The INTERCOM is the RMR family's newsletter, which originally started as "The Bugler" in 1914 on the troopship carrying the 14th Bn (RMR) overseas. Censorship quickly squashed the initiative, but the RMR tried again in 1916 with "The Growler" (which was also squashed!). In WW2 the RMR had two battalions, one overseas from 1939-45, and a Home unit stationed in Westmount. In an effort to boost morale and keep the lines of communication open between the two battalions, the "Intercomn" ("n" intentional) was born. The current "Intercom" (masthead from the the 1950's) is published monthly and is intended to keep the friends & family of the Regiment up to speed with the accomplishments of the current serving members of the Regiment and all affiliated organizations.

Westmount, Quebec – 18 September 2024: On a beautiful late summer day held on the Honorary Colonel's property in Potton where they had recently completed a forced march in Full Fighting Order (FFO), The Royal Montreal Regiment held their traditional badging ceremony on Sunday 15 September 2024 where 15 soldiers were officially badged into the Regiment and promoted to the rank of Private. The Honorary Colonel David Bensadoun and the Honorary Lieutenant-Colonel Isabelle Racicot, individually replaced each soldier's generic Infantry Corps cap badge with the RMR's cap badge, welcoming each soldier to the regimental family.



RMR Museum Announces temporary exhibition commemorating 80th Anniversary of Leopold Canal

Westmount, Quebec – 30 September 2024: This October marks the 80th anniversary of the Battle of Leopold Canal, and to commemorate the role the RMR played in this battle and in remembrance of our comrades who were killed, wounded, and/or taken prisoner, the RMR museum will be presenting a temporary exhibit titled: *A Regiment's Sacrifice: Defeating Hitler's Army.* The exhibition will be held in the Warrant Officers' & Sergeants' Mess in the armoury and will run from 01 – 10 November 2024. Admission is free, schools and group visits welcome.

The Battle of Leopold Canal took place from October 6th, 1944 until the 13th of October 1944 as the opening act to the Battle of the Scheldt (Oct $2-Nov\ 8$ 1944) and Operation Switchback (Oct $6-Nov\ 3$ 1944). Located right on the border between Belgium and the Netherlands, the Leopold Canal was a difficult landscape for battle, which was used to the German's advantage. This attack required tactics, skill and the element of surprise, and although the RMR was not initially supposed to be a part of this battle, their service would help lead to the liberation of North-West Europe, a major turning point for the eventual Allied victory in 1945.

So why was the RMR involved? How did their role lead to the eventual liberation of North-West Europe? Who were the men who fought so gallantly and lost their lives for the Allied war effort? In the following weeks leading up to the opening of the exhibit, we will be releasing different stories answering these questions and more on the RMR website as a lead up to the exhibit opening.



New Honoraries for the RMR

Westmount, Quebec – 16 September 2024: On Sunday 15 September 2024, the 34th Brigade Commander, Colonel David Shane, promoted David Bensadoun from his appointment as Honorary Lieutenant-Colonel to become the RMR's Honorary Colonel, and welcomed Isabelle Racicot as the RMR's new Honorary Lieutenant-Colonel. Honorary ranks in the Canadian Forces have been modeled on British traditions. The first honorary appointment was in 1895, and the RMR's first Honorary Colonel in 1914 was Right Honourable Lord Mount Stephen, with the first appointment of an Honorary Lieutenant-Colonel in 1936 (Lieutenant-Colonel Fisher, VC – the original CO of the 58th Westmount Rifles).



CD for MCpl Fils-Aimé

Westmount, Quebec – 17 September 2024: On Sunday 15 September 2024, the 34th Brigade Commander, Colonel David Shane, presented the Canadian Forces Decoration to Master-Corporal Fils-Aime during a parade held on Honorary Colonel David Bensadoun's property in Potton. The ceremony was held shortly after the regiment had

recently completed a forced march in Full Fighting Order (FFO), and a wonderful BBQ lunch served by the Honorary Colonel's family & friends. The Canadian Forces' Decoration is awarded to officers and Non-Commissioned Members of the Canadian Forces who have completed twelve years of service. The decoration is awarded to all ranks, who have a good record of conduct.



Capt McLaughlin earns commendation

Westmount, Quebec - 25 September 2024: As part of the CO's parade held at the armoury on Tuesday 23 September 2014, Captain Ross McLaughlin was presented with the 34th Canadian Brigade Group Commander's Commendation. The citation reads as follows:
