As noted in our last edition, the "Last 100 Days" of the First World War began a century ago in August 1918. The RMR will be actively commemorating the courage and sacrifice made by our forefathers who led the way in battle, with two informal battlefield tours involving a dozen or so RMR Association members, and a formal ceremony being held in Cagnicourt. Maj Talarico and MCpl O'Driscoll will represent the Regiment at the ceremony in Cagnicourt, and there should be an article in next month's Intercom.
