be in May, with Church Parade and Battalion Review on Sunday 07 May 2023, the RMR Association's Honours & Awards evening on Friday 26 May 2023, and the various Cadet Annual Reviews that will be held. Mark your calendars and come out to support the RMR's serving soldiers!


Meet the RMR's NCO's: MWO James Quesnel, CD




MASTER-CORPORAL RANDALL-COSS WINS THE COMMAND TEAM CHALLENGE
